## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1 The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 31st October, 1941, at 1 p m for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877 the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Acts, 1939 to 1941, to the amount of £75,000,000

2 The Bills will be in amounts of £5 000, £10,000, £50,000 or £100 000 They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 3rd November, 1941, to Saturday, the 8th November, 1941, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date

3 The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England

4 Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50 000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates

5 Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker

6 The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the

following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Bankers' Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1 30 p m (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated

7 Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills

8 Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England

The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Percy Barnard Weller in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances —

On the 16th May 1941 an explosion accompanied by fire occurred in a certain building in which explosives were being broken down A workman named Clark who was employed in the building was badly burned Weller another workman, entered the burning building and succeeded in rescuing Clark although the rescued man died subsequently from the effects of his injuries In effecting this rescue Weller ran great personal risks not only from the fire but also from the danger of a further explosion which did in fact occur shortly afterwards, demolishing the building

Weller showed outstanding courage in effecting the rescue of his workmate Clark in most difficult and dangerous circumstances

The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to William Alexander Pullar and John Scott, in recognition of their gallantry in the following circumstances:—

On the 24th October, 1940, there was a violent explosion followed by a fire in the Starch Works of Messrs. James Morrice (James Anderson & Co.) Limited, Surrey Street, Glasgow. Pullar, the Works Manager, although suffering from burns on the neck and hands, made repeated attempts for a period of nearly thirty minutes to rescue employees trapped in the building. Subsequently, accompanied by a workman, Scott, he re-entered the blazing building. Although parts of the building were collapsing the two men made their way to the boiler house where they succeeded in stopping the machinery and in drawing the boiler fires, thus preventing an explosion of the boiler which was at that time working at pressure.

Pullar and Scott showed outstanding courage in the most difficult and dangerous circumstances.
