Hamburgh, Febr. 19. Very little Progress has hitherto been made in the Negociation for accommodating the Differences between the King of Denmark and the Duke of Holftein, the Danish Michael and the Court of the State of State nisters still insisting, that the demolishing of the Duke's new-built Forts be agreed upon as a Preliminary Article, before they proceed to the fur-ther adjusting of this Matter; This the Duke of Holstein seems resolved not to consent to; and some of the Mediators themselves have expressed their Dislike of it, by declaring they would look upon that Side as the Aggressor who should reject the Project of a Preliminary Treaty they drew up some time ago, the foundation of which is, That all Things should remain in the condition they are in at present, while the main Treaty is Negociating. In the mean time our Letters from Copenhagen fay, the King of Denmark's Ministers are frequently in Conference with Monsieur Viereck, who relides there on the part of the Elector of Brandenburgh, and with the Suedish Mini-fler at that Court, upon the Affairs of Halfein, and that divers Expresses have lately been sent from thence to the Courts of Sweden and Brandenburgh, from which 'tis conjectured, the adjusting of these Differences is negociating there. However these Advices add, that the Preparations in those Parts both at Sea and Land are continued with great diligence; And we have the like Account from Sueden, the Letters from thence advising, that new Levies are making in that Kingdom, and that a flout Squadron is fitting out at Carelferoon, which will put to Sea very early in the Spring under the Command of Admiral Scioblas. The King of Sueden has made Vice Admiral Resemvelt an Admiral, and Captain Siosterne Vice-Admiral. They write from the Dutchy of Holftein, that all things there continue very quiet, the Weather being so bad, and the ways so much spoiled by the great Rains, that the Danish Forces can have no thoughts of attempting any thing at present. They write from Hanouer, that the Elector of Hanouer was gone from thence to Cell to confer with the Duke of Cell; but would return in a very fhort time.
