

Winterbourne Down, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north-east by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary of the first-mentioned isolated portion diverges south-westward from following the middle of Coalsack Lane and extending thence south-eastward across the road leading from Henfield to Downend for a distance of 43 yards or thereabouts to the boundary stone which marks the northernmost point of the second isolated portion of the said New Parish of All Saints, Winterbourne Down.

" III. And also all that portion of the Parish of Winterbourne in the said County and Diocese which adjoins the said New Parish of All Saints, Winterbourne Down and lies to the south of the middle of the South Wales and Bristol Direct Line of the Great Western Railway.

" The Second Schedule.

" The territory (coloured green on the map) to be annexed to the said Parish of Winterbourne, comprising:—

" All that portion of the said New Parish of All Saints, Winterbourne Down which lies to the north of the middle of the last-mentioned line of railway and is bounded upon the west by the Bradley Brook.

" The Third Schedule.

" The territory (coloured purple on the map) to be annexed to the said Parish of Downend, being:—

" The remainder of the said detached portion of the Parish of Frampton Cotterell."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme, and to order and direct that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 19th June, 1942, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Acts, 1939 to 1942, to the amount of £75,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 22nd June, 1942, to Saturday, the 27th June, 1942, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied

for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
