Warsaw, Sept. 8. N. S.

**B**aron *Werner*, Resident from the Elector of Brandenburg, continues to have frequent Conferences with the Cardinal Primate, and the other chief Ministers at this Court, in order to accommodate the Affair of *Elbing*. We hear, it is already agreed between them, that the Elector shall restore that City to the *Polanders*, who on their side are to deliver some other Place to his Electoral Highness, to remain in his possession till they have given him satisfaction as to the debt he demands of this Crown; What remains to be adjusted, is to fix upon a Place to be put into his Electoral Highness's hands, and to agree on the Sum of Money to be paid him; But these points will hardly be regulated, till the Brandenburg Commissioners arrive, who are said to be on their way hither. The *Sieur Lexinsky*, General of Great Poland is making preparations for his Embassy to the Port. Major General *Carlowitz*, Envoy Extraordinary from this Crown to the Czar of *Muscovy*, is on his departure for *Moscow*. The Princes *Alexander* and *Constantine*, who accompanied the King of *Poland* part of the way to *Saxony*, are returned hither. The States of *Cearland* have granted the King a Subsidy of 40000 Dollars. A Sum of 20000 Dollars was sent this week to the Commissioners who are gone to take possession of *Caminnec*, and the other Fortresses, to be restored to this Crown by the *Turks*, which Money is to be employed in furnishing those Garrisons with Provisions and other necessaries. In the mean time the *Turks* continue their preparations for the evacuating of *Caminnec*.

*Stockholm, Sept. 8.* The King of Sweden and the Duke of *Holstein* are gone from hence to *Cowlingor*, to review several Regiments of Horse which are quartered in those Parts. It's discourfied here, that Orders will shortly be given by the King of Sweden for the fitting out of a Fleet, and that some Regiments will be sent to reinforce the Swedish Troops in the Duchy of *Holstein*.

*Copenhagen, Sept. 15.* The King of Denmark has desired the Count of *Guldenleew* to keep all his Publick Employments; who has thereupon altered his Resolution of going to *Norway*, and will continue his Residence here. The *Steur Meyer*, of the King's Council, and one of the Commissioners of the Chamber of Accounts, has resigned these Places, and is retired from Court. The King visited the Magazines in this City yesterday, and gave Orders that they be well stored with all manner of Provisions and Ammunition. Divers Officers are preparing to

make new Levies according to the Orders they have received from Court. At the same time 'tis said, there is a Negotiation on foot for accommodating the Affair of *Holstein*.

*Frederickstadt, Sept. 16.* The building of the new Forts in the Duchy of *Holstein*, is continued by the Duke of *Holstein's* Order with great diligence; Several Companies of Foot marched from hence two days ago to reinforce those that are employed in rebuilding the *Holmer-Schans*; And a great number of the Country People in the Neighbourhood are likewise employed in these Works.

*Vienna, Sept. 9.* The Emperor's Ministers continue their Conferences for regulating divers Matters about the Forces that are to be kept on foot. The States of *Hungary* are assembled at *Presbourg*, and a Supply of 4 Millions of Florins is demanded of them in the Emperor's Name for the next year. Count *Oetting*, Ambassador from this Court to the Grand Signior, is on Monday next to have his Audience of Leave of the Emperor, and will begin his Journey to *Constantinople* in two or three days after. Divers Persons of Quality design to accompany him, and his Retinue will consist of no less than 400 Persons. Lodgings are preparing in this City for the *Turkish* Ambassador, who is on his Journey hither with a numerous Train. Our last Advices from *Hungary* say, the Imperial and *Turkish* Commissioners for settling the Limits between the two Empires, having for the present left the Differences concerning the Town of *Novi*, and some other small Places on the Borders of *Croatia* undecided, were busied with settling the Limits of the German and *Turkish* Dominions in *Transylvania* and *Upper Hungary*. The Imperial Forces continue to work with great Application on the new Fortifications at *Arat*, *Peter-Waradin*, and other Frontier Places, which they intend to finish before Winter. They write from *Bohemia*, that the Generals *Trautmansdorf* and *Rosa* had fought a Duel, in which the last was killed on the Spot, and the other died the next day of his Wounds.

*Dresden, Septemb. 11.* The States of *Saxony* are still assembled, to consider of the King of *Poland's* Demands of a Supply for clearing the Arrears due to the Forces in this Country, for paying a Sum of 300000 Dollars which has been borrowed for the King's Service, and discharging the other Debts of the King's Chamber of Accounts in *Saxony*, for repairing the Fortifications of the Frontier Places in this Electorate, and for other Necessary Occasions. Monsieur *Haugwitz* Marshal of the Court, and divers other Persons of Quality

are gone from hence to wait upon the King of Poland at Teplitz; who intends to return to this place about a fortnight hence. Monsieur *Rosa*, Son to General *Rosa*, was killed last Sunday in a Duel by the Baron of *Nimphs*.

*Francfort, Sept. 16* They write from *Weynheim*, that the Elector Palatine is gone from thence to pass a few days at *Schwetzingen*, a small Town near *Heydelberg*. The new Fortifications of *Heydelberg* are considerably advanced, and the Castle of that Place is in such a forwardness, that it is said the Elector designs to come and reside there in the beginning of the next year. The Germans are working with great Application to repair and augment the Fortifications of the Town of *Kiehl*, which has been somewhat damaged by the overflowing of the *Rhine*; and we hear, the French employ the like Diligence in building their Fortrefs of *New-Brisac*. The *Sieur Obrecht*, Commissioner from the Most Christian King for settling the Dutchess of *Orleans* Pretensions, is daily expected here to renew his Conferences with the Imperial and Palatine Commissioners concerning this Affair. They write from *Bamberg* of the 14th Instant, that the Elector of *Mentz*, upon the Invitation of the Margrave of *Auspach*, was gone from thence to spend a few days with his Highness at *Auspach*.

*Hamburg, Septemb. 18.* The Commissioners from the several Princes Directors of the Circle of *Lower-Saxony* have renewed their Conferences for enquiring into the Pretensions of the Dukes of *Mecklenbourg-Swerin* and *Strelitz*, who both lay Claim to the Succession of the late Duke of *Gustrow*. They write from *Berlin*, that the Elector of *Brandenburgh* is expected there this day from *Oraniebourg*, and that his Electoral Highness intends about a month hence to go and spend a few days at *Stargard* in *Pomerania*, and from thence to make a Journey to *Prussia*. Our last Letters from *Stockholm* lay, there was a Discourse that the King of *Sweden* had ordered three or four Regiments of Foot to be sent over to *Pomerania*.

*Leo, Sept. 23.* Mr. *Hill* arrived here last Saturday from the Court of *Savoy*, where he has been with the Character of His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary, to make the Compliment of Congratulation from His Majesty upon the Birth of the Prince of *Piedmont*. Count *Dions*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector of *Brandenburgh*, is likewise come hither from the *Hague* to wait on His Majesty. The King and the Duke of *Cell* went this day to *Diiren*, and intend to return hither next Thursday.

*Hague, Sept. 22. N. S.* The Baron *Schutz*, Envoy from the Duke of *Cell*, is gone back from hence to *Leo*, to which place Monsieur *Goldermassen*, Envoy Extraordinary from the States-General to His Majesty of *Great-Britain*, and the *Sieur Singerlant*, went likewise yesterday. The *Sieur Hatterman*, Envoy from the Elector Palatine, was in Conference this day with the Deputies of the States-General. The States of *Holland* and *Wifland* continue assembled.

*Plymouth, Sept. 19.* The Adventure, *Nicholas* Private Master, and the Faithful Galley, *Clency* Ma-

sters Master, both belonging to this Place, came in here last week from *Antegoa*, and the former is since sailed for *London*. This day arrived here the *Thomas* and *Edward* of this Place, *James Goodridge* Master, from *Barbadoes*.
