THE Negotiations relating to the Differences between the Emperor and this Court are continued, and the Great Duke of Tuscany and the Duke of Modena's Ministers here have joined their good Offices to those of the Cardinal *Giudice*, who acts as Minister from the Crown of Spain, for accommodating this Matter; But the Pope has not yet given Audience to the Imperial Ambassador, notwithstanding his Excellency, to comply with his Desire, has set at liberty one of his Servants, whom he kept Prisoner in his own House. The French Ambassador has declared, that he has received Orders from the King his Master to visit the Queen-Dowager of Poland, provided she treat him with the same Honours, as she allows to Cardinals in case any of them shall be then present. The Pope has ordered a Troop of Horse to be raised, who are to be employ'd in going the Patrole in the Highways near this City, for the Security of those who intend to come hither on account of the Jubilee; and Orders are sent to the Governors of the several Cities in the Ecclesiastical State likewise to use all proper Methods to secure the Roads. The Abbot *Scarlat* had Audience of the Pope yesterday, to whom he presented a Letter from the Elector of *Bavaria*, acquainting him with the Birth of his Son, and desiring him to be his Godfather; which the Pope has consented to, and has given Orders for a Letter to be writ, to desire the Elector of *Cologne* to represent him on this occasion, and to Name the young Prince, *Innocent*. Cardinal *d'Aguirre* died last Wednesday of an Apoplexy, which makes an eighth Place vacant in the College of Cardinals.

Milan, Aug. 26. The Prince of *Vaudemont*, our Governor, went from this Place yesterday, being accompanied by Prince *Charles of Vaudemont* his Son, (who is lately arrived here from *Germany*), and by several other Persons of Quality, to Review the Regiments of Horse and Dragoons in the Service of this State, who are encamped for that purpose near *Pavia*. Count *Borromeo*, who resides here with the Character of the Emperor's Commissary, is gone to *Castiglione*, which is a Fief of the Empire, to enquire into the Disorders that have lately happened there, and to compose the Differences between the Prince of *Castiglione* and some of his Subjects. Mr. *Hill*, His Majesty of Great-Britain's Envoy Extraordinary to the Duke of *Savoy*, arrived here this week from *Turin*, and intends to go hence to morrow in his return home.

Warsaw, August 29. An Exprest arrived here this day from *Lemberg*, who immediately continued his Journey towards *Germany*, being sent (as 'tis said) by the Crown-General, to give the King of *Poland* an account, that the *Turks* have evacuated *Caminiec*. The Cardinal Primate is returned hither from *Lowitz*. The Commissioners from the Elector of *Brandenburgh* about the Business of

Elbing are daily expected; and in the mean time the Baron *Werner*, Resident from his Electoral Highness, continues his Conferences with the Ministers at this Court for accommodating this Affair, and 'tis said, the principal Points of the Treaty are already adjusted.

Copenhagen, Septemb. 8. The Gates of this City were kept shut till Sunday last upon the occasion of the late King's Death, whose Body lies in State in the Palace; An Order has been published, That all Persons of Quality, and all Officers Civil and Military, and others, who have any dependency upon the Court, do put themselves and their Servants into deep mourning. The Count *de Guldensleew* has desired Leave, on account of his great Age and frequent Indispositions, to resign all his Employments except that of Vice-Roy of *Norway*, where he intends to go and spend the remainder of his Life. The King has disposed of the Principal Offices at Court; Baron *Jewell* is made Admiral General, the Count *de Raventlau* Great Chancellor, and Monsieur *Wibe* Chief Secretary of the Chancery. Monsieur *Lenche* has the Office of Secretary of War, which was enjoyed by Monsieur *Harboe*; Monsieur *Gabel* is made Governor of the Academy; Monsieur *Van Hahn* High Marshal, in the Place of Monsieur *Van Osten*; Monsieur *Holsten* First Gentleman of the Bed-chamber; The young Count of *Raventlau*, Son to the Chancellor, Lieutenant General of the *Danish* Horse, in the room of Monsieur *Plesse*; And Brigadier General *Krabbe* Captain of the Horse-Guards.

Vienna, Sept. 2. On the 27th of the last Month the Imperial Court were entertained at the Palace at *Favorita* with a Tournament, performed by the King of the *Romans*, the Prince of *Hesse-Darmstadt*, and divers other Persons of Quality; and to morrow the Court will remove to *Ebersdorf*. Orders are sent to the General Officers in *Hungary* to take a Review of the Imperial Forces there, and to give an exact Account to the Court, of the number of Effective Men in each Regiment, and of what Arrears are due to them, in order to their being paid. Count *Oetting*, Ambassador from the Emperor to the Grand Signior, is on his departure from hence for *Turky*, and we hear, a *Bassa* is come to *Belgrade*, being sent by the Grand Signior to receive his Excellency on the Borders of the *Turkish* Dominions, and to conduct him, and defray the Charges of his Journey to *Constantinople*. Our Letters from *Croatia* give an Account, that the Commissioners from the Emperor, the State of *Venice*, and the Grand Signior, who met on the Frontiers of that Province, having settled the Limits in those Parts, Count *Marfigli*, the Imperial Commissioner, and the *Turkish* Commissioner appointed to treat with him, were gone towards *Temeswar*, in order to regulate the Limits between the *German* and the *Turkish* Dominions on that side.

Berlin, Sept. 8. The Elector of *Brandenburgh* went on the 6th Instant from *Oranienbourg* to *Potsdam*, as 'tis said, his Electoral Highness intends about the middle of the next Month to go to *Prussia*. The Sieur *Galeski*, Ambassador from the King of *Poland* to the *St. res-Gereral*, passed through this Place some days ago in his return home, and had a private Audience of the Elector. His Electoral Highness has sent Monsieur *Kolbe*, First Gentleman of his Bed-chamber, to the King of *Poland*, to Compliment him upon his arrival at *Driscden*. Monsieur *Terrau* is appointed to go and reside in *England* as his Electoral Highness's Envoy Extraordinary, in the room of the Count of *Likona*.

Hamburg, Sept. 11. Our Letters from *St. Wick* of the 10th Instant give an Account, that the Duke of *Holstein's* Forces having finished the new Forts near *Husum*, began to build some Fortifications near *Fredrickstadt*; But that on the 8th Instant they ceased from that Work, upon the occasion, as is said, of a Treaty that is begun for adjusting these Matters between the King of *Denmark* and the Duke of *Holstein*. They write from *Dresden*, that the King of *Poland* continues there, intending to be present at the Opening of the Assembly of the States of the Electorate of *Saxony*, who were to meet on the 8th Instant; and that the Queen would go with him to *Poland*, being allowed to carry one of her *Lutheran* Chaplains with her, and to have the free Exercise of the Religion. Our Letters from *Danzick* of the 5th Instant say, 'was reported there that the Affair of *Elbing* is accommodated by the Elector of *Brandenburgh's* Minister at *Warsaw*, and that pursuant to this Agreement, that City will be evacuated by the *Brandenburghers* on the 18th Instant.

Leo, Sept. 15. The Duke of *Cetz* continues here, and is entertained with the Diversions of this Place. The Duke of *Grafton* is come from the *Hague* to wait on His Majesty, and will stay here some days.

Hague, Sept. 15. The States of *Holland* and *Westfriseland* are to meet to-morrow, and the Deputies from the Admiralties of this Province are shortly expected here to confer with them. Some Conferences have been held between the Baron of *Lütteroot* Ambassador from *Sweden*, and other publick Ministers residing here, touching the Business of the Forts which the Duke of *Holstein* is building in the Duchy of *Holstein*, in order to accommodate this Matter. The Count of *Dkona*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector of *Brandenburgh* to His Majesty of *Great-Britain*, is gone from hence to *Leo*.

Paris, Sept. 16. N. S. The Court continues at *Fontainebleau*, where *M. sieur Ponchartrai* was sworn last Wednesday into the Office of Chancellor of this Kingdom, and he is expected here in a day or two to take his Place in the Parliament of *Paris*. *Monsieur de Bretonvilliers*, eldest President of the Chamber of Accounts, being dangerously ill, has obtained the King's Leave to resign his Place to his Son, who is one of the Counsellors of the Parliament. A Declaration has been published here, making it a Capital Crime to Counterfeit the Hand of a Secretary of State. We have an Account from *Languedoc*, that about the middle of the last Month divers new Converts took the opportunity of a Fair held at *Baucarain*, a small Town near the City of *Nismes*, to meet privately together and perform their Devotions, which being over, they all went home. This coming to the knowledge of the Intendant, and the Minister who Preached to them being discovered, he was seized, and ordered to be carried to *Nismes*, but was rescued in the way thither. Diligent Search is making after the Persons that were present at this Assembly, and divers are taken up upon Suspicion; And several Companies of Soldiers are quartered in the Houses of the new Converts in the Neighbourhood of *Nismes*, where they live at discretion. They write from *Bourdeaux* of the first Instant, that several Merchant-Men laden with Wine and Brandy, and other Merchandizes, lay in that Port, ready to sail for *Rochele* to join the Ships commanded by *Monsieur Renault* and *Monsieur d'Iberville*, in order to go in their Company to the *French* Plantations in *America*. Our Letters from *Italy* give an Account of the Death of the Dutchess-Dowager of *Modena*, Mother to the present Duke.

Bristol, Sept. 6. Yesterday sailed out of *Kings-Road*, the *Sphinx* Frigate, Capt. *Harris* Commander, and the *Society*, both for *Malaga*; The *Robert* and *Thomas* for the *Bermudas*, the *Mary Ann* for *Lisbon*, the *Charles* and *Sarah* for *New-England*, and the *Port-Royal*, commanded by Capt. *Eldridge*, for *Jamaica*; And this day the *Richard* and *John*, *John Jones* Master, set sail for *Virginia*, the *Sarah*, Capt. *John Millard* Commander, for *Pensilvania*, and the *Blossom* Pink for *New-York*.
