The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:-

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Squadron Leader John Harrison-Broadley (41695), No. 82 Squadron (missing).

In June, 1941, this officer participated in a successful formation attack on an enemy convoy, strongly protected by destroyers, south of Pantelleria. Despite heavy opposition from the destroyers, which opened fire when the formation was four or five miles the convoy, Squadron Leader Harrison-Broadley persisted in his mission. When two or three miles from the convoy, the port engine of his aircraft was hit and caught fire. Ir. spite of this, Squadron Leader Harrison-Broadley flew on but, when closing in to the attack, his starboard engine also caught fire. His flying speed, however, carried him the short distance necessary to enable him to drop his bombs, one of which With both engines on fire, struck a ship. Squadron Leader Harrison-Broadley was compelled to descend on the sea after passing over the ship. By his splendid leadership and courage, this officer contributed largely to the success of the operation.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Edward Preston Wells, Royal New Zealand Air Force, No.

485 Squadron, R.N.Z.A.F.
This officer has served with fighter squadrons since May, 1940, and has taken part in many engagements against the enemy. He has destroyed at least five of their aircraft and has damaged others. He has at all times shown the greatest courage and determination.

Flying Officer Robert Sinckler Woodward (74698), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 600 Squadron.

This officer has shown great perseverance and keenness during night-flying operations and has destroyed three enemy aircraft. One night in May, 1941, his aircraft was set on fire when a considerable distance out to sea.
