HE Negociations relating to the Differences between the Emperor and this Court are continued, and the Great Duke of Tuscany and the Duke of Modena's Ministers here have joined their good Offices to those of the Cardinal Giudice, who acts as Minister from the Crown of Spain, for accommodating this Matter ; But the Pope has not yet given Audience to the Imperial Ambassador, notwithstanding his Excellency, to comply with his Desire, has set at liberty one of his Servants, whom he kept Prisoner in his own House. The French Ambassador has declared, that he has received Orders from the King his Master to vifit the Queen-Dowager of Peland, provided she treat him with the same Honours, as the allows to Cardinals in case any of them shall be then present. Cardinal d'Aguirre died last Wednesday of an Apoplexy, which makes an eighth Place vacant in the College of Cardinals.

Milan, Aug. 26.
