(h) is certified by a local authority, as defined by the Blind Persons Acts, 1920 and 1938, to be registered as a blind person under arrangements made by the authority under those Acts; or

(i) is a married woman not living apart from her husband under a decree or order of any Court, or a woman who has living with her a child of hers under the age of fourteen, including a step-child and an illegitimate child, and, if the adoption took place before the passing of the National Service (No. 2) Act, 1941, an adopted child (whether adopted under the Adoption of Children Act, 1926, or the Adoption of Children (Scotland) Act, 1930, or otherwise):

And whereas it is enacted by the National Service (Armed Forces) Act, 1939, that any person who at the commencement of that Act was registered under the Military Training Act, 1939, or who was required to be so registered at any time before the commencement of the National Service (Armed Forces) Act, 1939, shall be liable to be called up for service under the last mentioned Act notwithstanding that he may not be so liable by virtue of any Proclamation made under that Act:

And whereas by Our Proclamations dated the first day of October, 1939, the first day of December, 1939, the first day of January, 1940, the ninth day of May, 1940, the twenty-ninth day of January, 1941, the twenty-seventh day of November, 1941, the eighteenth day of December, 1941, and the fifth day of March, 1942, We did in pursuance of the said Acts direct, declare and proclaim that certain of Our male subjects therein mentioned were liable under those Acts to be called up for service in our Armed Forces and that certain of Our women subjects therein mentioned were liable under those Acts to be called up for service in the Women's Royal Naval Service, the Auxiliary Territorial Service and the Women's Auxiliary Air Force:

And whereas by Orders in Council dated the twenty-seventh day of October, 1939, the thirty-first day of July, 1940, and the twenty-seventh day of November, 1941, the National Service (Armed Forces) Act, 1939, the National Service (Armed Forces) Act, 1940, and the National Service Act, 1941, were, subject to the modifications and adaptations therein specified, extended to the Isle of Man: Now, therefore, We do in pursuance of the National Service Acts, 1939 to 1941, hereby direct, declare and proclaim that with the exceptions and subject to the provisions hereinbefore mentioned

(1) all Our male subjects who on the date of this Our Proclamation have attained the age of eighteen years and have not attained the age of forty-one years and who are at the date of this Our Proclamation within Great Britain or who not having been in Great Britain at that date subsequently enter it, are on the date hereof or on the date on which they first subsequently enter Great Britain after the date hereof, by this Our Proclamation liable under the said Acts to be called up for service in Our Armed Forces;

(2) all Our male subjects who on the date of this Our Proclamation have attained the age of forty-one years and have not attained the age of forty-six years and who are at the date of this Our Proclamation within Great Britain or who not having been in Great Britain at that date subsequently enter it, are on the date hereof or on the date on which they first subsequently enter Great Britain after the date hereof, by this Our Proclamation liable under the said Acts to be called up for service in Our Armed Forces; and

(3) all Our women subjects who on the date of this Our Proclamation have attained the age of twenty years and have not attained the age of thirty-one years and who are at the date of this Our Proclamation within Great Britain, or who not having been in Great Britain at that date subsequently enter it, are on the date hereof or on the date on which they first subsequently enter Great Britain after the date hereof, by this Our Proclamation liable under the said Acts to be called up for service in the Women's Royal Naval Service, the Auxiliary Territorial Service and the Women's Auxiliary Air Force:

And We do hereby declare that in paragraph (i) of this Our Proclamation (which relates to certain of Our male British subjects between the ages of eighteen years and forty-one years) but not elsewhere in this Proclamation, the expression "Great Britain" includes the Isle of Man.

And We do hereby order Our Minister of Labour and National Service and Our Lieutenant Governor of the Isle of Man to give all necessary directions herein accordingly.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday, the 31st July, 1942, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Acts, 1939 to 1942, to the amount of £75,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Tuesday, the 4th August, 1942, to Saturday, the 8th August, 1942, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

THE JOHN STIRK AND SONS LIMITED (PRICE OF SHARES) ORDER, 1942, DATED THE 20TH JULY, 1942, MADE BY THE TREASURY UNDER REGULATION 78 OF THE DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS, 1939.

Whereas by the John Stirk and Sons Limited Control (No. 1) Order, 1942, dated the 1st day of April, 1942, the Minister of Supply (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") authorised an authorised controller to exercise functions of control on behalf of His Majesty with respect to the undertaking carried on by the Company called John Stirk and Sons Limited:

And whereas by the John Stirk and Sons Limited (Transfer of Shares) Order, 1942, the Minister transferred all the shares of John Stirk and Sons Limited to his nominee as specified in the Order:

And whereas the Treasury are of opinion that the price hereinafter specified as the price to be paid by the Minister in respect of the shares so transferred as aforesaid is not less than the value of those shares as between a willing buyer and a willing seller on the 1st day of April, 1942 (being the date of the John Stirk and Sons Limited Control (No. 1) Order, 1942):
