The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the George Medal and the British Empire Medal (Military Division) to the under-mentioned:—

Awarded the George Medal.

Squadron Leader Frank George Mogg (90028),
M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., Auxiliary Air Force.

Awarded the British Empire Medal (Military Division).

576550 Leading Aircraftman Peter Nigel Rowland,
Royal Air Force.

One night in May, 1942, an aircraft crashed on the edge of an aerodrome and immediately burst into flames. Squadron Leader Mogg (the station medical officer), accompanied by Leading Aircraftman Rowland, hastened to the scene and found that three members of the crew had been thrown clear of the main part of the wreckage and killed; a fourth member had managed to extricate himself from the tail turret. A wireless operator was, however, trapped in the blazing fuselage, being entangled by his harness and flying clothing which was burning. Showing complete disregard for their own safety, Squadron Leader Mogg, clad only in overalls over his pyjamas, and Leading Aircraftman Rowland went into the blazing wreckage to rescue the unfortunate airman. By lying flat on the floor and using a greatcoat as a shield Leading Aircraftman Rowland was able to afford some protection for the medical officer whilst the latter administered morphia to the injured operator. Leading Aircraftman Rowland afterwards assisted Squadron Leader Mogg in cutting the airman free and in extricating him from the aircraft. During the time that this officer and airman were working in the wreckage two oxygen bottles exploded within a few feet of their heads and there was grave danger that others might have done so at any time. Squadron Leader Mogg was badly scorched and sustained burns to his hands and wrists but, despite this, he accompanied the dying wireless operator during the journey by ambulance to hospital some 6 miles away. He then fainted and had to receive medical attention. Leading Aircraftman Rowland was also burned on the hands and wrists. Both rescuers displayed gallantry of a high standard.

Awarded the George Medal.

Aus.400689 Sergeant Robert Wilson Baxter, Royal
Australian Air Force.

Sergeant Baxter was the captain of a bomber which had made a successful raid on Germany. When nearing base the port engine, which had been hit by fire from the enemy's ground defences, caught alight. Sergeant Baxter proceeded to land the aircraft but, in the semi-darkness, he was unable to observe that the runways on the aerodrome were obstructed. The aircraft caught fire on impact with the obstruction. Five of the crew, including Sergeant Baxter, got out through the pilot's escape hatch but the wireless operator, who tried to escape through a lower hatch, became trapped. The aircraft was now burning furiously; ammunition and pyrotechnics were exploding and the petrol tanks were liable to explode at any moment. Sergeant Baxter, showing complete disregard for his own safety, re-entered the aircraft and remained inside for at least 5 minutes before he succeeded in releasing the wireless operator and pushing him through the pilot's escape hatch. He only managed to get clear himself just before the petrol tanks exploded. During his efforts to release his companion Sergeant Baxter sustained extensive second degree burns to his hands and face for which treatment in hospital was necessary. The unselfish heroism displayed by this airman undoubtedly saved the life of his comrade.

Awarded the British Empire Medal (Military Division).

561487 Acting Flight Sergeant Herbert George
William Cagby, Royal Air Force.

An aircraft was set on fire during an enemy air attack on an aerodrome in Malta. Whilst a second wave of bombers were diving to attack Flight Sergeant Cagby, displaying complete disregard for his own safety, removed about fifty 40 lb. bombs from the vicinity of the aircraft. His courageous and prompt action prevented an explosion and thereby saved valuable property. He has, on many other occasions, displayed courage and devotion to duty which has set a fine example.

636720 Sergeant William Royston Smith, Royal Air
Force.

Sergeant Smith has displayed courage and devotion to duty of a high standard during intense and almost continuous enemy air attacks on Malta. He has shown complete disregard for his personal safety and set an excellent example.

644403 Corporal Charles Edward Casey, Royal Air Force.

In April, 1942, a Henley aircraft was forced to alight on the sea some 800 yards from the shore. The aircraft turned over on to its back on alighting and the dinghy was lost. One member of the crew was apparently unable to swim and, supported by his life jacket, was soon in an exhausted condition some two or three hundred yards out. Corporal Casey swam out towards the airman and, when he had nearly reached him, an uninflated dinghy was dropped nearby from an aircraft. Corporal Casey swam to the dinghy but, not knowing how to inflate it, was compelled to abandon it. He then swam on to the airman who by now had ceased to show any signs of life. Corporal Casey persisted in his rescue efforts however and was later joined by another airman who had swum to his assistance. Between them they were able to tow the unconscious airman towards the shore. Despite strenuous efforts against the strong currents, the attempt proved almost beyond their strength and it was only with the further assistance of an officer that their unfortunate comrade was brought to the shore. The attempt to save his life proved unsuccessful but Corporal Casey took a very great risk in going to his assistance on a stretch of coast notorious for dangerous currents, and showed a high example of gallantry.

996888 Corporal John Fergusson, Royal Air Force.
89301 Corporal Arthur Edward Gwynne Roderick, Royal Air Force.

1426815 Aircraftman Second Class Henry Alfred Simpson, Royal Air Force.

In April, 1942, an Oxford aircraft which was taking off collided with another and immediately caught fire. It was extensively damaged and was broken in two just in front of the door, thus completely cutting off the retreat from that exit. The pilot was unable to move, however, as he was rendered unconscious by the crash. The petrol tanks of both aircraft were pierced and the escaping petrol which ignited immediately enveloped the whole of the aircraft. Despite the fierceness of the fire Corporals Fergusson and Roderick and Aircraftman Simpson climbed on to the wing of the aircraft and, with their bare hands, broke open the window. Their efforts to rescue the pilot were greatly handicapped as he was strapped in the machine and wearing a jacket-type parachute harness which was attached to his seat type parachute. Nevertheless these airmen succeeded in extricating him and undoubtedly saved his life by their prompt and gallant action.

ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Distinguished Service Order.

Wing Commander Tristram Barnard De La Poer BERESFORD, D.F.C. (33156).

This officer continues to display skill and leadership of a high standard. He has led his wing in numerous sorties many of which have been as escort to our bombers. One day in June, 1942, he intercepted a formation of enemy bombers and personally shot down one of them and shared in the destruction of another. The masterly leadership and keenness displayed by Wing Commander Beresford have set an example of the highest order.

Acting Wing Commander Howard Clive MAYERS, D.F.C. (77976), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve.

Wing Commander Mayers has commanded a wing since April, 1942. He is an expert on bombing and machine gun attacks, whilst his tactical knowledge has contributed much to the success of long range fighter operations. On two occasions in May, 1942, this officer led a formation in attacks on aircraft bringing supplies to the enemy and destroyed many of them. Wing Commander Mayers has displayed gallantry and great devotion to duty in the direction of recent intensive operations.

Bar to Distinguished Flying Cross.

Squadron Leader Osgood Villiers HANBURY, D.F.C. (81357), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 260 Squadron.

This officer continues to display outstanding skill, courage and fine leadership. Under his leadership his squadron has inflicted heavy losses on the enemy both in air combat and on the ground. During a recent sortie he led a formation as escort to our bombers, far behind the enemy lines, and heavy damage was caused. All our bombers returned safely.

Major Johan Daniel Wilhelm HUMAN, D.F.C. (103021), South African Air Force, No. 1 (S.A.A.F.) Squadron.

This officer has completed a large number of operational sorties. He is an extremely efficient and reliable leader whose work has proved most valuable. One day in May, 1942, whilst on patrol he sighted 12 enemy aircraft which he immediately engaged. During this combat he destroyed 1 enemy aircraft. Shortly afterwards, when acting as escort to our bombers he encountered 6 Stukas accompanied by 4 fighters which attacked our aircraft. On this occasion Major Human destroyed another enemy fighter. He has displayed courage and devotion to duty which have set an inspiring example.

Acting Squadron Leader Billy DRAKE, D.F.C. (39095), No. 112 Squadron.

Squadron Leader Drake is a skilful pilot and a fine leader. He has displayed great energy and has led his squadron on every sortie in the latest battle of Libya. One day in June, 1942, an attack was made against Gazala aerodrome which resulted in a number of enemy aircraft being destroyed or damaged on the ground. Squadron Leader Drake has personally scored hits on enemy transport vehicles and on a heavy tank. In addition he has destroyed at least 5 enemy aircraft and damaged a number of others in air combats.

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Wing Commander Harold Arthur FENTON (27127).

This officer has led his wing successfully on many sorties. One day in May, 1942, he encountered 15 enemy bombers escorted by an equal number of fighters. Wing Commander Fenton, with two other pilots, immediately attacked the bombers and delivered four attacks before his own aircraft was hit by fire from an enemy fighter. Wing Commander Fenton's windscreen became covered in oil but he was able to return to base where he made a safe landing. This officer is a fine leader who inspires much confidence in others.

Lieutenant Colonel Henry James MARTIN (102613), South African Air Force, No. 12 (S.A.A.F.) Squadron.

This officer has led his squadron in many successful sorties. One day in June, 1942, he completed 4 separate attacks against the enemy and, on the following day, he led his squadron in four further raids. He has displayed skill, fine leadership and complete disregard of danger.

Acting Squadron Leader Robert H. GIBBS (Aus. 714), Royal Australian Air Force, No. 3 (R.A.A.F.) Squadron.

This officer has displayed exceptional skill and gallantry in combat. One day in May, 1942, he encountered a large force of enemy bombers heavily escorted by fighters. Displaying great courage, he ignored the fighters and led an attack against the bombers. During the combat his aircraft was damaged and he was forced to abandon it by parachute. Squadron Leader Gibbs has completed a large number of operational flying hours in the Western Desert and has destroyed 6 enemy aircraft and probably destroyed a further 14.

Major Derrick Dunbar MOODIE (102683), South African Air Force, No. 4 (S.A.A.F.) Squadron.

This officer assumed command of his squadron when our forces were withdrawing from Benghazi. Displaying great energy he has since led it on every sortie. In April, 1942, a courageous attack was made against 20 Stukas escorted by an equal number of fighters. Shortly afterwards, he was the leader in an attack against at least 30 enemy fighters. He was reported missing from this operation but returned later. His keenness, devotion to duty and masterly leadership have contributed largely to the successes which have been achieved.

Flight Lieutenant Robert Leith MCGREGOR (43105), No. 298 Squadron.

In June, 1942, whilst on reconnaissance duties near Bir Hacheim, Flight Lieutenant McGregor encountered 4 Messerschmitt 109's which attacked separately. Displaying skilful airmanship he accepted the challenge of each aircraft in turn and destroyed 1. His own aircraft sustained severe damage. With the remaining 3 enemy fighters still pursuing him, he flew towards El Adem where his aircraft crashed in flames. Flight Lieutenant McGregor was uninjured and immediately proceeded to send in his report from the nearest telephone. This officer has displayed high courage and great devotion to duty in the face of the enemy.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Geoffrey William GARTON (67034), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 112 Squadron.

In June, 1942, when it became necessary to retire from a landing ground, Flight Lieutenant Garton displayed considerable skill and initiative in salvaging a bomber which had been stripped of much of its equipment. Without having flown this type of aircraft previously he successfully flew the bomber, with two passengers, to another aerodrome where he made a safe landing. Flight Lieutenant Garton has participated in many operational sorties in which he has destroyed at least 4 hostile aircraft.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Thomas Patterson KYD SCAD (76161), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 73 Squadron.

This fighter pilot has displayed high courage and skill which have been a splendid example to all personnel of his squadron. He has figured prominently in a number of hazardous operations in which he has shown a keen desire to engage the enemy. Flight Lieutenant Scade has destroyed several enemy aircraft, of which 2 were destroyed on the ground during a particularly successful raid on Jedabya aerodrome.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Walter William SWINNERTON (61252), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 250 Squadron.

Flight Lieutenant Swinnerton has completed a large number of operational flying hours over the Western Desert and has carried out many operational sorties. In November, 1941, he was shot down near Benina aerodrome. Hiding himself, he watched the enemy lay a minefield before they withdrew. He then made a map which enabled our forces, on their arrival, to render the aerodrome serviceable at once. In May, 1942, when proceeding on a flight to machine gun the enemy, he observed 6 of his comrades walking. Flight Lieutenant Swinnerton landed near them and finding that they were the crew of an aircraft which had been shot down he gave them his emergency rations after which he took off and directed one of our patrols to their rescue.

Lieutenant Walter John Stanley Alexander WEBB (103400), South African Air Force, No. 40 (S.A.A.F.) Squadron.

In May, 1942, whilst on a reconnaissance flight, this officer was engaged by 3 enemy aircraft one of which he destroyed. He then continued his reconnaissance and gained valuable information. Shortly afterwards Lieutenant Webb's aircraft was shot down in flames but, displaying great courage and initiative, he avoided capture and returned to his squadron. He has at all times displayed great skill and devotion to duty which have contributed largely to the high standard of morale maintained by his squadron.

Acting Flying Officer Leslie Patrick Sandford BING (Can/J 15465), Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 89 Squadron.

Flying Officer Bing has displayed courage and outstanding skill. He has taken part in the destruction of 10 enemy aircraft at night. Flying Officer Bing has set a magnificent example to other observers.

Pilot Officer Allan John HANCOCK (120710), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 213 Squadron.

This officer has shot down five enemy aircraft and damaged a further two during recent operations in the Western Desert. In a combat in June, 1942, Pilot Officer Hancock sustained a bullet wound in the arm. Despite the intense pain and the loss of much blood he flew his aircraft to the nearest landing ground and, although in a semi-conscious condition, made a perfect landing.

Pilot Officer Gray STENBORG (N.Z. 402494), Royal New Zealand Air Force, No. 185 Squadron.

Pilot Officer Stenborg has displayed great determination and keenness to engage the enemy. One day in July, 1942, he encountered a superior force of enemy fighters which were acting as escort to bombers. Pilot Officer Stenborg attacked the enemy fighters, destroying two of them, and dispersed the remainder, thus enabling other Royal Air Force fighters to attack the bombers. A few days later he completed a similar operation and again shot down two enemy fighters. Pilot Officer Stenborg has now destroyed eight enemy aircraft.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

Aus. 402523 Flight Sergeant Donald Hindle MCBURNIE, Royal Australian Air Force, No. 450 (R.A.A.F.) Squadron.

Flight Sergeant McBurnie has displayed outstanding courage and keenness in his combats with the enemy. He has participated in many operational sorties, and has destroyed several enemy aircraft. He particularly distinguished himself on one occasion when participating as cover to a formation of aircraft detailed to make a bombing attack. When nearing the target, the formation was attacked by two enemy fighters. In the ensuing combat Flight Sergeant McBurnie displayed skill and determination and only broke off the engagement when his aircraft had been riddled with bullets and he was wounded in the leg and shoulder. This airman has set a fine example.

Can./R. 67906 Flight Sergeant Donald George REID, Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 185 Squadron.

This airman has displayed skill, courage and determination in the face of the enemy. On two occasions recently he has been detailed to attack enemy fighters escorting bombers, and although greatly outnumbered, he destroyed one fighter on each occasion. In June, 1942, he encountered a force of Italian bombers which were heavily escorted by fighter aircraft. Diving through the fighters he attacked one of the bombers and set it on fire and then destroyed one of the fighters which had attacked him. Flight Sergeant Reid has destroyed at least five enemy aircraft in a period of seven weeks.

N.Z. 405336 Flight Sergeant David Ronald STEWART, Royal New Zealand Air Force, No. 70 Squadron.

One night in June, 1942, Flight Sergeant Stewart was the captain of an aircraft detailed to attack enemy armoured vehicles and motor transport. After delivering several bombing attacks he dived to a very low altitude and carried out two machine-gun attacks. Flight Sergeant Stewart's aircraft was then hit by machine gun and cannon fire from an enemy fighter. Displaying skilful airmanship he evaded the attacker and, despite the severe damage sustained, flew the aircraft back to base where he made a successful landing with the undercarriage retracted.

1267053 Sergeant George Frederick BEURLING, No. 249 Squadron.

Sergeant Beurling has displayed great skill and courage in the face of the enemy. One day in July, 1942, he engaged a number of enemy fighters which were escorting a formation of Junkers 88's and destroyed one fighter. Later during the same day he engaged 10 enemy fighters and shot two of them down into the sea, bringing his total victories to eight.
