WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 15th day of May, 1941, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Saint Mark, Dolphinholme, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Blackburn:

"Whereas by a deed made the 18th day of December, 1940, between Henry Claude Lyon Garnett of Number 6, Chester Square, in the City of Westminster, Esquire, of the one part and the Right Reverend Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn, of the other part, after reciting that the said Henry Claude Lyon Garnett was seised in fee simple of the Advowson of the said Benefice it was witnessed that he did thereby convey unto the said Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn, the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice to hold the same unto and to the use of the said Bishop and his successors in fee simple:

"And whereas the said conveyance was made with the intention of vesting the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage or presentation in the said Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn, in right of his See, and the parties thereto are desirous that anything which by

way of further assurance or otherwise may be required effectually to carry out that intention may be done, and have applied to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that a Scheme under the Acts hereinbefore mentioned may be prepared for the said purposes and submitted to Your Majesty in Council:

"And whereas the said Henry Claude Lyon Garnett and Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn, are consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof they have executed the same) the said Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn, both as party to the said deed of the 18th day of December, 1940, and as Bishop of the Diocese wherein the said Benefice is situate:

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice shall be transferred to the said Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Blackburn for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Blackburn.
