PURCHASE TAX.

The Treasury hereby give notice that they have made the Purchase Tax (Exemptions) (No. 1) Order, 1942, which subject to the approval of the House of Commons, comes into operation on the 13th February, 1942, and provides for the exemption from tax of all tyres which were previously chargeable with tax.
