"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force, to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by the Officers of Royal Naval Reserve Act, 1863, we are empowered to enrol certain persons as Officers of reserve to Your Majesty's Navy to serve under such regulations and to receive such pay and allowances as may from time to time be approved by Your Majesty in Council:

"And whereas by the Naval Forces Act, 1903, we are empowered to raise and maintain a Force called the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, and that any Volunteer enrolling under this Act, when serving for training afloat or called out for actual service shall be deemed to be serving in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force within the meaning of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865:

"And whereas we consider the needs of Your Majesty's Naval Services render it desirable that promotion to the rank of Warrant Officer should be authorised from time to time in those branches of the Naval Reserves in

respect of which no provision for that rank has yet been made:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction, with effect from the 3rd September, 1939, the institution of Warrant ranks in Your Majesty's Naval Reserves corresponding to the Warrant ranks already instituted in Your Majesty's Navy; promotion to such rank to be at our discretion, and reserve Officers so promoted to be eligible for the pay and emoluments laid down from time to time for the corresponding ranks in the Royal Navy.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable

in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by the Naval Forces Act, 1903, it is enacted that the Admiralty shall have power to raise and maintain a Force to be called the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve and that any Volunteer enrolling under this Act, when serving for training afloat or called out for actual service shall be deemed to be serving in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force within the meaning of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865:

"And whereas provision was made by Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, and by subsequent Orders in Council, for, *inter alia*, revised conditions of service for Medical Officers of Your Majesty's Navy:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 25th day of July, 1921, regulations were instituted for the entry of Surgeon-Lieutenants for Short Service in Your Majesty's Navy:

"And whereas Order in Council bearing date 29th June, 1934, provided, *inter alia*, that all future entries of Medical Officers for permanent service should be made from the List of Surgeon-Lieutenants for Short Service:

"And whereas all entries into the Royal Naval Medical Service during the present period of hostilities are made in the rank of Temporary Surgeon-Lieutenant, Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve:

"And whereas we consider that a limited number of Medical Officers of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve should be eligible for transfer to the permanent list of Medical Officers of the Royal Navy:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the transfer of Medical Officers of The Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, both permanent and temporary, to the permanent list of Medical Officers of the Royal Navy under the conditions contained in the annexed Schedule.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

" SCHEDULE.

Medical Officers, R.N.V.R. (Permanent and Temporary). Conditions of Transfer to the Permanent List of the Royal Navy.

"1. The number of Officers selected to be at Admiralty discretion.

"2. Seniority on transfer to be given as follows and to reckon for purposes of full, unemployed and half pay:—

"(a) Full pay mobilised service to count in full.

"(b) In addition to (a) above, Officers who held appointments as resident medical or surgical officers in recognised civil hospitals prior to appointment to be granted, at Admiralty discretion, an antedate of seniority in respect of the time spent in the civil hospital appointment, subject to a maximum of twelve months.

"3. On transfer to the permanent list Officers to forfeit all their rights and privileges

as Reserve or Temporary Reserve Officers and except as provided below to be eligible for the rates of pay, retired pay and conditions of service of R.N. Medical Officers on the permanent list.

"4. Officers to be required to serve for not less than 10 years from the date of transfer to the permanent list before becoming eligible for a withdrawal gratuity on voluntary retirement. Former service referred to in paragraph 2 (a) of this Schedule and time in civil hospitals which counts for gratuity as in the case of permanent Officers entered on or after 1st July, 1926, to be allowed to count for the purpose of assessing the amount of the gratuity.

"5. Officers, invalided for disabilities not attributable to the service, with five years' service or less, including service referred to in paragraph 2 (a) of this Schedule, to be eligible for gratuities on the scale in force for Surgeon Lieutenants R.N. (Short Service) invalided in similar circumstances."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Representation, bearing date the 3rd day of July, 1941, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Thomas, Oakwood, situate within the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Winchmore Hill, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of Winchmore Hill and of the Parish of Enfield, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such New Parish and Parish:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of Winchmore Hill, and of the said Parish of Enfield should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Thomas, Oakwood, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Geoffrey Francis, Bishop of London, as such Bishop, and with the consent of the Reverend Stanley George William Knight, Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the Parish of Edmonton in the said County and Diocese and as such Vicar or Incumbent, the patron of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Winchmore Hill, and with the consent of the Master Fellows and Scholars of the College of the Holy and Undivided

Trinity within the University of Cambridge as the patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Enfield (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Winchmore Hill and of the said Parish of Enfield which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Thomas, Oakwood, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Thomas, Oakwood.'

" THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing representation has reference.

" The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Thomas, Oakwood, comprising:—

" All those contiguous portions of the New Parish of Winchmore Hill and of the Parish of Enfield, both in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, which taken together are bounded upon part of the north and upon the west by the New Parish of Christ Church, Enfield, upon the south-west by the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Southgate, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-east, upon the east, and upon the remaining part of the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Southgate, from the said New Parish of Winchmore Hill at a point in the middle of Chase Road opposite to the wall forming the northern boundary of Oakwood Council School, and extending thence eastward to and then first eastward then northward and then north-eastward along such wall for a distance of $12\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the north-eastern corner of the premises attached to the said school, and extending thence in a straight line due east (thereby crossing the line of the Piccadilly Railway) for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to the fence forming the western boundary of Oakwood Park, and extending thence in a straight line north-eastward across the said Park for a distance of 34 chains or thereabouts to a point near its north-eastern corner where the wall forming the northern boundary of the Park meets the fence separating the houses known as Numbers 181 and 183, Prince George Avenue, and extending thence northward along the last mentioned fence for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its northern end, and extending thence northward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line (thereby crossing Prince George Avenue) for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the premises attached to the Northern Convalescent Fever Hospital, and extending thence first westward, then northward and then north-eastward along the walls or fences forming the southern, western and northern boundaries of the said hospital (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Winchmore Hill from the said Parish of Enfield) for a distance of 36 chains or thereabouts to the north-eastern corner of the hospital grounds and extending

thence in a straight line due east for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to a point on the western side of Worlds End Lane upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Enfield from the said New Parish of Winchmore Hill, and extending thence eastward across Worlds End Lane for a distance of 16 yards or thereabouts to the eastern side of the said lane upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Winchmore Hill from the said Parish of Enfield, and extending thence northward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following the eastern side of Worlds End Lane) for a distance of 20 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned boundary crosses the middle of the stream flowing into Salmon's Brook, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said stream for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Salmon's Brook, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Salmon's Brook for a distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the culvert which carries East Barnet Road across such brook, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of East Barnet Road for a distance of 65 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Enfield from the said New Parish of Winchmore Hill."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

On the morning of 12th August, 1941, Blenheim bombers carried out simultaneous attacks on the great power stations near Cologne. A strong force attacked the station at Knapsack, whilst a smaller force attacked two stations at Quadrath. These missions involved a flight of some 250 miles over enemy territory which was carried out at an altitude of 100 feet. At Knapsack the target

was accurately bombed and machine gunned from between 200 and 800 feet and at Quadrath both power stations were hit from the height of the chimneys; the turbine house at one of the two stations was left a mass of flames and smoke. The success of this combined daylight attack and the co-ordination of the many formations of aircraft depended largely on accurate timing throughout the flight. That complete success was achieved, despite powerful opposition from enemy ground and air forces, is a high tribute to the calm courage and resolute determination displayed by the following officers and airmen, who participated in various capacities as leaders and members of the aircraft crews:—
