At the Court at Windsor Castle, the 18th day of December, 1941.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of December, 1941, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Cyril Forster, Bishop of Winchester (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the Benefice of Winchfield, and the Benefice of Dogmersfield, both situate in the Diocese of Winchester:

" SCHEME.

" *Winchfield and Dogmersfield.*

" 1. *Union of benefices.*—The Benefice of Winchfield and the Benefice of Dogmersfield shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Dogmersfield with Winchfield', but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

" 2. *Taking effect of union.*

(a) If upon the day when an Order in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette both benefices are vacant, the union shall take effect forthwith.

(b) If upon the said day neither Benefice is vacant the union shall take effect upon the first avoidance of the Benefice of Winchfield: Provided that if at the date of such avoidance the then Incumbent of the Benefice of Dogmersfield shall have been instituted before the date of the gazetting of such Order in Council and shall not consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice or if the Bishop shall not approve, the union shall take effect upon the avoidance by him of the Benefice of Dogmersfield.

(c) If upon the said day the Benefice of Dogmersfield only is vacant, the union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the Benefice of Winchfield.

(d) If upon the said day the Benefice of Winchfield only is vacant the union shall take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the Benefice of Dogmersfield shall, with the approval of the Bishop of Winchester, consent, but if he shall not so consent then the union shall take effect upon the avoidance by him of the Benefice of Dogmersfield.

" 3. *Parsonage House.*—Upon the union taking effect the Bishop may certify which of the two parsonage houses shall be the parsonage house of the United Benefice and the house not so certified shall thereupon vest in us the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for disposal in accordance with the said Measures and the net proceeds of such disposal shall be paid to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese.

" Provided that if upon the union taking effect the Bishop shall certify that neither house is suitable to be the parsonage house of the United Benefice, both houses shall vest in us for disposal as aforesaid, and so much of the net proceeds thereof as shall be determined by us the Ecclesiastical Commissioners with the approval of the Bishop shall be held by us as a fund for the provision of a new parsonage house for the United Benefice and the balance of such proceeds shall be paid to the Expenses Fund."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme, and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.
