## ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against ° the enemy:-

#### Distinguished Service Order.

Acting Squadron Leader Christopher Frederick CURRANT, D.F.C. (43367), No. 501 Squadron.

Squadron Leader Currant is a most courageous pilot and a brilliant leader. His untiring efforts and outstanding ability have been reflected in the splendid work accomplished by the squadron which he commands. One day in March, 1942, he was wounded in the head during a sortie. Despite this, he flew his aircraft safely back to base. Following a short enforced rest, he returned to operational flying with renewed vigour. Squadron Leader Currant has destroyed at least 14 and damaged many more enemy aircraft.

#### Bar to the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Squadron Leader Anthony Richard Henry BARTON, D.F.C. (30104), No. 126 Squadron.

Whilst operating from Malta, Squadron Leader Barton has destroyed at least 5 enemy aircraft, 2 of which he destroyed in one combat. He has at all times displayed the greatest determination to inflict loss on the enemy.

Squadron Leader Reginald Patrick Mahoney GIBBS, D.F.C. (33250), No. 39 Squadron.

Early in June, 1942, Squadron Leader Gibbs attacked and sank a large enemy merchant vessel. Some time afterwards this officer participated in an attack on an Italian

Despite opposition from enemy fighters and in the face of defensive fire from the naval vessels, Squadron Leader Gibbs successfully launched his torpedo at the leading warship. He flew his extensively damaged aircraft safely to base where he executed a skilful landing... This officer has at all times displayed great skill and devotion to duty. He has contributed materially to the operational efficiency of his squadron.

Acting Flight Lieutenant John Agorastos PLAGIS, D.F.C. (80227), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 185 Squadron.

This officer has displayed exceptional skill and gallantry in combat. He has destroyed at least 10 enemy aircraft, 2 of which he destroyed in one engagement. Undeterred by superior numbers of attacking aircraft, he presses home his attacks with great determination.

#### Distinguished Flying Cross.

Wing Commander Arthur John MASON (33169), No. 39 Squadron.

In June, 1942, this officer led an attack on an Italian naval force. Despite fighter opposition, a determined attack was made and at least I warship was hit by a torpedo. His leadership and courage in the face of formidable opposition were worthy of the highest praise. t that is the

Flight Lieutenant Harold Graham POCKLEY (Aus.608), Royal Australian Air Force, No. IO (R.A.A.F.) Squadron.

This officer has completed a large number of operational sorties against enemy ship-ping, both by day and by night, and has inflicted damage on both naval and merchant ships. His skill, tenacity and coolness under fire has set an inspiring example.

• Flying Officer Ian Arbuthnot SLAUGHTER, (42898), No. 203 Squadron.

This officer has at all times displayed great devotion to duty. Officer Slaughter In June, 1942, Flying skilfully, located, and shadowed an Italian naval force,, and passed on vital information which enabled formations of our aircraft to attack the force without delay. Throughout he showed great operational efficiency.

lot Officer John Henry Eric BISLEY (Aus.402720), Royal Australian Air Force, Pilot No. 126 Squadron.

Although he himself was severely wounded during the combat, he succeeded in landing at base. Acting Squadron Leader Edric Pilot Officer Bisley has destroyed 5 hostile McHARDY, D.F.C. Pilot Officer Adrian Philip GOLDSMITH, D.F.M. (Aus.402500), Royal Australian<sup>4</sup> Air Force, No. 126 Squadron.

This officer is a skilful and courageous pilot. In June, 1942, during an attack on an convoy 130 miles from his base, he shot down 2 enemy aircraft. Since being awarded the . Distinguished Flying Medal, Pilot Officer Goldsmith has destroyed 6 enemy aircraft, bringing his victories to 11.

Pilot Officer Michael Adrian GRAVES (69475), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 126 Squadron . . . . .

Pilot Officer Graves is a skilful pilot and a fine leader. In May, 1942, he led the squadron in an attack on an enemy bombing force. Although the bombers were heavily escorted by fighters, Pilot Officer Graves' squadron destroyed 5 Italian bombers. This

officer has personally destroyed at least 3 hostile aircraft.

Pilot Officer Stanley John JORDON (48951), No. 489 (N.Z.) Squadron.

Pilot Officer Jordon is the rear gunner and wireless operator of a bomber aircraft. In June, 1942, his aircraft was attacked by 2 Focke Wulfe 190's. In the first of several attacks, Pilot Office Jordon coolly waited before firing a burst which caused one of the pilots to break away with black smoke coming from his aircraft. Four further attacks were made by the remaining fighters during which Pilot Officer. Jordon, by his excellent directions, enabled his pilot to out-manoeuvre the Whenever the pilot's evasive action attacks. enabled him to bring his guns into action, Pilot Officer Jordon used them effectively. Throughout the engagement, he displayed great courage and skill which contributed materially to the safe return of his aircraft.

Pilot Officer John Andrew Trevor MEREDITH (116897), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve. Meredith, as captain of an aircraft, carried out an attack on a target in Cologne. On the return .journey, his aircraft was badly damaged and two of his crew were wounded. Despite this, Pilot Officer Meredith, with great skill and determination, flew his damaged aircraft for over 2 hours through searchlights and intense anti-aircraft fire. He eventually landed at an aerodrome near the English coast without further damage to his aircraft or injury to his crew.
