799700 Acting Sergeant Norman Edward Lanning, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve.

This airman was on duty at a railway station in a town which was heavily attacked by enemy aircraft on two successive nights in December, 1940. Sergeant Lanning worked unremittingly to minimize damage by incendiaries and to find and rescue injured persons, bringing them to the station first aid post for attention. He was conspicuous for his efficiency in all directions and showed an immediate grasp of quickly changing events. His gallantry, calm demeanour, good humour and tireless energy contributed greatly towards the maintenance of good spirits and order amongst the other Railway Transport Office staff and the public generally.
