BY THE KING A PROCLAMATION

REVOKING THE PRETORIA MINT PROCLAMATION, 1922.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of section eleven of the Coinage Act, 1870, His late Majesty King George the Fifth, by the Pretoria Mint Proclamation, 1922, proclaimed, directed and ordained the establishment of a branch of Our Royal Mint in England at or near Pretoria in Our Union of South Africa:

And whereas by virtue of the said section it is lawful for Us, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation to revoke any Proclamation previously made in pursuance of that section:

And whereas it appears to Us desirable that the establishment of the said branch Mint should be discontinued, having regard to the fact that our Ministers in Our Union of South Africa have requested the discontinuance thereof and that provision has been made by the Parliament of Our Union of South Africa for the minting of coin in Our Union of South Africa:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

I. The establishment of the branch of Our Royal Mint in England at or near Pretoria in Our Union of South Africa shall, as from the first day of July, nineteen hundred and fortyone, be discontinued, and the Pretoria Mint Proclamation, 1922, shall, as from that date, cease to have effect:

Provided that nothing in this Proclamation shall affect anything legally done or suffered before that date, and all coins coined at the said branch Mint, before that date which are at that date current and a legal tender in any part of Our dominions shall not, by reason of this Proclamation, cease to be so current and a legal tender.

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Pretoria Mint (Discontinuance) Proclamation, 1941.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this twenty-sixth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-one, and in the fifth year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 21st day of June, 1941 (C.W./C.E. 1191/38), in the words following, viz.:—
