Whereas We consider it desirable, in the circumstances of the present emergency, that Thursday the first day of January one thousand nine hundred and forty-two shall be kept as a close holiday in all banks in England, Wales and Northern Ireland and shall, as regards bills of exchange and promissory notes payable in England, Wales or Northern Ireland, be deemed to be a bank holiday for all the purposes of the Bank Holidays Act, 1871:
