PRESENT,

The KING'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 1st day of November, 1941 (C.E. 55874/41), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by the twentieth section of an Act passed in the twenty-ninth year of Her late Majesty's reign, Chapter 89, entitled 'The Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865', it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Admiralty shall, from time to time, continue to appoint such Officers, Clerks and Servants for the purposes of the Hospital and Schools as seem fit and may (subject to the approval of Your Majesty in Council) fix the salaries of such Officers and Clerks:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 16th January, 1940, the rate of pay of the Director of Greenwich Hospital which had previously stood at £1,700 a year (the rate of pay of a Principal Assistant Secretary in Your Majesty's Civil Service) was replaced by a rate of £1,250 a year as from the 1st January, 1940, on the appointment of a Naval Officer in receipt of retired pay:

"And whereas a Principal Assistant Secretary is being appointed to the post again as from the 1st January, 1942:

"We beg leave humbly to reommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorise that the salary of the Director of Greenwich Hospital shall be at the rate of £1,700 a year, inclusive, as from 1st January, 1942."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with

the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
