Barcelona, August 15. N. S.

TWO Spanish Gallies arrived the last week from *Carthagena*, with Soldiers and Slaves to Mann a Galley lately built here, which is to be launched in 2 or 3 days. Eight French Gallies which lately sailed from hence, were seen three days ago off this Port, sailing, as is supposed, for *Marseilles*.

Cadix, Aug 17. Two French Ships of 32 and 22 Guns came into this Port the 5th Instant, and joined five other French Wen of War that arrived here some days before; three of which are since gone out to cruize, and two others are come in. The *Sea-Horse*, Capt. *Walton* Commander, failed from hence this day to cruize against the *Moors* of *Sallee*, as did likewise the *Seaford*, commanded by Captain *Strickland*. Three Ships are fitting out here, to be sent with Arms and Ammunition to *Carthagena* in the *West-Indies*. A Ship is come in from *St. Domingo*, which gives an Account, that the 3 Men of War which failed from hence in the beginning of this year for *Carthagena* with a Supply of Men, Provisions and Ammunition for that Garrison, had touched at *Porto Rico*, and had lost many of their Men in their Voyage.

Madrid, August 26. The King of *Spain* continues in good Health. The Queen, who was much disordered by the News of the Death of the Queen of *Portugal* her Sister, is pretty well again. The Court is going into Mourning for the Queen of *Portugal*; and their Catholick Majesties, according to Custom, will not appear in Publick during the first 9 days. It's reported, that the *Almirante* of *Castille* has obtained the King's Leave to return to Court. A Quarrel happening here this week between the Duke of *Monteleon* and the Count *d'Oniatti*, the Duke sent the Count a Challenge, of which the King being informed, he ordered them to be secured, and a Guard was accordingly sent to their Houses, where they both continue under Confinement. They write from *Malaga* of the 18th Instant, that four Gallies belonging to the Duke of *Turris's* Squadron, failed from thence the 14th with a Reinforcement of several Companies of Foot for the Garrison of *Ceuta*.

Venice, Aug. 28. Signior *Soranzo*, Ambassador from this Republick to the Ottoman Port, went on Wednesday last on board the Man of War which is to carry him to *Constantinople*, accompanied by a great number of Persons of Quality, who having taken their Leave, he returned the same evening privately to his own house, where it's said he will continue two or three day *incognito*, to settle his private Affairs. Signior *Gritti*, lately chosen Procurator of *St. Mark*, made his Publick Entry here in that Quality this week. The *Prosperus African*, Captain *Grantham* Commander, is arrived here from *England*. Our last Advices from *Dalmatia* give an Account, that the Imperial, *Venetian*, and *Turkish* Commissioners, had a Conference together on the 12th Instant near a place

called *Monte Grosso*, and ordered three Pillars to be erected, to serve as Boundaries between the Territories of their respective Masters on that side; After which, Count *Marsigli*, the Emperor's Commissioner, invited the *Venetian* and *Turkish* Commissioners to Dinner, and gave them a very splendid Entertainment; and the Commissioners intended the next day to continue their Conferences, in order to settle in like manner the Limits in other Places.

Warsaw, August 26. The Committee of the Senate, appointed to consider of the Affairs of *Elbing*, and to draw up Instructions for the Commissioners of *Poland*, who are to Treat with those expected from the Elector of *Brandenburgh*, have after several Meetings finished the same; And in the mean time so good a Progress has been made towards accommodating this matter, in the Conferences which the Cardinal Primate and other Chief Ministers of this Court have had with *Baron Werner* Resident of *Brandenburgh*, that these Commissioners will have little more to do than to draw up and sign the Treaty; 'Tis reported, that the King of *Poland* consents to pay the Sum demanded by the Elector of *Brandenburgh*, upon condition the City of *Elbing* be by the 10th of the next Month restored to the Condition 'twas in before the *Brandenburghers* took Possession thereof; and that till this Money be paid, some other Place be put as a Security into the hands of his Electoral Highness. On the 25th, the King began his Journey to *Germany*, leaving the Government of this Kingdom in the Hands of the Cardinal Primate, the Crown Marshal, the Marshal of *Lithuania*, and the Chancellor. The Command of the *Saxon* Forces that are to continue in this Kingdom, which consist in the King's Horse-Guards, and some Regiments of Foot, making together about 6000 Men, is given to General *Fleming*, and these Troops are marching to the several Quarters assigned them in *Poland* and *Lithuania*; The rest of the King's *German* Troops are on their March towards *Saxony*.

Copenhagen, September 5. Yesterday about 4 in the afternoon died *Christian* the Fifth, King of *Denmark* and *Norway*, after a long Sickness, in the 53d Year of his Age; And the Prince Royal his Son, *Frederick* the Fourth, (who was born the 11th of *October*, 1671. was presently after proclaimed King; during which the Gates of this City were kept shut, and the Burghers were in Arms; and all the Ministers and Officers of State, the Nobility and Gentry in Town, and the Magistrates and principal Burghers, took the Oaths of Allegiance to His Majesty; which was performed with the accustomed Solemnity.

Dresden, Sept. 4. The King of *Poland* arrived here the 2d Instant from *Warsaw* with a small Retinue, and went directly to see the Queen and the Electress-Dowager; and yesterday his Majesty appeared in Publick, and received the Compliments of all the Persons of Quality at this Court. The King intends to be present at the opening of the

the Diet of the Eleſtorate of Saxony, who are to meet here on the 8th Inſtant, and on the 10th he will go from hence to the Baths at Tiplitz.

Loos, Sept. 11. Yesterday His Maſteſty and the Duke of Cell hunted the Stag. The Duke of Wirtemberg, who is General of the Daniſh Forces, is gone to Denmark in purſuance of the Orders he received from that Court, on the occaſion of the late March of the Swediſh Troops into Holſtein, and the King of Denmark's Sickneſs; And this morning we have an Account, that the King died the 4th Inſtant, and that his eldeſt Son, now Frederick the Fourth, was proclaimed the ſame day.

Hague, Septemb. 11. The States of Holland and Weſtfrifeland are to meet again on the 16th Inſtant. The Count de Noailles, who was at the Review near Arnhem, is ſince come hither, and will return in few days to his Government of Bergem-opzoom. The Duke of Rohan is arrived here from France. They write from Leewarden, that the young Prince of Naſſau, Stadtholder of Frifeland, is returned thither from Dierin.

Paris, Sept. 12. N. S. The Court continues at Fontainebleau, where there will be a great Ball next Tueſday. The Marquis du Chatelet, whom the King has appointed to Compliment the Duke and Duchefs of Lorrain on the Birth of the Prince their Son, is on his departure for Lorrain. We have received an Account, that the Marquis of Caſtel dos Rios, Ambaſſador from the King of Spain to this Crown, arrived the 27th of the laſt Month at Bellegorde, where he was ſplendidly entertained by Monsieur Bruelt Governor of that Place, and from thence he continued his Journey hither. They write from Bleis, that the Intendant had ordered the Children of one of the principal Inhabitants of that Town, being a new Convert, to be taken from their Parents, in order to be bred up in the Popiſh Religion, and that the Father complaining thereof, was ſent to Priſon.

Plimouth, Septemb. 3. The Reſolution of London, Walter Crauker Maſter, failed from hence the firſt Inſtant for Malaga, but was forced back yeſterday by contrary Winds. The Adventure of this place, Nicholas Perdue Maſter, is arrived here, bound from Antegoa to London.

Brifſol, Sept. 2. On Wedneſday laſt came in here the Betty Sloop from Antegoa, and the Tenby Merchant from Barbadoes. On Thuſday arrived the George and Grate of this place, John Lightfoot Commander, and the Incurſe, William Webb Maſter, from Antegoa; And yeſterday came into this Port, the Providence Pink from Virginia.

Cowes, Sept. 4. The Gilbert Pink of London, George Stephens Maſter, arrived here laſt week from the Weſt-Indies. Yeſterday failed from hence the Canterbury of London; Henry Tregony Maſter, bound to Penſilvania.

Portſmouth, Sept. 5. His Maſteſty's Ship the Bedford Galley, failed yeſterday from Spithead to the Iſlands of Jerſey and Guernſy. His Maſteſty's Ships the Suffolk, Humber, Revenge, York, Pendennis, Rocheſter, and Crown, came yeſterday from the Downs to Spithead.
