The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:

Bar to the Distinguished Flying Cross.

cting Flight Lieutenant James Edgar Johnson, D.F.C. (83267), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 616 Squadron. Acting

Since being awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross in September, 1941, this officer has participated in many sweeps over enemy territory, during which he has destroyed 2 Messerschmitt 100 F.s and damaged a Focke Wulfe 190. He has also carried out a large number of convoy patrols. Flight Lieutenant Johnson is an exceptional leader and the magnificent example he sets is an inspiration to other pilots.

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Squadron Leader Philip Gordon Evans

(41914) No. 59 Squadron. In May, 1942, this officer was captain of a Hudson aircraft engaged in attacking an enemy convoy. In spite of intense anti-aircraft fire he pressed home his attacks and seriously damaged 2 merchant vessels which were seen to catch fire. On a previous occasion he succeeded in damaging an enemy merchant vessel. Squadron Leader Evans has displayed great skill and determination in locating and attacking enemy shipping. His courage and powers of leadership are of the highest order.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Leslie Sidney FORD (Can/J.3712), Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 175 Squadron.

This officer has carried out many operational missions, having been engaged in fighter sweeps and in bombing attacks on

land and sea targets. He participated in 2 attacks when 2 minesweepers and an enemy destroyer were sunk and 2 destroyers were -damaged. He is a keen and zealous flight commander and leader.

Flying Officer Cyril Anekstein (87066), Royal

Air Force Volunteer Reserve.

This officer has participated in many raids on the enemy. He was pilot of an aircraft which took part in the mass raid on Cologne. During the run-up to the target, despite severe damage to his aircraft by anti-aircraft fire, he persisted on his course until the bombs had been dropped and then made a skilful return flight to base. During the mass raid on the Ruhr on 1st June, his bomber was damaged severely by an enemy fighter, but he manoeuvred his aircraft cleverly and enabled his gunner to fire at point blank range and destroy the attacking aircraft. He later made a normal landing at base although all landing wheel tyres were punctured and part of the covering of the aircraft wings was shot off. This officer is cool and skilful when in action and sets a high standard of devotion to duty.

Pilot Officer Henry George A'Court (46901),

No. 115 Squadron.

This officer was captain of an aircraft detailed to attack Bremen one night in June, 1942. Shortly after passing the Dutch coast the aircraft was attacked by a Junkers 88. The port wing and the hydraulic system were damaged, and the running of the port engine was impaired. By skilful manoeuvring Pilot Officer A'Court evaded his pursuer and proceeded to Bremen to complete his mission. When approaching the target, his aircraft received further damage by antiaircraft fire; the starboard wing petrol tanks: were also holed which caused an alarming loss of petrol. With calm determination Pilot Officer A'Court decided that there was just a chance that he might be able to reach this country. After a hazardous journey he

reached his base when the engines stopped through lack of petrol and he was compelled to land with the undercarriage retracted. This officer showed fine determination in fulfilling his mission after his aircraft had been so badly damaged, and his skill, courage and presence of mind during the return journey undoubtedly saved the lives of his crew.

Pilot Officer Robert Douglas Bowen (Can/J. 15064) Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 616

Squadron.

This officer participated in many sorties over enemy territory during which he destroyed I enemy aircraft and assisted in the probable destruction of another. He has acted as deputy flight commander and has led the flight on a large number of convoy patrols. Pilot Officer Bowen is an enthusiastic and efficient pilot, whose services are of great value to his squadron.

Pilot Officer William Lloyd Brill (Aus. 402933), Royal Australian Air Force, No.

460 Squadron.
One night in May, 1942, this officer was captain of an aircraft detailed to attack the Gnome Rhone works at Gennevilliers. Bad weather was encountered throughout the journey and fine determination was shown in flying through heavy rain squalls. Pilot Officer Brill's aircraft was caught in searchlights, and anti-aircraft fire the hydraulic system and put the rear turret out of action. After making a circuit at 1,500 ft. Pilot Officer Brill carried out an attack at 2,000 ft. and hit the target. The hydraulic pipes, operating the bomb doors, were subsequently damaged and the bomb doors could not be closed. The return journey was made in bad weather. Pilot Officer Brill, thinking that he would probably have to make a crash landing, decided to descend away from his base and he succeeded in making a good landing without flaps and with one wheel damaged. officer showed splendid courage and determination and has proved to be a resourceful pilot at all times.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

517691 Sidney William Flight Sergeant MERRYWEATHER, No. 174 Squadron. (Since

deceased.)

Since November, 1939, this pilot has participated in a number of operational patrols and offensive sorties. When in France, in May, 1940, he destroyed I Messerschmitt 109 in combat and another while patrolling over during the evacuation. Dunkirk damaged another enemy aircraft during the of · Britain. Flight Sergeant Merryweather has also taken part in many bombing attacks on factories and enemy His skill and determination aerodromes. are a source of inspiration to his fellow pilots.

1155523 Sergeant Cyril Terry.

Sergeant Terry made his first operational flight as front gunner of an aircraft which participated in the mass raid on Cologne of 30th May, 1942. On observing one of our bombers being attacked by an enemy aircraft, his clear instructions enabled his captain to manoeuvre the aircraft into a position from which Sergeant Terry was able to open fire at short range. At the first burst, the enemy aircraft caught fire and entered a curling dive. Shortly afterwards, Sergeant Terry skilfully drove off another enemy aircraft which was attacking one of our bombers. Two nights later this airman was the front gunner of an aircraft operating against the Whilst over Holland, on the return Sergeant Terry observed a Focke Wulfe 190 and shot it down in flames into the sea. By his keen observation, clear thinking and accurate gunnery this airman has destroyed 2 enemy fighters, and probably saved his own and 2 other bombers from destruction.
