The KING'S MOST Excellent Majesty in Council. His Majesty, in the exercise of the powers conferred on Him by the Metropolitan Police Courts Act, 1840, 3 & 4 Vict. c. 84, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:— I. The Police Court Divisions assigned to the Metropolitan Police Courts at Bow Street and Marl-borough Street shall be altered, and there shall be assigned as Police Court Divisions to the said Metro-politan Police Courts the areas respectively described in the Schedule to this Order. 2. This Order may be cited as the Metropolitan

2. This Order may be cited as the Metropolitan Police Courts (Divisions) Order, 1942, and shall come into operation on the 10th day of August, 1942.

SCHEDULE.

. . . POLICE COURT DIVISIONS. ·

Bow Street Police Court.

To the Bow Street Police Court shall be assigned as a Police Court Division the space included within as a Police Court Division the space included within the following boundary, that is to say, from a point in the middle of the roadway of High Holborn at the south end of Gray's Inn Road and on the boundary of the City of London, southward along the said boundary to the middle of the River Thames; thence westward and then southward up the middle of the River Thames to Westminster Bridge; thence eastward to the north-eastern corner of the said Bridge, across the end of the Bridge, and westward from the south-eastern corner Bridge, and westward from the south-eastern corner thereof to the middle of the Bridge, thus taking in the whole of the Bridge, thence southward and then westward up the middle of the River Thames to Chelsea Bridge; thence northward along the middle of the roadway of the said Bridge and then north-westward along the middle of Chelsea Bridge Road to Ebury Bridge Road; thence north-eastward along the middle of Ebury Bridge Road and of Bucking-ham Palace Road to Grosvenor Gardens; thence northward along the middle of Grosvenor Gardens to the south-western corner of Buckingham Palace Gardens; thence north-westward and then north-eastward along the western boundary of Bucking-ham Palace Gardens and across Constitution Hill to the junction of Constitution Hill and Piccadilly; thence north-westward across Piccadilly to the south-western corner of Apsley House; thence northward Bridge, and westward from the south-eastern corner thence north-westward across Ficcadily to the solution western corner of Apsley House; thence northward and then eastward along the boundary of Apsley House and at the back of No. 145 Piccadilly and Nos. 1 to 5 Hamilton Place to Hamilton Place; and thence north-westward along the west side of Hamilton Place and the eastern boundary of Hyde Park to Mount Street; thence eastward and then

southward along the middle of Mount Street and of the roadway on the north and east of Berkeley Square to Bruton Street; thence north-eastward along the middle of Bruton Street and of Conduit Street to Regent Street; thence south-eastward along the middle of Regent Street to Glasshouse Street; thence eastward along the middle of Glasshouse Street to Brewer Street; thence north-eastward along the middle of Brewer Street to Wardour Street; thence southward along the middle of Wardour Street; thence southward along the middle of Wardour Street; thence northward along the middle of Charing Cross Road; thence north-eastward along cross Road to the centre of St. Giles' Circus; thence eastward along the middle of New Oxford Street and of High Holborn to the aforementioned point in the middle of the roadway of High Holborn on the southward along the middle of Mount Street and of the middle of the roadway of High Helborn on the boundary of the City of London.

Marlborough Street Police Court. To the Marlborough Street Police Court shall be assigned as a Police. Court Division the space in-cluded within the following boundary, that is to say, from a point in the middle of Kensington Road and of Kensington Road and of Kensington Road and of Kensington Palace Gardens; thence northward, along the middle of the roadway of Kensington Palace Gardens to Bayswater. Hill; thence east-ward along the middle of the roadway of Bayswater Hill and the middle of the roadway of Bayswater Hill and the middle of Bayswater Road and of Oxford Street to the centre of Oxford Circus; thence northward along the middle of Regent Street, of Langham Place, of Portland Place and of the eastern part of Park Crescent to Euston Road; thence eastward along the middle of Euston Road; thence eastward along the middle of Old Compton Street to Wardour Street; thence southward along the middle of Tottenham Court Road and of Charing Cross Road to Old Compton Street; thence south-westward along the middle of Old Compton Street to Glasshouse Street to Brewer Street; thence south-westward along the middle of Brewer Street to Conduit Street; thence westward along the middle of Conduit Street to Regent Street; thence north-westward along the middle of Regent Street to Conduit Street; thence south-westward along the middle of Conduit Street; thence northward along the middle of Conduit Street; thence northward along the middle of Glasshouse Street to Regent Street; thence north-westward along the middle of Regent Street to Conduit Street; thence south-westward along the middle of Glasshouse Street to Regent Street; to the east and north of Berkeley Square and along the middle of Mount Street to the eastern boundary of Hyde Park; thence south-eastward along the eastern boundary of Hyde Park and the west side of Hamilton Place to No. 5 Hamilton To the Marlborough Street Police Court shall be boundary of Hyde Park; thence south-eastward along the eastern boundary of Hyde Park and the west side of Hamilton Place to No. 5 Hamilton Place; thence westward and then southward along the boundary at the back of Nos. 5, 4, 3, 2 and I Hamilton Place and No. 145 Piccadilly and of Apsley House to the south-western corner of Apsley House; thence south-eastward across Piccadilly to the south-eastward across Piccadilly to the junction of Piccadilly and Constitution Hill;
