

Duties of Adjudicating Officer.

5. The duties of Adjudicating Officer shall be the following, namely:—

(a) to determine, in accordance with the statutory provisions and any rules, orders or regulations made by the Minister in that behalf, and, subject thereto, in accordance with any regulations made by the Council for the purpose, the nature and amount of relief (if any) to be given to applicants for relief within such classes or falling to be dealt with in such circumstances as the Council shall from time to time authorise;

(b) to make orders for the grant of relief accordingly;

(c) to reconsider periodically, in accordance with any rules, orders or regulations made by the Minister in that behalf, and, subject thereto, in accordance with any regulations made by the Council for the purpose, the cases of persons receiving relief within such classes or falling to be dealt with in such circumstances as the Council shall from time to time authorise, and to make any necessary orders with regard thereto;

(d) to report to the appropriate Committee or Sub-Committee of the Council all orders for relief made by him;

(e) to refer for consideration by the appropriate Committee or Sub-Committee of the Council such of the cases falling to be dealt with by him under this Order as in his opinion should be dealt with by the Committee or Sub-Committee, and also any cases falling within such classes as the Council may from time to time direct;

(f) to refer to the appropriate Committee or Sub-Committee of the Council for review or consideration any case in which a recipient of relief or an applicant for relief asks for reconsideration of the Adjudicating Officer's determination or proposed determination of his case;

(g) to keep Relief Order Books and to make entries therein in accordance with the provisions of Article 22 of the Public Assistance Order, 1930, whenever he considers applications for relief or reconsiders cases in which relief has been granted;

(h) to report to the appropriate Committee or Sub-Committee of the Council all cases in which an application for relief has been refused, or in which on reconsideration relief has been discontinued;

(i) to carry out such other duties relating to or arising out of the grant of relief as may be assigned to him by the Council.

RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

ROADS ACT, 1920.

The Minister of War Transport hereby gives notice under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that he proposes after the expiry of the next forty days from this date in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the Roads Act, 1920, to make Regulations amending the Road Vehicles (Registration and Licensing) Regulations, 1941, to provide that notwithstanding anything contained in Regulation 29 or Regulation 30 of the Regulations where the person keeping a mechanically-propelled vehicle which he has laid up with the intention of not using it for the time being desires to move it from the place where it is then stored for storage in some other place, it shall be lawful for the duration of the present war for the holder of a General Trade Licence or a Limited Trade Licence to use such licence upon the vehicle for the purpose of so moving it.

And Notice is hereby further given that on account of urgency the said Minister has under Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, made the Road Vehicles (Registration and Licensing) (Amendment) Provisional Regulations, 1942, to come into force forthwith as Provisional Regulations and to continue in force until Statutory Rules have been made in accordance with the Provisions of Section 1 of that Act.

The Minister of War Transport has made, "The Regulation of Traffic (Formation of Queues) (No. 2) Order, 1942," to come into force on the 6th September, 1942.

The Minister of War Transport on the 15th August, 1942, made the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acquisition and Disposal of Motor Vehicles (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1942.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him under Section 4 (3) of the Land Drainage Act, 1930, proposes to make an Order confirming a scheme submitted to him by the Caernarvonshire Rivers Catchment Board, under Section 4 (1) (b) of the Act, making provision for the following matters:—

1. The alteration of the boundaries of the Llanfrothen Drainage District.

2. The re-constitution of the Llanfrothen Drainage Board.

3. Certain matters supplemental to the above provisions.

A copy of the draft Order has been deposited, together with a copy of the Scheme and of the map referred to therein, at the Office of the Clerk of the Caernarvonshire Rivers Catchment Board, County Offices, Caernarvon, for public inspection for a period of thirty-one days from the date of this notice and may be inspected during the ordinary hours of business.

Copies of the draft Order, without the map, may be obtained from the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries at the address mentioned below.

Any objection to the draft Order shall be made in writing and sent by post addressed to the Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, within thirty-one days from the date of this notice.

WAR DAMAGE ACT, 1941.

SECTION 7.

The War Damage Commission hereby give notice that they have, for the purpose of giving effect to directions given by the Treasury under sub-section (1) of section 7 of the War Damage Act, 1941, and under the power conferred upon them by sub-section (2) of the said section, specified the following area:—

In the County Borough of Great Yarmouth, the area known as Row area comprising all the hereditaments in the area bounded by the centre line of the following streets:—

On the north—the Conge.

On the east—Market Place and King Street.

On the south—Friars Lane.

On the west—South Quay, Hall Quay and that part of North Quay which lies between Hall Quay and the Conge.

A plan of the said area has been deposited and may be inspected at the Town Hall, Great Yarmouth.

The War Damage Commission also give notice that they, under the power conferred upon them by the aforementioned sub-section, impose on any person, who proposes to execute for making good war damage any works (other than temporary works) in the above specified area, an obligation to inform the War Damage Commission of the proposal, and thereafter to furnish to them such particulars of the proposed works as they may require in any particular case.
