PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 24th day of January, 1942 (C.W. 22170/41), in the words following, viz.:---"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty' Naval or Marine Force to a person

Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

from time to time directed by Order in Council bearing date the 25th day of July, 1939, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to sanction the payment of a consolidated salary of £1,700 per annum to retired Flag Officers appointed to serve in the rank of Commodore, Second Class, Royal Navy or Royal Naval Reserve:

Naval Reserve: "And whereas the total emoluments, exclusive of Marriage Allowance, of retired Captains, Royal Navy, appointed to serve as Commodores of Convoy in the rank of Commodore, Second Class, and in receipt of Naval pay and allowances, might in cer-tain circumstances exceed £1,700 per annum: "We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the rule that the total emolu-ments of such Officers, excluding Marriage Allow-

ments of such Officers, excluding Marriage Allowance, shall in no circumstances exceed £1,700 per

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed
