PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 2nd day of July, 1942, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Harbury in the County of Warwick and Diocese of Coventry:

"Whereas we are satisfied that Alice Ann Beardsworth of Ash Platt, Seal, in the County of Kent, Widow, is the Patron or person entitled to present to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant a duly qualified person nominated or chosen by the Bishop of the Diocese:

"And whereas the said Alice Ann Beardsworth desires to transfer the Advowson of the said Benefice to the Bishop of Coventry for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof she has executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Mervyn, Bishop of Coventry (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Harbury shall be transferred to the said Mervyn, Bishop of Coventry, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Coventry for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when

this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Coventry.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Supplementary Scheme bearing date the 2nd day of July, 1942, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Supplementary Scheme under the 11th Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, with reference to the United Benefice of Garway with Orcop in the Diocese of Hereford:

"*Supplementary Scheme.*

"Whereas an Order of Your Majesty in Council was made on the 25th day of May, 1939, and was published in the London Gazette on the 30th day of the same month, ratifying a Scheme dated the 11th day of May, 1939, for uniting the Benefices of Garway and Orcop, both situate in the said Diocese:

"And whereas before the union the Benefice of Garway was in the Rural Deanery of Ross and the Benefice of Orcop in the Rural Deanery of Hereford South, and the said Scheme contained no recommendation as to the Rural Deanery to which the United Benefice should belong:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty that, with the consent of the Right Reverend Richard, Bishop of Hereford (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), the United Benefice of Garway with Orcop shall belong to the Rural Deanery of Hereford South."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme; and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.
