A PROCLAMATION.

SPECIFYING THE ARTICLES TO BE TREATED AS CONTRABAND OF WAR IN THE WAR WITH THAILAND.

GEORGE R.I.

Whereas a state of War exists between Us and Thailand:

And whereas it is necessary to specify the articles which it is Our intention to treat as Contraband of War:

Now, therefore, We do hereby Declare, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, that during the continuance of the War, or until We do give further public notice, the Proclamation issued on September 3rd, 1939, wherein were specified the articles which it is Our intention to treat as Contraband of War during the continuance of the War with Germany, shall be deemed to specify the articles which it is Our intention to treat as Contraband of War during the continuance of the War with Thailand.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this twenty-third day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-two and in the sixth year of Our Reign.

GOD SAVE THE KING.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 12th day of February, 1942 (N.2746/42), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Order in Council dated 19th December, 1923, sanctioned certain revised rates of extra duty pay to Royal Marines employed in appointments at Royal Marine Divisions and the Depot, R.M., Deal, including payment at 1s. a day to Provost Sergeants:

"And whereas we have found it expedient to establish a Provost Company of the operational Royal Marine Division, whose Sergeants will be eligible for extra duty pay at 1s. a day, and we consider that ranks of the Provost Company below Sergeant should be granted additional pay at the rate of 6d. a day:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorise payment of extra duty pay accordingly with effect from the date of commencement of the duties.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 15th day of January, 1942, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Emmanuel, Attercliffe, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield:—

"Whereas we are satisfied that the Reverend William Seldon Morgan of More Rectory, Bishop's Castle, Salop, Clerk in Holy Orders, is the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the said William Seldon Morgan desires to transfer the advowson of the said benefice to the Bishop of Sheffield for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof he has executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the

day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Emmanuel, Attercliffe, shall be transferred to the said Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield, and his successors in the same bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Sheffield for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Sheffield.

Whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 12th day of February, 1942, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which with the consent of the Right Reverend Kenneth, Bishop of Oxford (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme) we have prepared for effecting the union of the Benefice of Northbourne, Saint Peter, and a part of the Benefice of Hagbourne, both situate in the Diocese of Oxford.

#### " SCHEME

"1. *Boundaries*.—Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette a part of the Benefice and Parish of Hagbourne containing by estimation an area of 500 acres or thereabouts and included in which is the Mission Church dedicated to St. Frideswide (the boundaries of which part are described in the schedule hereto and are shown upon the map annexed to this Scheme) shall be severed from the remaining part of the said Benefice and Parish and united to the Benefice and Parish of Northbourne.

"2. *Endowments*.—Upon the union taking effect or upon the vacation of the Benefice of Hagbourne by the Reverend Harold Allan Smith-Masters (whichever shall be the later), a capital sum of £1,666 13s. 4d. being part of a sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty to the said Benefice of Hagbourne pursuant to the Tithe Act, 1936, shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefice of Hagbourne and shall be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty for the augmentation of the Benefice of Northbourne.

#### " SCHEDULE

"All that north western part of the said Parish of Hagbourne which lies to the west of the middle of the Didcot Newbury and Southampton line of the Great Western Railway and to the north of an imaginary line commencing at the point where the said line of railway crosses the middle of the footpath which follows the course of the stream flowing along the southern side of East Hagbourne Field and extending thence generally westward along the middle of the said footpath to its junction with Park Road and extending thence due westward in a straight line to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Hagbourne from the Parish of Harwell in the County of Berks and in the said Diocese of Oxford."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the

preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme, and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

541367 Corporal Edwin Gilbert Durant, Royal Air Force.

In November, 1941, an aircraft caught fire, and one of its bombs exploded. Corporal Durant led the fire tender party to the scene after the first explosion, knowing full well that further explosions could be expected from the remaining bombs. On reaching the blazing aircraft, Corporal Durant observed an injured airman lying near the wreckage and, assisted by another airman, promptly dragged him clear. Whilst carrying the injured airman to the comparative safety of the fire tender, they were twice hurled to the ground by the force of the explosion from two further bombs. Leaving the injured airman to the care of the medical orderly in charge of the ambulance, Corporal Durant led a party to the other side of the aircraft, whence he had heard a cry for help, and helped to extricate another casualty from the fire. Throughout, Corporal Durant displayed fine leadership and complete disregard of his own safety and, with the assistance of another airman was undoubtedly responsible for saving the life of one of the occupants of the blazing aircraft. Unfortunately, the second occupant who was rescued subsequently died of his injuries.

Now therefore the Minister of Health, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Poor Law Act, 1930, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order.

#### *Citation, &c.*

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the York, West Riding (Adjudicating Officers) Order, 1942, and in its application to the County of York, West Riding (in this Order referred to as "the County") shall be read as one with the Public Assistance Order, 1930, as amended by the Public Assistance (Casual Poor) Order, 1931, as subsequently amended, the Public Assistance (Amendment) Order, 1939, the Public Assistance (Amendment) Order, 1940, the Public Assistance (Amendment) Order (No. 2), 1940, and the Public Assistance (Amendment) Order, 1941, and modified by this Order:

Provided that in case of any inconsistency the provisions of this Order shall prevail.

(2) This Order shall come into operation on the 11th day of March, 1942.

#### *Modification of Orders, &c., Applicable to the County.*

2.—(1) Any orders, rules or regulations made by the Minister and in force in the County shall, in their application to the County, have effect subject to such modifications as may be necessary to give full effect to the provisions of this Order.

(2) Notwithstanding the generality of the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article the Public Assistance Order, 1930, as amended as hereinbefore set out shall in its application to the County be modified in manner following, namely:—

(a) in paragraph (1) (b) of Article 25, before the words "a Relieving Officer", there shall be inserted the words "an Adjudicating Officer or";

(b) in paragraph (5) of Article 166, after the words "the Council", wherever those words occur, there shall be inserted the words "or an Adjudicating Officer", and after the words "when required by them" there shall be inserted the words "or him";

(c) to paragraph (1) of Article 167 there shall be added the words "and shall also attend before any Adjudicating Officer when that Officer is considering applications for relief reported to him by the Relieving Officer";

(d) in paragraph (4) of Article 167, after the word "Committee", there shall be inserted the words "and each attendance before any Adjudicating Officer";

(e) in paragraph (5) of Article 167, after the words "next meeting", there shall be inserted the words "or to an Adjudicating Officer acting in their stead", and for the words "their previous meeting" there shall be substituted the words "the date of the previous consideration by the Committee or the Adjudicating Officer as the case may be";

(f) in paragraph (12) of Article 167, after the words "until the next ordinary meeting of the Committee", there shall be inserted the words "or until the consideration of the case by an Adjudicating Officer acting in their stead."

(3) Notwithstanding the generality of the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article the Relief Regulation Order, 1930, as partly rescinded on 19th December, 1931, and amended by the Relief Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1932, the Relief Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1940, and the Relief Regulation (Amendment) Order (No. 2), 1940, shall in its application to the County be modified in manner following, namely:—

(a) in the proviso to paragraph (2) (c) of Article 11, after the word "Committee", wherever that word occurs, there shall be inserted the words "or an Adjudicating Officer acting in their stead", and the word "their" in line 7 shall be omitted;

(b) in Article 10, the proviso to Article 12 and Article 16, after the words "Committee or Sub-Committee", wherever those words occur, there shall be inserted the words "or an Adjudicating Officer acting in their stead."

#### *Appointment of Officers.*

3. The Council may from time to time appoint such numbers of suitable persons as they may think necessary to hold the office of Adjudicating Officer to perform such of the duties of that office (as prescribed by this Order) in such area or areas as the Council may from time to time require.

#### *Conditions of Service, &c.*

4. Every person appointed by the Council as an Adjudicating Officer shall be a Senior Poor Law Officer.

#### *Duties of Adjudicating Officer.*

5. The duties of Adjudicating Officer shall be the following, namely—

(a) to determine, in accordance with the statutory provisions and any rules, orders or regulations made by the Minister in that behalf, and, subject thereto, in accordance with any regulations made by the Council for the purpose, the nature and amount of relief (if any) to be given to applicants for relief within such classes or falling to be dealt with in such circumstances as the Council shall from time to time authorise;

(b) to make orders for the grant of relief accordingly;

(c) to reconsider periodically, in accordance with any rules, orders or regulations made by the Minister in that behalf, and, subject thereto, in accordance with any regulations made by the Council for the purpose, the cases of persons receiving relief within such classes or falling to be dealt with in such circumstances as the Council shall from time to time authorise, and to make any necessary orders with regard thereto;

(d) to report to the appropriate Committee or Sub-Committee of the Council all orders for relief made by him;

(e) to refer for consideration by the appropriate Committee or Sub-Committee of the Council such of the cases falling to be dealt with by him under this Order as in his opinion should be dealt with by the Committee or Sub-Committee, and also any cases falling within such classes as the Council may from time to time direct;

(f) to refer to the appropriate Committee or Sub-Committee of the Council for review or consideration any case in which a recipient of relief or an applicant for relief asks for reconsideration of the Adjudicating Officer's determination or proposed determination of his case;

(g) to keep Relief Order Books and to make entries therein in accordance with the provisions of Article 22 of the Public Assistance Order, 1930, whenever he considers applications for relief or reconsiders cases in which relief has been granted;

(h) to report to the appropriate Committee or Sub-Committee of the Council all cases in which an application for relief has been refused, or in

which on reconsideration relief has been discontinued.

(i) to carry out such other duties relating to or arising out of the grant of relief as may be assigned to him by the Council.
