The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the GEORGE CROSS, to:—

No. 13039555 Acting Corporal James Patrick Scully, Pioneer Corps. (Crunslin, Co. Dublin.)

Awarded the George Medal.

Lieutenant Charles Cummins Chittenden (163280), Pioneer Corps.

When houses were demolished by enemy action, a rescue party under the direction of Lieutenant Chittenden went to the incident and a search was made for trapped people.

Corporal Scully located a man and a woman and, with great difficulty, he managed to penetrate the debris and get to where they were buried. Lieutenant Chittenden followed him. Wood was obtained to use as props to shore up the debris, but there was no means of cutting it into proper lengths.

A rescue party then arrived with tools to cut some wood into more suitable lengths for shoring. All available help was mustered and the men worked tremendously hard in their efforts to clear away the wreckage. Corporal Scully remained with the trapped persons and prevented any more debris falling on them. A long plank was inserted to take most of the weight but as the result of further falls the props began to sway out of position. There was then a very real danger

of the mass of debris falling down and burying the injured persons. Realising this, Corporal Scully placed his back under the plank to try to prevent the props from giving way completely. He steadied them for a time but gradually the weight increased until the props slipped. This left Corporal Scully holding one end of the plank and Lieutenant Chittenden supporting the other. Corporal Scully could have got away at this stage, but he knew that if he did so the debris would fall and probably kill the trapped persons, so he stayed under the plank. Gradually the weight increased and forced Corporal Scully down until he lay across the trapped man. Lieutenant Chittenden who was still holding one end of the plank reached over and supported Corporal Scully's head to prevent him from being suffocated by having his head pressed into the debris. He managed to keep Corporal Scully's face clear, but he was fast becoming exhausted. Despite this, he kept up his spirits and continued to talk encouragingly to the woman. The man was unconscious nearly all this time. Corporal Scully remained in this position throughout the night until, more than seven hours later, the rescue party were able to rescue him and the casualties.

When they first entered the house. Lieutenant Chittenden and Corporal Scully knew there was a grave risk of injury or death as the high walls nearby appeared about to collapse at any moment. Had this collapse occurred, they would have been buried under many tons of debris. Corporal Scully risked his life to save the two people and, though the position looked hopeless, Lieutenant Chittenden stayed with him.

One evening in February, 1941, an aircraft crashed into the side of a hill near an aerodrome and caught fire. Corporal Deacon, Gunner Gage and another soldier ran to the scene of the accident and found one member of the crew on the main plane. They dragged this airman to safety. The airman then informed his rescuers that three other members of the crew remained in the aircraft. Deacon and his companions immediately returned to the burning aircraft and, despite the added danger from exploding cannon shells and small arms ammunition, they succeeded in dragging clear the other members of the crew.

522912 Sergeant Morris BELL, Royal Air Force.

One night in February, 1941, an aircraft crashed and burst into flames. The pilot was

found, with his clothing on fire, by Sergeant Bell who dashed through the flames from the burning wreckage and, with his own jacket, extinguished the flames from the pilot's clothing which was soaked with petrol. This action was performed in spite of the further danger from constantly exploding cartridges. Sergeant Bell also directed his team of orderlies and ambulances so well that the injured pilot was receiving attention in hospital within 22 minutes from the time of the crash. Unfortunately the pilot subsequently died of his injuries. This is the second occasion Sergeant Bell has displayed great courage and efficiency. Previously his promptitude was responsible for saving one of the crew of a burning aircraft.

1004798 Aircraftman 2nd Class Charles Leonard WHEATLEY, Royal Air Force.

When an aircraft carrying a full load of bombs crashed this airman, with the help of the fire picquet, tried valiantly to prevent the fire from the port engine and petrol tank spreading to a large high explosive bomb. The success of his efforts was due to his complete disregard for his personal safety for, standing as he did two yards in front of the bomb, he was aware that it was likely to explode at any time.

Acting Flight Lieutenant William Richard HARDEMAN (35382), Royal Air Force.

When an aircraft loaded with four 250 lb. bombs was set on fire, there was grave danger to nearby aircraft and hangers. The bomb release gear was damaged and in order to remove the bombs, Flight Lieutenant Hardeman successfully sawed through and wrenched the carriers from the burning aircraft. On another occasion he removed the bombs from a burnt out aircraft which had crashed. During the early part of the war Flight Lieutenant Hardeman was dealing with an unexploded bomb when an enemy aircraft dropped bombs on the working party, killing two of the party and wounding others. Flight Lieutenant Hardeman summoned

medical assistance and attended the wounded whilst the raid was still in progress. Throughout he has shown the greatest courage and a complete disregard for his personal safety.

858034 Corporal Richard Percy Gordon Dunlop, Auxiliary Air Force.

On two consecutive nights in December, 1940, this airman displayed great devotion to duty and indifference to personal safety during air attacks. On the first night he and another airman volunteered to go out and investigate the failure of telephone communications with a particular site and assisted several crews to dispose of incendiary bombs which had fallen nearby, while shrapnel and high explosive bombs were still falling. On two further occasions he and his companion toured the sites over roads made difficult by masses of debris. In one instance a bomb narrowly missed their van, the steering wheel being torn from the driver's grasp. During the heavy raid on the second night, Corporal Dunlop rendered valuable assistance in deflating and replacing a balloon which had become badly holed.

910781 Corporal Frederick Thurlow, Royal Air Force.

1307987 Aircraftman 2nd Class Thomas Williamson, Royal Air Force.

One day in March, 1941, an aircraft crashed outside an aerodrome and immediately caught fire. Corporal Thurlow and Aircraftman Williamson, members of the station fire fighting crew, approached the burning wreckage with their hoses and, although they realised that the aircraft might be carrying bombs, advanced to within 10 feet of the conflagration in order that by directing their hoses from a close position, the flames might be subdued quickly and a rescue possibly effected. Unfortunately, however, the four occupants of the aircraft had been killed. These two airmen displayed great courage and a complete disregard of danger and both were wounded when a heavy bomb exploded. Corporal Thurlow has shown great bravery on previous occasions when dealing with burning aircraft.

149036 Leading Aircraftman Ernest Redvers Ruddy, Royal Air Force.

One day in February, 1941, an aircraft crashed on an aerodrome. On impact, a bomb exploded and the aircraft caught fire, whilst the remaining bombs exploded in succession as the aircraft was sliding along the ground. When the first explosion occurred, Leading Aircraftman Ruddy started his ambulance and reached the crash as soon as the aircraft came to rest. Although the aircraft was burning furiously and ammunition and oxygen containers were continuously exploding, Leading Aircraftman Ruddy, who was

unaware that all the bombs had exploded, assisted the pilot and observer to escape. By his gallant action their two lives were undoubtedly saved. The remaining occupant, the air gunner, was killed.

The KING has been graciously pleased to award the King's Police and Fire Services Medal for Gallantry to Chaudhri Ram Singh, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Punjab.

Whitehall, June 12, 1941.

The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Richard Rylance, in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

On the 21st February, 1941, an extensive fall of roof occurred underground at the Maypole Colliery, Wigan, as the result of which a collier was trapped in a small area of the workings. On arrival at the Colliery the Under-manager, Mr. Richard Rylance, began to make a narrow tunnel through the fallen material. By working at full length with his arms above his head for four hours with only three short breaks of ten minutes each, he excavated a passage twelve yards long to the place where the collier was trapped. After removing some loose stones he succeeded in crawling in and assisted the collier to escape alive and unhurt. The tunnelling had to be done with a pick blade as there was not sufficient room to wield a proper tool and during the whole period there was risk of further collapse.

Mr. Rylance showed outstanding courage in effecting the rescue of William Pennington, the trapped collier, in most difficult and dangerous circumstances.

In May, 1941, Sergeant Baron and

an attack against a 6,000 ton enemy
merchant vessel. Three direct hits were
obtained and it was subsequently learned that
the ship had been abandoned. A few days
later, following a report that drifters were
taking off the cargo, they again bombed the
ship obtaining hits which caused smoke to be
emitted. In June, 1941, Sergeants Baron
and Ullmer participated in an attack on a
large and strongly escorted convoy. The
particular section attacked consisted of six
merchant vessels and six destroyers. Bombs
from one of the leading aircraft struck two of
the ships one of which was an ammunition
ship which blew up with terrific force and the
aircraft in which Sergeant Baron and
Sergeant Ullmer were flying was severely
damaged by the blast. Despite the wrecking
of his turret, Sergeant Ullmer secured
excellent photographs of the damage caused
to the convoy and Sergeant Baron succeeded
in flying the damaged aircraft back to base.
Both airmen have consistently displayed
great keenness, courage and determination.

This airman has displayed exceptional
keenness and ability, and has assisted in the
destruction of four enemy aircraft at night.

One night in June, 1941, this airman was
captain of an aircraft which carried out an
attack on a dock at Rotterdam. Visibility
was poor over the target area but, in spite of
heavy anti-aircraft and searchlight activity
and the presence of enemy fighters, Sergeant
Evans flew over the area for an hour to
ensure that his objective was accurately
located. He finally released his bombs
which were seen to burst on or very close to
the dock. On the return journey his
aircraft was attacked by a Messerschmitt 110.
By excellent airmanship, Sergeant Evans
enabled his rear gunner to fire a burst at the

attacker which caused it to dive towards the sea, out of control, where it probably crashed. Sergeant Evans displayed great leadership, skill and determination throughout.
