A PROCLAMATION.

FOR CONTINUING IN ACTUAL SERVICE  
CERTAIN OFFICERS AND MEN OF THE  
NAVAL RESERVES.

GEORGE R.I.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on Us by section five of the Royal Naval Reserve Volunteer Act, 1859, as amended by subsequent enactments, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, We hereby order and direct that all men of the Royal Naval Reserve and Royal Fleet Reserve, all officers and men of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve (including the Royal Naval Volunteer (Wireless) Reserve) and all men of the Royal Naval Special Reserve, who at the date of this Our Proclamation are in actual service shall continue in such actual service for the period of five years from the date of their respectively coming into actual service, if their services be so long required.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this eleventh day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-two and in the Sixth year of Our Reign.

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the Parishes of Sundon and Streatley and of the New Parish of Biscot all in the County of Bedford and in the Diocese of Saint Albans:

" Whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to be desirable that the boundaries of the said Parishes and New Parish should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

" And whereas the Bishop of the Diocese and the Incumbents of the Benefices concerned consent to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof they have signed this Scheme):

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said

Parishes of Sundon and Streatley and of the said New Parish of Biscot shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedules of and delineated on the map or plan annexed to this Scheme.

" The Schedules to which the foregoing Scheme has reference:—

" *The First Schedule.*

" The territory (shown by pink colour on the map) to be annexed to the parish of Sundon:—

" All that portion of the New Parish of Biscot in the County of Bedford and in the Diocese of Saint Albans which is bounded on the north by the said Parish of Sundon on part of the west by the Parish of Toddington in the said County and Diocese and on the remaining part of the west, upon the south and upon the east by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Toddington from the said New Parish of Biscot crosses the middle of the London Midland and Scottish Railway and extending thence south-eastwards along the middle of the railway for a distance of 22 chains or thereabouts to the middle of the Sundon Arch and extending thence north-eastward (thereby crossing Whitefield Road) to and along the middle of the stream which forms the northern boundary of Legrave Common for a distance in all of 12 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite the western end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of Rotten Corner and extending thence eastward to and along the said wall or fence to its eastern end and in a straight line in continuation thereof for a distance in all of 39 chains or thereabouts to the middle of the footpath leading to Great Bramingham Farm and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 50 chains or thereabouts to the south-eastern end of the wall or fence forming the north-eastern boundary of Great Bramingham Wood and extending thence north-westward along the said wall or fence for a distance of 27 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the wall or fence forming the boundary between the closes numbered 1 and 2 on the map annexed to this Scheme and extending thence first north-eastward, then north-westward and then again north-eastward along the said wall or fence for a distance in all of 18 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite the southern end of the wall or fence forming the boundary between the closes numbered 3 and 4 on the said map and extending thence north-westward to and along the last-mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the boundary between the closes numbered 5 and 4 upon the same map for a distance of 29 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Biscot from the said Parish of Sundon.

" *The Second Schedule.*

" The territory (shown by green colour on the map) to be annexed to the Parish of Streatley:—

" All that portion of the said New Parish of Biscot which is bounded upon the east by the New

Parish of Stopsley in the said County and Diocese, on the north partly by the said Parish of Streatley and partly by the said Parish of Sundon, on the west by the portion of the New Parish of Biscot which is described in the First Schedule and on the south-west by an imaginary line commencing at the south-eastern end of the wall or fence forming the north-eastern boundary of Great Bramingham Wood and extending thence south-eastward along the wall or fence forming the north-eastern boundary of Little Bramingham Wood for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to its south-eastern end and extending thence south-eastward in a straight line for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Icknield Way opposite the north-western end of the footpath leading to the main road from Bedford to Luton and extending thence south-eastward to and along the said footpath for a distance of 49 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the last-mentioned road and extending thence due eastward (thereby crossing the said road) in a straight line for a distance of 23 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Biscot from the said New Parish of Stopsley."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme, and to order and direct that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

"Whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to be desirable that the boundaries of the said Parishes and New Parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Bishop of the Diocese and the Incumbents of the Benefices concerned consent to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof they have signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said Parish of Downend, the said Parish of Frampton Cotterell, the said Parish of Winterbourne, the said New Parish of Coalpit Heath, and the said New Parish of All Saints, Winterbourne Down, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedules of and delineated on the map or plan annexed to this Scheme.

"The Schedules to which the foregoing Scheme has reference:—

*"The First Schedule.*

"The territory (coloured pink on the map) to be annexed to the New Parish of All Saints, Winterbourne Down, in the County of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Bristol, comprising:—

"I. All those portions of the Parish of Downend, of a detached portion of the Parish of Frampton Cotterell and of the New Parish of Coalpit Heath, all in the said County and Diocese which taken together are bounded upon all sides as follows,

that is to say, upon a part of the west by the Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Frenchay, in the said County and Diocese, upon the north-west and upon a part of the north by the said New Parish of All Saints, Winterbourne Down, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the north, upon the south-east, upon the south and upon the remaining part of the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Winterbourne Down, from the said New Parish of Coalpit Heath at a point in the centre of Damson's Bridge which carries the road leading from Winterbourne Down to Kendleshire over the river Frome and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said road for a distance of 28½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Coalpit Heath to Downend and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of 33 yards or thereabouts to its junction with Coalsack Lane and extending thence first south-eastward and then eastward along the middle of Coalsack Lane for a distance of 19 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Coalpit Heath from an isolated portion of the said New Parish of All Saints, Winterbourne Down and extending thence south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of 43½ chains or thereabouts to the point in the middle of Folly Brook where it meets the boundary of the said detached portion of the Parish of Frampton Cotterell and extending thence westward along the middle of Folly Brook (thereby following the last-mentioned boundary) for a distance of 27 yards or thereabouts to a point in the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries the said road leading from Coalpit Heath to Downend over Folly Brook and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Downend to Damsons Bridge and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of 9½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite the roadway or footpath leading past the south side of Buryhill Farm to Church Lane and extending thence first south-westward (thereby again following in part the boundary of the said detached portion of the Parish of Frampton Cotterell) then westward and then again south-westward along the middle of the said roadway or footpath for a distance in all of 29½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Church Lane and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Church Lane for a distance of 9½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite the middle of the roadway or footpath leading past Baugh Farm to Bromley Heath and extending thence south-westward to and then first south-westward and then northward along the middle of the said roadway or footpath for a distance in all of 23 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading to Moorend and extending thence northward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of a field immediately adjoining the Warmley Rural District Council's sewage works and extending thence westward along the said wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the said sewage works for a distance in all of 15½ chains or thereabouts to its western end and extending thence westward to and south-westward along the middle of the footpath leading from Moorend to Griffin Farm for a distance in all of 11½ chains or thereabouts to the north-eastern side of the road leading from Bromley Heath to Moorend and extending thence south-westward to and then first north-westward and then northward along the said road for a distance of 18½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite the middle of the footpath leading across The Stepfield and extending thence north-westward to and along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries it across the river Frome on the boundary which divides the said Parish of Downend from the said Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Frenchay.

"II. And also all that other portion of the said New Parish of Coalpit Heath which is bounded upon the south-east by a second isolated portion of the said New Parish of All Saints, Winterbourne Down, upon the south by the said Parish of Downend, upon the west and upon the north by the first-mentioned isolated portion of the said New Parish of All Saints,

Winterbourne Down, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north-east by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary of the first-mentioned isolated portion diverges south-westward from following the middle of Coalsack Lane and extending thence south-eastward across the road leading from Henfield to Downend for a distance of 43 yards or thereabouts to the boundary stone which marks the northernmost point of the second isolated portion of the said New Parish of All Saints, Winterbourne Down.

" III. And also all that portion of the Parish of Winterbourne in the said County and Diocese which adjoins the said New Parish of All Saints, Winterbourne Down and lies to the south of the middle of the South Wales and Bristol Direct Line of the Great Western Railway.

*" The Second Schedule.*

" The territory (coloured green on the map) to be annexed to the said Parish of Winterbourne, comprising:—

" All that portion of the said New Parish of All Saints, Winterbourne Down which lies to the north of the middle of the last-mentioned line of railway and is bounded upon the west by the Bradley Brook.

*" The Third Schedule.*

" The territory (coloured purple on the map) to be annexed to the said Parish of Downend, being:—

" The remainder of the said detached portion of the Parish of Frampton Cotterell."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

**TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.**

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 19th June, 1942, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Acts, 1939 to 1942, to the amount of £75,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 22nd June, 1942, to Saturday, the 27th June, 1942, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied

for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
