

In this notice a "hereditament" means either a hereditament as appearing in the rating valuation list, or, in the case of a hereditament which is exempt from rating and does not appear in that list, the hereditament so exempted, provided that where there is more than one occupation of a single building, the hereditament shall be the building.

This Notice should be read in conjunction with the Notice which appeared in the London Gazette on the 7th November, 1941. The conjoint effect of these two Notices, is that within the Area now specified, all proposals of works (other than temporary works) should be submitted to the Commission. In the remainder of the area of the County Borough of Great Yarmouth, all works (other than temporary works) costing more than £1,000 or ten times the net annual value, whichever is the less, should likewise be submitted to the Commission.
