THE AIR EFFICIENCY AWARD.

ROYAL WARRANT.

GEORGE R.I. GEORGE THE SIXTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India; To all to whom these Presents shall come. Greeting.

We Whereas are desirous of signifying Our Appreciation of long and meritorious service in Our Auxiliary and Volunteer Air Forces;

We do hereby for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, institute and create a medal to be available for officers Institute and create a medan to be available to oncers and airmen and to be designated the "Air Efficiency Award"; And We do hereby direct that the following regulations shall govern the said award:— I. Description.—The Air Efficiency Award shall

be in silver.

2. Ribbon.-The award shall be worn on the left breast pendent from a ribbon of one inch and a half in width which shall be in colour green with two central stripes of pale blue, one-eighth of an inch in width

3. Miniatures.-Reproductions in miniature, which may be worn on certain occasions by those on whom

may be worn on certain occasions by those on whom this award is conferred, shall be approximately half the size of the award and a sealed pattern of the miniature award shall, be kept in the Central Chancery of Our Orders of Knighthood. 4. Eligibility (Royalty).—The award may be worn by Us, Our Heirs and Successors, Kings and Queens Regnant of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, and it shall be com-petent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, to confer at Our pleasure the award upon any Princes of the blood Royal. 5. Eligibility (general).—The award may be con-ferred on officers and airmen of any Auxiliary or Volunteer Air Force raised in Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Our Indian

Volunteer Air Force raised in Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Our Indian Empire, Burma, any of Our Colonies or a territory under Our protection; or within any other part of Our Dominions Our Government whereof shall so desire or within any territory under Our protection administered by Us in such Government. 6. Service required.—The period of service requisite for the award shall be ten years' qualifying service (as defined in the regulations hereinafter mentioned) and shall include not less than five years' actual

and shall include not less than five years' actual service (as defined in the regulations hereinafter mentioned) in an Auxiliary or Volunteer Air Force. 7. Publication and registration.—The names of those upon whom the award is conferred shall be publied and a meriter herei in the substant

published and a register kept in the manner pre-scribed in the regulations hereinafter mentioned.

8. Forfeiture and restoration.—It shall be com-petent for Our Air Council in regard to Our Auxiliary Air Force and Our Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, or for the Governors-General, Governors or Officers administering the Government, as the case may be, in regard to the Auxiliary or Volunteer Air may be, in regard to the Auxiliary or Volunteer Air Forces of Our respective Dominions, Colonies or territories under Our protection, or for our Viceroy in regard to the Auxiliary or Volunteer Air Forces in India, or for the Governor in regard to the Auxiliary or Volunteer Air Forces in Burma, to cancel and annul the conferment of the award on any person and also to restore a forfeited award under the conditions laid down in the regulations hereinafter mentioned mentioned

9. Further regulations.—The award shall be con-ferred under such regulations as to grant, forfeiture, ferred under such regulations as to grant, forfeiture, restoration and other matters, in amplification of these Our regulations as may, with Our approval be issued from time to time by Our Air Council in regard to Our Auxiliary Air Force and Our Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, or by the Governors-General, Governors or Officers administering the Government, as the case may be, in regard to the Auxiliary or Volunteer Reserve Air Forces of Our respective Dominions, Colonies or territories under Our pro-tection, or by Our Viceroy in regard to the Auxiliary or Volunteer Reserve Air Forces in India or by the Governor in regard to the Auxiliary or Volunteer Reserve Air Forces in India or by the Governor in regard to the Auxiliary or Volunteer Reserve Air Forces in Burna. 10. Annulment, etc., of regulations.—We reserve

10. Annulment, etc., of regulations.—We reserve to Ourself, Our Heirs and Successors, full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, inter-preting, or dispensing with these regulations or any part thereof by a notification under Our Sign Manual.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy :—

#### Distinguished Service Order.

Wing Commander Peter Russell WALKER, D.F.C.

(37435). This officer has completed numerous sorties since April, 1942. By his meticulous plan-ning and forethought, combined with his great skill and tenactiy in action, he has won the complete confidence of his fellow pilots. In the recent Dieppe operations, Wing Commander Walker led

formations of aircraft on 2 sorties. Throughout his operational career, he has displayed the highest standard of devotion to duty. He has destroyed 8 enemy aircraft.

Acting Wing Commander Francis David Stephen SCOTT-MALDEN, D.F.C. (74690), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve.

Volunteer Reserve. During the past 6 months, this officer has led his wing on a large number of sorties. In this period, the wing has destroyed 49 enemy aircraft and probably destroyed and damaged many others. During the combined operations at Dieppe on the 19th August, 1942, the wing completed a large number of sorties; 21 enemy aircraft were destroyed, and many others damaged. Wing Commander Scott-Malden led the wing on 3 of these sorties. The splendid success achieved on this and other occasions is largely attributable to the magnificent leadership displayed by Wing Commander Scott-Malden. He is a brilliant pilot and a fine tactician, whose thorough knowledge and personal example have proved worthy of the highest praise. highest praise.

Squadron Leader Wilfrid George Gerald Duncan SMITH, D.F.C. (85684), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 64 Squadron.

Reserve, No. 04 Squadron. Since being awarded a Bar to the Distinguished Flying Cross, this officer has completed a great number of sorties. He is a brilliant pilot and a fine leader whose skill has proved a source' of inspiration to all. Squadron Leader Smith has destroyed to and probably destroyed several other enemy aircraft enemy aircraft.

Acting Squadron Leader Chesley Gordon PETERSON, D.F.C. (83706), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 71 (Eagle) Squadron.

This officer has completed a large number of sorties over enemy-occupied territory. He has at all times displayed high qualities of leadership and, courage which have contributed materially to the fine fighting efficiency of his squadron. During the operations over Dieppe, Squadron Leader Peterson destroyed a Junkers 88, bringing his victories to 6. His devotion to duty has been outstanding.

Acting Squadron Leader Rhys Henry THOMAS, D.F.C. (83282), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 129 (Mysore) Squadron. Since being awarded the Distinguished Flying

Cross this officer has completed many sorties over enemy territory. He is a fine leader and a tenacious fighter. In June, 1942, whilst escorting a force of bombers from an attack on Le Havre, his skilful tactics frustrated the efforts of 12 Focke Wulfe 190s to engage the bombers. In the ensuing engagement, 3 of the enemy's aircraft were destroyed without loss. In August, 1942, he led a daring and determined attack on a number led a daring and determined attack on a number of enemy float planes which were destroyed despite the presence of enemy fighters. The next despite the presence of enemy ngiters. The next day, in low-level attacks on certain positions during the combined operations on Dieppe, Squadron Leader Thomas's magnificent work won the admiration of the attacking forces. This officer is an outstanding squadron commander, whose great skill and faultless judgment have con-tributed materially to the many successes achieved by his squadron by his squadron.

Bar to Distinguished Flying Cross.

Bar to Distinguished Flying Cross. Flight Lieutenant Gregory Augustus DAYMOND, D.F.C. (84657), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 71 (Eagle) Squadron. Since being awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross, this officer has completed many sorties over enemy territory. He has always led his flight with great skill and courage and has destroyed 7 enemy aircraft. In the recent Dieppe operations, Flight Lieutenant Daymond flew with distinction.

#### Distinguished Flying Cross.

Wing Commander Michael George Foster PEDLEY (37328), No. 131 Squadron. Within the past 3 months, this officer has participated in 38 operational missions, including shipping reconnaissances. During the combined simpping reconnaissances. During the combined operations at Dieppe on the 19th August, 1942, he displayed great keenness and a fine fighting spirit. In the evening, when the enemy attempted an air attack in the vicinity of one of our aerodromes, they were intercepted by the squadron led by Wing Commander Pedley; at 'least 2 enemy bombers were destroyed. This officer is a squadron commander of outstanding ability. squadron commander of outstanding ability.

Squadron Leader Clarke John FEE (Can/C.773), Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 412 (R.C.A.F.) Squadron.

Squadron. This officer is a fine pilot and a skilful leader. By his outstanding ability he has been mainly responsible for the high standard of fighting efficiency of the squadron he commands. He has completed a large number of sorties, including some during the combined operation at Dieppe. Squadron Leader Fee has at all times set a most inspiring example inspiring example.

Acting Squadron Leader Robert Wilson IREDALE (Aus.400590), Royal Australian Air Force, No. 114 Squadron.

Flying Officer John Lefroy McCAUL (Can/J. 5078), Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 114 Squadron. One night in July, 1942, Squadron Leader Iredale and Flying Officer McCaul were pilot and Iredale and Flying Officer McCaul were pilot and navigator respectively of an aircraft detailed to attack an enemy airfield. Whilst over the target area, intensive 'searchlight activity and anti-aircraft fire was encountered. Squadron Leader Iredale defied the opposition and bombed the aerodrome, obtaining hits on the runway in use. He then succeeded in escaping from the fire zone, flying at only 50 feet. Throughout the operation, Squadron Leader Iredale was greatly assisted by Flying Officer McCaul, whose accurate navigation in the face of great difficulties was of the highest order. Both these officers displayed great courage and determination. and determination.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Phillip Leslie Irving ARCHER (Can/J.3508), Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 416 (R.C.A.F.) Squadron. This officer has completed a large number of sorties over enemy territory and has destroyed at least 4 enemy aircraft. On one occasion, although wounded in the leg, Flight Lieutenant Archer flew his badly damaged aircraft back to base where he executed a skilful landing. He is a most efficient leader. most efficient leader.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Frederick Ernest GREEN (Can/J.15071), Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 412 (R.C.A.F.) Squadron. This officer has participated in numerous sorties over enemy territory and has destroyed at least 3 enemy aircraft. During the combined operations at Dieppe, he completed 3 sorties, 2 of which were low-level escort duties. Flight Lieutenant Green has invariably displayed high skill and great determination. determination

Acting Flight Lieutenant William Gregson (103520). Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 124 Squadron.

This officer has participated in a large number of sorties, including 4 executed in the combined operations at Dieppe when he led his flight with skill and courage. He has at all times set a splendid example. Flight Lieutenant Gregson has destroyed 1 and damaged a further 2 enemy aircraft aircraft.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Raymond Hiley HARRIES (87447), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, (87447), Royal A No. 131 Squadron.

No. 131 Squaron. This officer, who has completed numerous sorties, is an excellent flight commander. He has spared no effort in the training of his pilots, amongst whom he has fostered a fine team spirit. He has destroyed I and assisted in the destruction of 2 more enemy aircraft.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Anthony Tennant LEANING (89323), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve,

(89323), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 39 Squadron. This officer has performed excellent work in attacks on enemy shipping. In March, 1942; he participated in an attack on a convoy of merchant participated in an attack on a convoy of merchant vessels, escorted by naval units. Several hits were obtained on one of the naval vessels. Following the action, Flight Lieutenant Leaning became detached from his section. His aircraft was attacked by several hostile aircraft but he met them with resolute fire until they broke away. In April, 1942, he took part in another attack on a convoy. Undaunted, Flight Lieutenant Leaning flew in through a con-tinuous attack, released his missile and fought off the fighters to get clear of the target area. This officer is a gallant and resolute pilot whose keen-ness has set an example worthy of the highest praise.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Frederick Wooldridge LISTER (112404), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 43 Squadron. During the combined operations at Dieppe this

officer skilfully led his sections at Dreppe this officer skilfully led his section on 4 low-level sorties against the enemy. On the first of these, his aircraft was badly damaged by enemy fire but he flew it back to his base and executed a skilful landing. Throughout the operations he set a splendid example. Flight Lieutenant Lister has destroying a Lunders 88 destroyed a Junkers 88.

Acting Flight Lieutenant James Elmslee WALKER (Can/J.3199), Royal Canadián Air Force, No. 81

Squadron. This officer is a determined and skilful pilot. He has at all times shown a keen desire to engage the enemy. While serving in Russia, Flight Lieutenant Walker destroyed one hostile aircraft. Since March, 1942, he has led his flight con-tinuously in all its operations.

Pilot Officer Michael Plaistowe KILBURN (116807), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 124

Squadron. This officer has participated in a large number of operational sorties. During the recent Dieppe operations, Pilot Officer Kilburn participated in 4 sorties. He is a skilful pilot, and has destroyed at least 2 and damaged several more hostile aircraft.

Pilot Officer John William WILLIAMS (Can/J.15604), Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 249 Squadron. This officer has fought the enemy with great determination. Within a short period he has destroyed at least 4 enemy aircraft, 2 of which he shot down in one day. Later, his aircraft was damaged by enemy fire but he flew it safely to base. His courageous example has been most inspiring inspiring.

#### Distinguished Flying Medal.

us.404935 Flight Sergeant Joseph Elliott ELLIOTT, Royal Australian Air Force. One night in July, 1942, this airman was captain of an aircraft detailed to attack Dusseldorf. On the outward journey, his aircraft was intercepted by 2 enemy fighters whose pilots attacked simultaneously; one from dead ahead and the other from the rear. In the ensuing combat, Flight Sergeant Elliott, by skilful tactics, enabled bis gumers to destroy one of the attackers and his gunners to destroy one of the attackers and drive off the other one. Although his aircraft drive off the other one. Although his aircraft sustained some damage, he flew on, reached his target and bombed it. In this, his first operational sortie, Flight Sergeant Elliott displayed courage and determination of a high order.

1058645 Flight Sergeant John METCALF, No. 108 Squadron.

Squadron. This airman was the pilot of an aircraft detailed for a sortie in the El Darba area one night in July, 1942. On the return journey, after his objective had been bombed successfully his aircraft was intercepted by a Junkers 88. The enemy's opening fire inflicted some damage and, whilst Sergeant Metcalf was taking avoiding action his aircraft was again hit; this time in the fuselage, port wing and the rear turret. Both aircraft had lost some height and, to avoid further attacks, Sergeant Metcalf decided to make a violent dive. Sergeant Metcalf decided to make a violent dive. In the early stages of the dive, the rudder control was damaged by the enemy's fire and rendered almost immovable, but Sergeant Metcalf succeeded in pulling the aircraft out of its dive at a low altitude. Immediately, two vivid yellow flashes were observed directly below him and it is believed that there mere any directly be attached by the attached by the were observed directly below him and it is believed that they were caused by the attacking aircraft striking the ground. Handing over the controls to his second pilot, Sergeant Metcalf then rendered first aid to his wounded wireless operator. Eventually, the aircraft was flown to a base and a skilful landing was effected. In the face of harassing circumstances, this airman displayed high courage and skill. high courage and skill.

Aus.404949 Sergeant Edward Keith Forbes BRASHER Royal Australian Air Force, No. 460 (R.A.A.F.) Squadron.

One night in August, 1942, this airman captained an aircraft which attacked Dusseldorf. this airman On the outward flight, when some 40 miles from the target, his aircraft was attacked by a hostile aircraft and sustained damage to the tailplane. Despite this, Sergeant Brasher pressed on and bombed his objective. Shortly after leaving the target area, his aircraft was attacked by a Junkers

88. Further damage was sustained and the wireless operator was wounded. Sergeant Brasher, less operator was wounded. Segeant Diasner, skilfully manoeuvring his aircraft, enabled his rear gunner to fire an effective burst at the attacker, which caused it to break away enveloped in flames. Sergeant Brasher flew his damaged aircraft safely to base. Throughout, he displayed great courage and determination to complete his mission. and determination to complete his mission.
