WHEREAS in pursuance of the Bishops Resignation Act, 1869, a representation has been made to His Majesty by the Most Reverend and Right Honourable Cosmo Gordon, by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, Primate of All England and Metropolitan at the instance of the Right Reverend Bertram, by Divine Permission Lord Bishop of Norwich, and as such a Bishop of a Diocese within and of the Province of Canterbury, that the said Bishop is desirous of resigning his Bishopric (such resignation to take formal effect upon the 24th day of June, 1942), by reason that he is incapacitated by age from the due performance of his duties as Bishop;

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied of such incapacity and that the said Bishop has canonically resigned:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared that the said Bishopric of Norwich shall become vacant on the 24th day of June, 1942, and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased to direct, and it is hereby directed, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of Norwich.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of March, 1942, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Westminster Abbey Measure, 1929, have prepared the following Scheme

relating to the Dean and Chapter of the Collegiate Church of Saint Peter, Westminster:

"Whereas by an Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 16th day of January, 1940, relating to the said Dean and Chapter, which Order was published in the London Gazette of the 19th day of January, 1940, a Scheme prepared by us under the powers conferred by the said Measure for apportioning as therein directed the annual income of the said Dean and Chapter for the period of five years from the 29th day of September, 1939, was ratified:

"And whereas we are satisfied that it is expedient that the said Scheme should now be amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the said Measure and after consultation with the Dean and Chapter of Westminster and with the approval of the Right Honourable John, Viscount Simon, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, exercising the authority of His Majesty as Visitor of the Abbey (such approval being testified by his signature and seal being subscribed and affixed to this Scheme) recommend that from and after the 25th day of December, 1941, the said Scheme ratified by the said Order of His Majesty in Council shall have effect as if there were inserted therein, at the end of the first paragraph of the operative part thereof, the following proviso, namely:—

'Provided that where the deanery or any canonry has been vacant for a period of three consecutive months, then as respects any period thereafter during which the vacancy continues, the sums hereinbefore directed to be applied out of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter for the stipend of the dean or of that canon, as the case may be, shall not be so applied; and as respects that period the annual sums hereinbefore directed to be paid out of the said income to the Fabric Fund shall be increased by an amount equal to the sums which would, but for this proviso, be applicable as respects that period for the said stipend.'

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of London.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of a share of and in the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Saint Wilfrid, Brighton, in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Wilfrid, Brighton, is at present exercisable alternately by Your Majesty and Your Successors and by the Bishop of Chichester for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Honourable Winston Leonard Spencer-Churchill, now First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury acting on behalf of Your Majesty, has agreed to transfer the alternate right of patronage exercisable by Your Majesty in respect of the said

Benefice to the Bishop of Chichester for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof he has executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the share exercisable by Your Majesty of and in the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Wilfrid, Brighton, shall be transferred to and shall thereupon and thenceforth become absolutely vested in the said Bishop of Chichester and his successors in the same Bishopric to the intent that the whole of the said Advowson shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Chichester for the time being."

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chichester.

The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to William Frederick Baxter, in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

On the 8th July, 1941, an accident occurred in the Service Department of the Standard Motor Co. Ltd., Coventry, in which an employee of the firm, named Ross, was trapped by the arms between the rope and pulley at the end of a 130 feet long lattice work jib of a crane, so that he was in imminent danger of bleeding to death or falling a distance of 110 feet to the ground. Baxter, another employee of the firm, after obtaining a rope and some first-aid dressings, climbed to the top of the jib where he lashed the man more securely, applied dressings and a tourniquet to his injuries and stayed with him for an hour until a rescue was effected by the Fire Brigade.

Baxter displayed great initiative and intelligence in collecting first-aid equipment and his action in applying the dressings and tourniquet in such a perilous position was one of great gallantry. There is little doubt that but for his action Ross would have died either through loss of blood or by falling from the end of the crane to the ground.
