"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

And whereas a Treaty was signed on the 2nd day of May, 1932, between His late Majesty King George V and His Majesty the King of Iraq for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals:

And whereas the said Treaty was duly ratified:

And whereas notes were exchanged on the 18th July/6th August, 1941, between His Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary at Bagdad and the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Iraq extending to Burma the provisions of the said Treaty of the 2nd May, 1932, the terms of which notes are as follows:—

I have the honour to inform you, in accordance with instructions from His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, that His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom have had under consideration the position of Burma in relation to the Extradition Treaty between the United Kingdom and Iraq signed at Bagdad on the 2nd May, 1932.

2. Article 2 of the said Treaty provides that for the purposes of that Treaty "the territory of His Britannic Majesty shall be deemed to be Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, and all parts of His Britannic Majesty's dominions overseas other than those enumerated in Article 18." Article 18 provides that His Majesty may accede to the Treaty on behalf of the Dominion of Canada, the Commonwealth of Australia, the Dominion of New Zealand, the Union of South Africa, the Irish Free State and Newfoundland—and India.

3. At the time when the Treaty entered into force in relation to the countries covered by Article 2 the term "India" in Article 18 of the Treaty included Burma. His Majesty did not however accede to the Treaty in respect of India until the 5th April, 1937.

4. On the 1st April, 1937, however Burma had been separated from India and became an Overseas Territory of His Majesty The King. Burma was not therefore covered by His Majesty's original ratification as she was not then one of the countries covered by Article 2 of the Treaty nor by his accession in respect of India. The Government of Burma having now expressed the wish to participate in the Treaty, I have the honour to propose to Your Excellency that Burma should be regarded as participating in the Treaty as from the 18th October, 1941, as if Burma had been included

at the time of its signature in the territories enumerated in the first paragraph of Article 2 of the Treaty.

5. Requisitions for the extradition of fugitive criminals who have taken refuge in Burma should be addressed to the Governor of Burma.

6. If this proposal is agreeable to the Government of Iraq, I have the honour to suggest that the present note and Your Excellency's reply hereto should be regarded as placing upon record the agreement reached in the matter and that this agreement should be terminable by either party by a notice given in accordance with the provisions of Article 22.

I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to Your Excellency the assurance of my highest consideration.

3. At the time when the Treaty entered into force in relation to the countries covered by Article 2, the term "India" in Article 14 of the Treaty of 1931 included Burma. His Majesty has however not acceded to the Treaty in respect of India, which therefore continues to be bound by the earlier treaty arrangements mentioned in the preceding paragraph, and consequently, as Burma inherits from India such international obligations as are applicable, Burma, though now separated from India, continues to be bound by the earlier treaty arrangements.

4. Since the 1st April, 1937, the date of separation from India, Burma has possessed the status of an Overseas Territory of His Majesty The King. The Government of Burma having now expressed the wish to participate in the Treaty, I have the honour to propose to Your Excellency that Burma should be regarded as participating in the said Treaty of 1931 as from the 1st November, 1941, as if Burma had been included at the time of its signature in the territories enumerated in the first paragraph of Article 2 of the Treaty.

"I have the honour to inform you, in accordance with instructions from His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, that His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom have had under consideration the position of Burma in relation to the Extradition Treaty between the United Kingdom and the United States of America signed at London on the 22nd December, 1931.

Accordingly, your note and this reply may be regarded as placing upon record the agreement reached that Burma shall be considered as participating in the Extradition Treaty of 1931 as from November 1, 1941, as if Burma had been included at the time of signature of the Treaty among the territories enumerated in the first

paragraph of Article 2 of the Treaty, this agreement to be terminable by either party by a notice given in accordance with the provisions of Article 18 of the Treaty.

Due note has been taken of your statement to the effect that requisitions for the extradition of persons accused of crime who have taken refuge in Burma should be addressed to the Governor of Burma.

WHEREAS by Section 659 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (which is a Section in Part XI of that Act), it is (amongst other things) enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council fix the establishments to be maintained by each of the General Lighthouse Authorities on account of the services of lighthouses, buoys and beacons, or the annual or other sums to be paid out of the Mercantile Marine Fund in respect of those establishments and that an increase of any establishment or part of an establishment so fixed shall not be made without the consent of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by Section 738 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is (amongst other things) enacted that where His Majesty has power under that Act or any Act thereafter to be passed amending the same to make an Order in Council, His Majesty may from time to time make that Order in Council and by Order in Council revoke, alter or add to any Order so made:

And whereas by Section 1 of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898, it is (amongst other things) provided that references in Part XI of the Merchant Shipping

Act, 1894, to the Mercantile Marine Fund shall be construed as references to the General Lighthouse Fund by the now reciting Act constituted:

And whereas by the Northern Lighthouse Board (Establishment) Order, 1936, the Northern Lighthouse Board (Variation of Establishment) Order, 1937, and the Northern Lighthouse Board (Establishment) Order, 1939, the establishment to be maintained by the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses being one of the General Lighthouse Authorities referred to in the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and the amount of the salaries to be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund in respect of that establishment were duly fixed:

And whereas by virtue of the Minister of Shipping (Transfer of Functions) Order, 1939, and the Ministers of the Crown (Minister of War Transport) Order, 1941, the functions exercisable by the Board of Trade in relation to the matters aforesaid are now exercisable by the Minister of War Transport:

And whereas it is expedient that the establishment of the Commissioners should be varied in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Minister of War Transport has consented to such variation:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and of any other powers Him thereunto enabling, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

"1. This Order may be cited as the Northern Lighthouse Board (Variation of Establishment) Order, 1941, and shall come into operation on the date of publication in the London Gazette.

"2. The Schedule hereto shall be substituted for the Second Schedule to the Northern Lighthouse Board (Establishment) Order, 1936, as amended by the Northern Lighthouse Board (Variation of Establishment) Order, 1937.

"3. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order the salary of Mr. J. Glencorse Wakelin, O.B.E., at present the holder of the post of Secretary shall be £1,400 per annum, with effect from the 1st day of January, 1940, and the salary of Mr. John Simpson, the present holder of the post of Deputy Secretary shall be £745 5s. per annum with effect from the 28th September, 1939, rising thereafter by annual increments of £25 to the maximum of £840 specified for that post in the Schedule hereto, and the salary of Mr. G. W. Campbell, the present holder of the post of Senior Staff Officer (Accountant) shall be £660 per annum with effect from the 28th September, 1939, rising thereafter by annual increments of £25 to the maximum of £730 specified for that post in the Schedule hereto.

"4. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order, Mr. John Vass, the retiring occupant of the post of Superintendent shall be granted a monetary award of £250 on his retirement, over and above any gratuity which may be granted to him under the Superannuation Acts.

"5. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order, Mr. J. Stewart, Executive Officer, now performing special duties assigned to him by the Commissioners may be paid an allowance of £30 per annum with effect from the 28th March, 1940, for so long as he shall continue to perform the said special duties.

"6. The Northern Lighthouse Board (Variation of Establishment) Order, 1937, and the

Northern Lighthouse Board (Establishment) Order, 1939, are hereby revoked.

" 7. The sums payable under the provisions of this Order shall be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund.

" 8. The Interpretation Act, 1889, shall apply to the interpretation of this Order in like manner as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament."

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the 18th day of September, 1941, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in witness whereof he has signed the scheme) for effecting the union of the benefice of Yelverton with Alington and the benefice of Bergh Apton with Holverstone both situate in the Diocese of Norwich.

" *Scheme.*

" 1. *Union of Benefices.*—The benefice of Yelverton with Alington and the benefice of Bergh Apton with Holverstone shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Bergh Apton with

Yelverton' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

" 2. *Taking effect of union.*—Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this scheme is published in the London Gazette if either or both of the benefices shall be vacant the union shall forthwith take effect.

" 3. *Parsonage House.*—Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Bergh Apton with Holverstone shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice and the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Yelverton with Alington and the grounds usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" 4. *Appropriation of surplus endowments.*—Upon the union taking effect a part of the total endowments of the benefices so constituted an united benefice, that is to say, a capital sum of £6,666 13s. 4d. being a part of the sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty to the benefice of Bergh Apton with Holverstone pursuant to sections 7 and 38 of the Tithe Act, 1936, and the provisions of Part II of the 3rd Schedule to the

said Act, and paragraph 1 of the 8th Schedule to the same Act shall be severed or diverted from the said benefice of Bergh Apton with Holverstone and from the united benefice and the sum of £6,666 13s. 4d. £3 per cent. Redemption Stock 1986-96 issued, or to be issued, to Queen Anne's Bounty pursuant to the provisions of Part II of the said 3rd Schedule and representing the said capital sum of £6,666 13s. 4d. shall be severed and diverted from the general corporate account of Queen Anne's Bounty and shall be transferred to, and become vested in us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as part of our Common Fund, to the intent that a grant at the rate of £200 per annum shall thereupon be made by us out of the said Common Fund to the said united benefice such grant to continue in force only so long as the said parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Bergh Apton with Holverstone shall be the parsonage house of the united benefice and that when in the opinion of the Bishop of Norwich and of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners it shall be desirable that the said house be sold or otherwise disposed of and a smaller house provided for the said united benefice the said grant of £200 per annum shall be withdrawn from a date to be determined by the said Bishop and by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and a grant or grants amounting to £200 per annum shall be made in lieu thereof to another benefice or other benefices in the said diocese of Norwich: Provided that during the subsistence of any pension charge placed upon the revenues of the united benefice as a consequence of the retirement of the Reverend Alexander St. John Heard from the benefice of Bergh Apton with Holverstone the said grant of £200 per annum shall not be wholly withdrawn but the sum to be withdrawn and re-granted as aforesaid shall be abated by the amount of such pension charge.

"5. *Patronage*.—After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the said benefice of Bergh Apton with Holverstone having the first presentation to be made after the union."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.
