

Trinity within the University of Cambridge as the patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Enfield (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Winchmore Hill and of the said Parish of Enfield which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Thomas, Oakwood, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Thomas, Oakwood.'

" THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing representation has reference.

" The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Thomas, Oakwood, comprising:—

" All those contiguous portions of the New Parish of Winchmore Hill and of the Parish of Enfield, both in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, which taken together are bounded upon part of the north and upon the west by the New Parish of Christ Church, Enfield, upon the south-west by the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Southgate, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-east, upon the east, and upon the remaining part of the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Southgate, from the said New Parish of Winchmore Hill at a point in the middle of Chase Road opposite to the wall forming the northern boundary of Oakwood Council School, and extending thence eastward to and then first eastward then northward and then north-eastward along such wall for a distance of $12\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the north-eastern corner of the premises attached to the said school, and extending thence in a straight line due east (thereby crossing the line of the Piccadilly Railway) for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to the fence forming the western boundary of Oakwood Park, and extending thence in a straight line north-eastward across the said Park for a distance of 34 chains or thereabouts to a point near its north-eastern corner where the wall forming the northern boundary of the Park meets the fence separating the houses known as Numbers 181 and 183, Prince George Avenue, and extending thence northward along the last mentioned fence for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its northern end, and extending thence northward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line (thereby crossing Prince George Avenue) for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the premises attached to the Northern Convalescent Fever Hospital, and extending thence first westward, then northward and then north-eastward along the walls or fences forming the southern, western and northern boundaries of the said hospital (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Winchmore Hill from the said Parish of Enfield) for a distance of 36 chains or thereabouts to the north-eastern corner of the hospital grounds and extending

thence in a straight line due east for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to a point on the western side of Worlds End Lane upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Enfield from the said New Parish of Winchmore Hill, and extending thence eastward across Worlds End Lane for a distance of 16 yards or thereabouts to the eastern side of the said lane upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Winchmore Hill from the said Parish of Enfield, and extending thence northward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following the eastern side of Worlds End Lane) for a distance of 20 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned boundary crosses the middle of the stream flowing into Salmon's Brook, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said stream for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Salmon's Brook, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Salmon's Brook for a distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the culvert which carries East Barnet Road across such brook, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of East Barnet Road for a distance of 65 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Enfield from the said New Parish of Winchmore Hill."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.
