WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 18th day of September, 1942 (N.726/42), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Orders in Council bearing date the 5th day of May, 1939, and the 8th day of September, 1939, to approve conditions of service for ratings and Warrant Officers of the Flying Branch of Your Majesty's Fleet:

"And whereas we consider it necessary to make certain improvements in the conditions of service of personnel of the Flying Branch, namely, to increase the pay of Acting Rating Observers, and of Air Gunners, and to improve the prospects of promotion of Air Gunners to Warrant rank and above, and to change the titles:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the proposals set forth in the annexed Schedule.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

"Schedule

"(i) From 14th September, 1940, the pay for the non-substantive rating of Acting Rating Observer to be at the rate of 4s. 6d. a day, instead of 3s. 6d. a day as formerly:

"(ii) From 14th September, 1940, the allowance payable to ratings undergoing training for Air Gunner, for ascent in aircraft during training, to be 1s. a day continuously during Part II of the course, instead of for each day of ascent during the course, as formerly:

"(iii) From 1st July, 1942, the title of Air Gunner to be changed to Telegraphist Air Gunner, and the rates of non-substantive pay for Telegraphist Air Gunners to be:—

"Telegraphist Air Gunner 3rd Class 3s. 3d. a day.

"Telegraphist Air Gunner 2nd Class 3s. 9d. a day.

"Telegraphist Air Gunner 1st Class 4s. 3d. a day.

"(iv) The titles of Warrant Pilots and above and Warrant Observers and above to be changed to the following:—

"(v) Telegraphist Air Gunners to be eligible for advancement to Warrant rank and above with the titles:—

"Warrant Air Officer (A.G.) Commissioned Air Officer (A.G.) Lieutenant (A).

"The conditions of service of Warrant Air Officers (A.G.) and above to be the same as those applicable to Warrant Air Officers (O) and above."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Your Order in Council dated the 24th day of July, 1940, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to sanction the institution of a separate branch of Your Majesty's Navy called the Coding Branch:

"And whereas we consider that the need for a Petty Officer grade in the Coding Branch has been established:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the institution of the grade of Petty Officer Coder at the rate of pay already in

force in the Signal and Telegraphist Branches, viz. 6s. 6d. per day, with the usual increments after three and six years' service as Petty Officer Coder, such ratings not to be eligible for non-substantive pay.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in the above proposal."

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas, for the better administration of the ratings employed on the maintenance and repair of W/T and R.D.F. equipment, hitherto belonging to the Wireless Mechanic Branch and the W/T and D/F sections of the Air Fitter Branch, it is now necessary for them to serve in one branch and under similar conditions:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the institution of a new branch of naval ratings to be called Radio Mechanics, with effect from 1st April, 1942, and with titles and rates of pay and conditions as shown in the annexed Schedule.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 8th

day of October, 1942, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for apportioning the income of the United Benefice of Westminster, Saint Anne, Soho (hereinafter called 'the said united benefice') in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London between that Benefice and six other Benefices, namely, the Benefices of Hendon, Saint Alphage; Isleworth, Saint Francis; Kenton, Saint Mary the Virgin; Southgate, Saint Michael at Bowes; and Stoke Newington Common, Saint Michael and All Angels, all in the said County and in the said Diocese; and Wisborough Green in the County of Sussex and in the diocese of Chichester (which six benefices are hereinafter called 'the six Benefices aforesaid'):

"Whereas the Bishop of London is in right of his See Patron of the said United Benefice and of each of the six Benefices aforesaid:

"And whereas the said United Benefice is now vacant:

"And whereas the endowments of the said United Benefice include certain glebe lands with the messuages or tenements thereon known as Numbers 61 and 63, Shaftesbury Avenue and Numbers 65, 67, 69, 71 and 73, Shaftesbury Avenue, both in the City of Westminster, which said lands are let under leases granted in 1901 and 1899 for original terms of 999 years subject to rents of £158 per annum and £465 per annum respectively:

"Now, therefore, with the consents (testified by their execution of this Scheme) of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Archbishop of Canterbury, acting as Archbishop of the Province within which the United Benefice of Westminster, Saint Anne, Soho, and each of the said six Benefices aforesaid are situate and of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Geoffrey, Bishop of London, acting as such Bishop and also as Patron as aforesaid, and of the Right Reverend George Kennedy Allen, Bishop of Chichester, acting as Bishop of the Diocese in which the Benefice of Wisborough Green is situate, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the annual sum of £500 shall be distributed by the Incumbent out of the income of the said United Benefice among the Incumbents of the six Benefices aforesaid in the shares stated in the Schedule hereto, one quarter of each such share to be paid within twenty-one days after the receipt by the incumbent of the preceding quarter's rents in respect of the glebe lands hereinbefore described and if not so paid to be recoverable by the person or persons hereunder entitled thereto by action against the incumbent for debt:

"Provided that the first payment shall be a proportion only of the full quarterly instalment in each case calculated from the date on which this scheme becomes effectual in law to the quarter-day next following:

"Provided further that if the total amount of the annual rents due and payable in respect of the glebe lands hereinbefore described be at any time reduced below £623, then from the date from which the reduction becomes operative and for so long as it continues legally binding on the Incumbent of the said United Benefice, the annual sum of £500 shall be abated by the amount up to £500 of the reduction, and each share thereof shall be abated proportionately for the like period.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within the Archdeaconry of Doncaster and the Archdeaconry of Sheffield, both in the Diocese of Sheffield:

"Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within the said Archdeaconries of Doncaster and Sheffield are desirable and should be carried into effect and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, first, the Parishes of Elsecar; (St. Peter) Nether Hoyland; St. Andrew, Nether Hoyland; Worsborough; St. James, Worsborough Bridge; St. Luke, Worsborough Common, and St. Thomas, Worsborough Dale, shall be transferred from the said Archdeaconry of

Doncaster and the Rural Deanery of Wath to the Archdeaconry of Sheffield and shall be included in a new Rural Deanery as hereinafter mentioned, secondly, the Rural Deanery of Sheffield and the Rural Deanery of Handsworth in the said Archdeaconry of Sheffield shall be abolished, thirdly, five new Rural Deaneries shall be formed within the said Archdeaconry of Sheffield and shall be called respectively 'The Rural Deanery of Attercliffe', 'The Rural Deanery of Ecclesall', 'The Rural Deanery of Hallam', 'The Rural Deanery of Laughton' and 'The Rural Deanery of Tankersley', and, fourthly, the said Archdeaconry of Sheffield shall comprise and consist of the seven Rural Deaneries named in the Schedule to this Scheme and such Rural Deaneries shall each comprise the Parishes or Cures, the names whereof are set down in order under its name in the said Schedule, including, in the case of the Rural Deanery of Tankersley, the seven Parishes transferred as hereinbefore mentioned from the Rural Deanery of Wath in the said Archdeaconry of Doncaster, and each of the Parishes or Cures transferred as hereinbefore mentioned or set down in the said Schedule shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the Rural Deanery and of the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry to which it is hereby transferred or under which it is set down in the said Schedule as the case may be and shall not belong to or be a part of any other Rural Deanery or Archdeaconry, nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean or of any other Archdeacon.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of *Fridaythorpe* and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of *Thixendale* both of which Benefices are situate in the County and in the Diocese of *York*:

Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend *William*, Archbishop of *York*, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of *Fridaythorpe* and *Thixendale* duly made their Report to the said Archbishop of *York* and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Archbishop of *York* signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report, but with the assent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend *Cyril*, now Archbishop of *York*, embodies certain modifications thereof:

And whereas both of the said Benefices are at present vacant:

Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said *Cyril*, Archbishop of *York* (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

1. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the *London Gazette* the said Benefice of *Fridaythorpe* and the said Benefice of *Thixendale* shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of *Fridaythorpe* with *Thixendale*' but that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

2. That upon the said union taking effect the *Parsonage House* at present belonging to the said Benefice of *Fridaythorpe* shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

3. That upon the said union taking effect and for so long as the Archbishop of *York* shall deem necessary, provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for the employment of a Curate or for obtaining such other clerical or lay assistance as the Archbishop of *York* may from time to time direct; and a portion of the endowment of the United Benefice, namely, an annual payment of £200 now made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the said Benefice of *Thixendale* or such lesser sum as the Archbishop of *York* may from time to time direct, shall for so long as necessary be appropriated by us as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of a Curate or other clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid and shall be paid by us to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purposes aforesaid.

4. That in the event of the Archbishop of *York* certifying in writing to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that it is no longer necessary that provision should be made for obtaining the services of a Curate or other clerical or lay assistance, the appropriation of the said annual payment of £200 or any lesser sum as aforesaid out of the endowment of the United Benefice shall thereupon cease and determine.

5. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of *Fridaythorpe* having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be

made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said Benefice of *Thixendale* having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the *London Gazette*.
