THE Pope has caused a Brief to be delivered to the Resident of Savoy, by which the Dukes of Savoy are confirmed in the Right of Presenting to all the vacant Bishopricks and Abbeys in Piedmont, except the Bishopricks of Asti, Alba, and Saluzzo, the Nomination to which the Pope has reserved to himself. Two Congregations of State have been held this week, being composed of the Cardinals Carpegna, Barbarini, Marefcotti, Tanara, and St. Cesareo, the one concerning the Affairs of Poland, and the other touching the Differences between the Emperor and this Court, for accommodating of which a Negotiation is still continued, and the Cardinal Giudice as Minister from Spain, and the Ministers of Tuscany and Modena, perform the part of Mediators. Cardinal Giudice had Audience of the Pope last Sunday, as Prince Vaheni (who is lately returned from France) had the next day. The Queen-Dowager of Poland has desired the Pope to give her the same Pension which was allowed to Queen Christina of Sweden during the time she resided at this Court; A Cardinal's Cap for one of her Sons; and a Pension or some Ecclesiastical Preferment for the Cardinal d'Arquien her Father; But the Pope has yet given no positive Answer, and 'tis doubted whether he will comply with this Request. They write from Naples of the 24th Instant, that the Vice-Roy of that Kingdom had visited Capua and Gaeta, and ordered those Places to be fortified, and well provided with Artillery and Ammunition, and that several other Places on the Frontiers, and along the Sea-Coast, are to be fortified in like manner, which gives some Jealousy to this Court.

Venice, Septemb. 4. The Regiments of Baveith, Salzbουργ, and Wirtemberg, being discharged out of the Service of this Republick, are brought hither from the Morea, in order to their being sent back to Germany. Engineer-General Richards is arrived here from the Levant. Signior Soranzo, Ambassador from this State to the Port, will begin his Voyage to Constantinople about a week hence. The Senate have appointed Signior Saviano, one of their Secretaries, to go and reside at Naples in the room of Signior Corniani their Resident, who is recalled from that Employment. An Order has been published here for lowering the Price of Wine, which was sold at an excessive rate. Our last Letters from Adrianople give an Account, that the Grand Signior intended to remove from thence to Constantinople, and would begin his Journey on the 7th of this Month;

That the Grand Visier had presented to my Lord Paget, His Majesty of Great-Britain's Ambassador at the Port, two very fine Turkish Horses with rich Furniture, a Sable Vest, and other Things of value, and that his Excellency is in great Esteem among the Turks.

Warsaw, Sept. 6. The Conferences between the Chief Ministers at this Court, and Baron Werner Resident from the Elector of Brandenburg, for accommodating the Affair of Elbing, are continued with good Success. The Provincial Diets for receiving the Report of their Deputies which are returned from the General Diet, have been held in most Parts of this Kingdom according to Custom, and the Country are generally satisfied with what has been done at the said General Diet. Major-General Carlowitz being appointed to go Ambassador from this Crown to the Czar, is preparing for his Journey to Muscovy. Our last Letter from Lemberg give an Account, that the Turks were removing their Artillery and Ammunition from Caminiec, in order to deliver that Place into the hands of the Commissioners of Poland, so that we daily expect to receive Advice of its being evacuated.

Vienna, Sept. 5. The States of Silesia, which have been assembled some time, have granted to the Emperor a Subsidy of 240000 Livers. The States of the other Hereditary Countries are appointed to meet likewise in a short time. The Imperial Court removed on the 3d Instant to Ebersdorf. The Emperor has named Commissioners to receive the Turkish Ambassador (who, we hear, parted from Adrianople the 25th past) on the Frontier of the Imperial Territories, and to conduct him to this Place, and defray the Charges of his Journey. Count Otting will be going in few days on his Embassy to the Port. Count Berlips, whom the King of Spain sent hither with the Character of his Envoy Extraordinary, to make his Compliments at this Court on the Marriage of the King and Queen of the Romans, having performed his Commission, will depart from hence in a few days on his return to Madrid.

Dresden, Sept. 11. The Diet of the States of Saxony was opened here on the 8th Instant, the King of Poland himself being present; and the Sieur Gersdorf, President of the King's Council, did in His Majesty's Name propose several things to their Consideration. Yesterday the King, accompanied by the Prince of Furstemberg, and divers other Persons of Quality, went from hence to the Baths at Teplitz, where he intends to continue about a fortnight, after which he will return hither.

Francfort, Sept. 13. The Elector Palatine took a Review on Monday last of his Forces that are quar-

quartered in these Parts, which were drawn together for that purpose near *Manheim*, under the Command of Count *Nassau Weylburgh*. The Elector returned the same evening to *Weynheim*, from whence he intends to remove about three weeks hence to *Duseldorp*. The new Fortifications of *Manheim* are in great forwardness, and a great number of Houses in that City are already rebuilt.

Hamburgk, Sept. 15. The Duke of *Wirtemberg* came hither this week in his way to *Denmark*. Count *Staremberg* arrived here yesterday, going to *Sueden* as Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor, and was Complimented by two Deputies from the Senate. We have received an Account from *Tenningen*, that the Duke of *Holstein's* Forces having finished the new Forts near *Husum*, began to build others near *Frederickstad*, which being discontinued for two days, it occasioned a Report, that this Matter was accommodated between the King of *Denmark* and the Duke of *Holstein*, but on the 10th Instant they fell to work again, intending to finish these Fortifications as soon as possible. They write from *Copenhagen*, that the King of *Denmark* has given Orders for raising 12000 Men, out of which two new Regiments of Horse and as many of Foot are to be formed, and the remaining part of these new Levies are to be incorporated in the Regiments already on foot. Divers *Danish* Ships of War are also ordered to be fitted out, which are to be commanded by Admiral *Jans Rothsteyn*. Our Letters from *Berlin* of the 11th Instant say, the Elector of *Brandenburgh* continues at *Oranienbourg*, and has given a great Tract of Land near that Place to the *Vaudois*, who being banished out of *Piedmont* on account of their Religion, have taken Refuge in his Dominions; and his Electoral Highness has caused a great number of Cattel, and a great quantity of Materials for Building, and other Necessaries, to be distributed amongst them.

Loo, Sept. 18. The King has received a Letter from the Czar of *Muscovy*, dated the 19th of July last, wherein he thanks His Majesty for the Good Offices of his Mediation at the Congress of *Carlowitz*, where a Truce was concluded between him and the Port for two years, and prays the Continuance of them by his Majesty's Ambassador at the Port for prolonging of the Truce, or establishing a lasting Peace between them. The Earl of *Rochford* arrived here last night from *Zulstein*.

Hague, Septemb. 18. The Resident of *Denmark* had Audience of the States-General the 16th Instant, to whom he delivered a Letter from the King of *Denmark*, notifying the Death of the late King *Christian* the Fifth, and his own Accession to the Crown; And He has also notified the same to all the Foreign Ministers residing here. Monsieur *Geldermalsen*, Envoy Extraordinary from the States-General to His Majesty of *Great-Britain*, is come hither from *Loo*. Monsieur *Hetterman*, Envoy from the Elector *Palatine*, is arrived here from *Duseldorp*. The States of *Holland* and *Westfriselmd* have been assembled these two days.

Paris, Septemb. 19. N. S. Monsieur *Chamillard*, newly made Comptroller of the Finances, came last Wednesday to the Chamber of Accompts, where he was Sworn, and took his Place in the usual manner. Monsieur *Bignon de Blanzi* succeeds Monsieur *Chamillard* as Intendant of the Finances, and is on this account to reimburse

Monsieur *Bignon* the 40000 Livres which is paid for that Employment. Letters from *Madrid* of the 27th past say, the King of *Spain* is in perfect Health, and that the Price of Corn there considerably fallen by the Care of the present Cregidor, and the Prospect of a plentiful Harvest. The Marquis of *Castel dos Rios*, Ambassador Extraordinary from *Spain* to this Crown, is expected here the latter end of the next week.

Plymouth, Sept. 10. The Ship called the *Maland Merchant* of this Place, *Walter Luggor* Master, bound to *Cadiz*, sailed from hence the 8th Instant, as did also the *Vine*, *John Hayes* Master, and the *Robert* and *John*, *Robert Howard* Master, both of *Colchester*, the first bound to *Cadiz*, and the other to *Bilboa*. Yesterday came in here the *Samuel*, *Andrew* of *Dartmouth*, *Tho. Pereson* Master, bound to *Boston*, which sailed again the same day, and the *Kevange* Galley of *London*, *Andrew Hawks* Master, sailed from hence for *Cadiz*.
