Bar to the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Squadron Leader Roderick Aeneas Chisholm, D.F.C. (90233) Auxiliary Air Force, No. 604 Squadron.

Since being awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross in March, 1941, this officer has destroyed 5 enemy bombers at night, thus bringing his victories to 7 destroyed. By his exceptional sixill, Squadron Leader Chisholm has been largely responsible for the high standard of efficiency shown by his flight shown by his flight.

Acting Squadron Leader Anthony Desmond Joseph Lovell, D.F.C. (40402), No. 145 Squadron.

This officer is a fearless and skilful fighter pilot. His keenness to engage the enemy, combined with fine leadership, both in the air and on the ground, have set an inspiring example. In November, 1941, Squadron Leader Lovell shot down a Junkers 88 some 35 miles off the Yorkshire coast. In January, 1942, in the same area and in difficult weather conditions, he intercepted another Junkers 88 and shot it down into the sea. This officer has personally destroyed at least 11 hostile aircraft and has damaged others.

Distinguished Flying Medal.
