**T**HE Cardinal de Giudice, who acts as Minister from the Crown of Spain at this Court, had Audience of the Pope last week, whom he acquainted with the Choice the King of Spain has made, of the Cardinal of Cordova to fill the Place of Great Inquisitor of that Kingdom; which the Pope has confirmed, and has ordered his Bulls to be dispatched accordingly. The Duke of Modena's Resident at this Court had Audience likewise of the Pope, to whom he delivered a Letter from the Duke his Master, notifying the Death of the Dutchess-Dowager of Modena. The Differences between the Emperor and this Court are not yet adjusted; And the Pope still refuses to admit Count Martiniuz, the Imperial Ambassador, to Audience; It's said, his Excellency will go in few days to Naples, to confer with the Vice-Roy of that Kingdom.

**Milan, Sept. 9.** On the 31st of the last Month Signior Archinto, Prefect of the Cathedral Church of this City, took Possession of the said Church in the Name of Signior Archinto our new Archbishop, who still continues with the Character of the Pope's Nuncio at the Court of Spain. The Prince of Vaudemour, our Governor, having received Advice that the Inhabitants of Castiglione are again in Arms against their Prince, has sent some Troops to his Assistance under the Command of Signior Borezana.

**Venice, Septemb. 11.** Signior Soranzo, Ambassador from this Republick to the Port, embarked this day on the Man of War that is to carry him to Constantinople. A considerable Sum of Money was sent this week to Dalmatia, to pay the Venetian Forces in those Parts. The Senate has been several times assembled, to consider of an Expedient for accommodating the Differences between the Emperor and this State about the County of Lizza, and Expresses are frequently sent to the Venetian Ambassador at Vienna with the Senates Orders touching this Matter. Our last Advices from Dalmatia say, the Venetian and Turkish Commissioners for settling the Limits continue their Conferences with good Success; That General Mocenigo was still at Sebenico, and that the new Levies are continued in that Province for recruiting the Forces under his Command. A Convoy is preparing here to carry fresh Supplies of Provisions and Ammunition to the Forces of this State in the Marca, which, according to our last Advices from thence, were lately reviewed by the General Officers, and found in a very good Condition.

**Warsaw, Sept. 10.** The Conferences between the Chief Ministers of this Court and the Resident of Brandenburg, for accommodating the Affair of Elbing, are continued, and it being agreed, that the Elector of Brandenburg shall restore that City to the Polanders, who on their side are to deliver up some other Place to the Elector, to continue in his Electoral Highness's hands till they have given him Satisfaction as to his Demands from this Crown; several Places have been proposed for this purpose, but none is yet fixed upon. A Murza or Captain of the Tartars arrived here this week with several Gentlemen of Poland that were taken Prisoners during the late War, and have been Ransomed pursuant to the Treaty of Carlowitz. A considerable Sum of Money was sent this week to the Sieur Chelmsky, Envoy Extraordinary from this Crown to the Port. Major-General Carlowitz has begun his Journey to Moscow, where he is to reside as Envoy Extraordinary from Poland; he has a Commission to treat with the Ministers at that Court, in order to accommodate some Differences between the Czar and the King of Poland about the Limits of their respective Dominions in Ukraina. General Fleming has married a Daughter of the late Prince Sapieha, who was General of the Artillery, and Brother to the present Great General of Lithuania, and is by this Marriage allied to the Three Chief Families of Poland and Lithuania, Radziwil, Lubomirsky, and Sapieha. The Turks have not yet evacuated Caminiec; and in the mean time the Forces of this Crown continue encamped on the Borders of Russland.

**Copenhagen, Septemb. 19.** The Duke of Wirtemberg arrived here the 15th Instant from Holland, being accompanied by Prince Charles of Wirtemberg his Brother; He waited the next day upon the King of Denmark, by whom he was very well received, and is continued in the Chief Command of all his Forces. The King intends in the beginning of the next Month to take a Journey to Holstein; The fitting out of several Men of War, and the new Levies in these Parts, are continued with great Diligence.

**Vienna, Sept. 12.** The Imperial Court goes into Mourning next Sunday for the Death of the Queen of Portugal. An Envoy is arrived here from the Duke of Lorraine, to notify the Birth of his Son. Count Orting will be going from hence in few days on his Embassy to the Port. Our last Letters from Hungary give an Account, that the Grand Signior's Ambassador to this Court is daily expected at Belgrade; That the Turks are making several Alterations in the Fortifications of
