CENTRAL CHANCERY OF THE ORDERS OF KNIGHTHOOD.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following appointments to the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire:—

To be Additional Members of the Military Division of the said Most Excellent Order:—

Acting Flight Lieutenant Edgar Bernard Richard Lockwood (89584), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve.

One night in July, 1942, a Wellington aircraft returned from a cross-country flight with one engine defective. Whilst circling the aerodrome the faulty engine stopped and the pilot proceeded to make an emergency landing. As the flare path was already in use by another aircraft which was also landing, the pilot of the Wellington decided to land on the port side but in so doing he over-shot the space available and ran into a building situated on the edge of the aerodrome. The aircraft and the building immediately caught fire. All the members of the crew were thrown clear with the exception of the wireless operator/air gunner who was ejected on to the roof of the building which was soon burning fiercely. Flight Lieutenant Lockwood, displaying initiative and complete disregard for his own safety, made his way on to the roof by kicking out the window panes of a door. He found the injured airman and then, carrying him in his arms, jumped from the roof only a few seconds before it collapsed. Flight Lieutenant Lockwood's gallant action undoubtedly saved the airman's life.

Pilot Officer Brian Anthony Coleborn (Aus.402186), Royal Australian Air Force.

Pilot Officer Coleborn was the observer of an aircraft which crashed in flames after being attacked by enemy fighters. Two members of the crew were wounded. Pilot Officer Coleborn assisted them to get clear of the wreckage and in so doing, he himself was badly burned. Nevertheless, displaying great courage and determination he walked for 30 hours, although without water, across the desert. He then gave accurate information as to the location of the aircraft which resulted in the subsequent rescue of the remainder of the crew. The steady courage and endurance of this officer undoubtedly saved the lives of his comrades.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the George Medal to the under-mentioned:—

816047 Sergeant James Reynolds, Auxiliary Air Force.

Sergeant Reynolds, who is employed in a technical capacity, was on duty in the flight office one day in July, 1942, when a Hudson aircraft crashed in flames some 400 yards away. Sergeant Reynolds was first to arrive at the scene of the crash. Displaying complete disregard for his own safety he made his way straight into the flames and plunged through a door in the wrecked fuselage in an attempt to rescue the crew inside. The ammunition was exploding in all directions and, just as he reached the turret, a violent explosion occurred which threw him out of the aircraft. He was found lying blinded in the midst of the burning debris and narrowly missed being run over by a fire tender. He recovered his sight two days later. Sergeant Reynolds displayed courage and devotion to duty of a very high standard and set a magnificent example. All the crew of the aircraft were, unfortunately, killed in the crash.

Aus.6012 Sergeant Raymond Gordon Wheatley, Royal Australian Air Force.

During an air attack on the Royal Australian Air Force Station at Sembawang, a hanger was hit by bombs and set on fire. Sergeant Wheatley took charge of the area and succeeded in removing 3 Buffalo aircraft to safety. The work was completed despite the grave danger which existed owing to the explosion of considerable quantities of ammunition and fuel stores. On another occasion at Palembang, 2 Blenheim aircraft crashed on the runway, one of them bursting into flames. Sergeant Wheatley succeeded in removing to safety 3 occupants of the second aircraft which was only a short distance from the one on fire. Bombs from the burning aircraft demolished both aircraft just as Sergeant Wheatley was removing the last occupant. On these and many other occasions, this airman displayed great courage, determination and leadership.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the British Empire Medal (Military Division), to:—

Can.R.101827 Sergeant Karl Edward Dzikowski, Royal Canadian Air Force.

This airman was the wireless operator/air gunner of a Ventura aircraft which crashed one day in July, 1942. Sergeant Dzikowski, although badly burned, returned to the aircraft and extricated another member of the crew. He dragged him 15 feet from the wreckage and then collapsed. Sergeant Dzikowski sustained further burns whilst performing this gallant rescue.

ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Group Captain Donald Leslie THOMSON.

Group Captain Thomson has participated recently in several bombing sorties, all of which were successful. He is a most inspiring leader whose skill has contributed materially to the high standard of efficiency of the unit which he commands.

Wing Commander Howard Bertram JOHNSON (37182) No. 210 Squadron.

This officer was the second pilot of a Catalina aircraft which was attacked by a Junkers 88 whilst flying in the Arctic Ocean. In the engagement, the captain was killed but Wing Commander Johnson assumed control and flew the aircraft back to the coast where he effected a safe landing in difficult circumstances. Throughout, he displayed excellent leadership.

Wing Commander Grant Moore LINDEMAN (37302) No. 455 (R.A.A.F.) Squadron.

This officer displayed great leadership during recent operations in North Russia. The high morale of his squadron in the face of bad weather and enemy opposition can be largely attributed to this officer's fine example.

Wing Commander James McLAUGHLIN (36068) No. 144 Squadron.

During recent operations in North Russia, this officer displayed outstanding leadership and efficiency. In the face of adverse weather and enemy opposition, his fine example inspired his fellow pilots.

Acting Squadron Leader Peter Lawson CALDWELL (85651) Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve. No. 418 (R.C.A.F.) Squadron.

This officer has completed numerous operational sorties, many of them at night. Besides gaining success in defensive patrols Squadron Leader Caldwell has proved himself to be a determined intruder pilot whose skill has been reflected in the work of the flight which he commands. He destroyed 1 enemy aircraft while engaged on defensive patrol duties.

Flight Lieutenant Edward Armytage FAIRHURST (43547).

During operations in North Russia, this officer displayed great organising ability and leadership. His cheerful acceptance of the most hazardous tasks contributed materially to the high morale and efficiency of his unit.

Flight Lieutenant Beric LEWIN (40720), No. 210 Squadron.

During recent operations in North Russia, this officer completed many hours operational flying. Throughout, his devotion to duty was outstanding. On one occasion he completed a hazardous sortie of over 20 hours duration. Within 24 hours, he was again in the air on a similar sortie. His aircraft was attacked by an enemy fighter but Flight Lieutenant Lewin skilfully drove it off. Although his own aircraft was damaged, he flew it safely to base. The next day, he was again engaged on a hazardous operational mission.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Robin Lewes HANSON (88666), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve.

In September, 1942, this officer was the pilot of an aircraft detailed to undertake an anti-submarine sweep over a convoy which was being attacked by U-boats. Adverse weather prevailed but in spite of this Flight Lieutenant Hanson located the convoy and observed 5 U-boats which he attacked with bombs and machine-gun fire. In his first attack, on a surfaced U-boat travelling at high speed in the wake of the convoy, Flight Lieutenant Hanson achieved complete surprise and straddled it with bombs. When his bombs were all released, he continued to attack with machine-gun fire, forcing the remaining U-boats to submerge and cease their attack. This officer has always displayed great skill and determination.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Alexander Kenneth Stebbing McCURDY (82683), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 18 Squadron.

This officer has completed a large number of sorties both by day and by night. He has displayed a high standard of operational efficiency

and has always endeavoured to press home his attacks whatever the opposition. On one occasion, when detailed to attack an enemy aerodrome at night, he achieved much success. Aerodrome buildings were bombed and machine-gunned; one bomb exploded near an enemy aircraft which had just landed. His skill and gallantry have set a praiseworthy example.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Gilbert George POTIER (61244), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 210 Squadron.

This officer has completed over 900 hours operational flying. During the past two months, his work has been exceptional. In operations in North Russia he completed many sorties, three of them in hazardous circumstances. On one occasion, during a convoy escort, his attacks forced 2 U-boats to submerge. He subsequently directed surface craft in action against them, with great efficiency. His outstanding ability and good leadership have set a praiseworthy example.

Flying Officer Arthur Henry Burr BURR (66513), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve.

In September, 1942, 15 enemy aircraft attempted an attack on a convoy voyaging in the Arctic Ocean, Flying Officer Burr, whose aircraft was launched by catapult from the deck of one of the ships, engaged the enemy force with great skill and daring. Despite the odds, he destroyed one of the attackers and drove the others off. After ensuring that the enemy had abandoned their attack, Flying Officer Burr set course for land and reached an aerodrome with only a few gallons of petrol left in the tanks. This officer, who has always completed his tasks with similar determination, displayed great courage and devotion to duty throughout.

Flying Officer Hugh Graham Stanhope WYRILL (89626), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 255 Squadron.

This officer has displayed great keenness and devotion to duty in night-flying operations. He has destroyed 2 enemy aircraft. He has set a most praiseworthy example.

Pilot Officer James GRANT (49543), No. 18 Squadron.

As wireless operator/air gunner this officer has participated in numerous operational missions. On one occasion in June, 1942, during an intruder sortie over an enemy aerodrome, his skilful work was of the greatest assistance to his pilot and contributed materially to the success of the operation. On another occasion, during an air sea rescue sortie, his outstanding wireless skill was largely responsible for the success achieved. Throughout his operational career, this officer has displayed great courage and devotion to duty.

Pilot Officer Charles William PALMER (Can/J.15818), Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 405 (R.C.A.F.) Squadron.

This officer has participated in many operational missions. One night in October, 1942, he captained an aircraft detailed to attack Flensburg. In spite of intense searchlight activity over the target area, Pilot Officer Palmer pressed home his attack from a low level. After his bombs were released he dived and enabled his gunners to machine-gun searchlights, several of which were damaged. On the return journey, he flew on at a low altitude to allow his gunners to fire at a variety of ground targets. This officer has at all times displayed skill and gallantry in the execution of his tasks.

Pilot Officer Geoffrey SILVA (Aus.402258), Royal Australian Air Force.

In July, 1942, this officer captained an aircraft detailed to attack Dusseldorf. Whilst over the target area, the aircraft was hit by anti-aircraft fire. The wireless operator was wounded and the rear turret was damaged. Despite this, the attack was pressed home and the target bombed successfully. Shortly after leaving the objective the aircraft was intercepted by an enemy fighter, fire from which caused much damage. In most hazardous circumstances Pilot Officer Silva displayed courage and fortitude in keeping with the highest traditions of the Royal Air Force.

Warrant Officer John Frederick POTTER (580808), No. 23 Squadron.

Warrant Officer Potter is a most efficient member of aircraft crew. As navigator of a bomber aircraft he has participated in numerous attacks on important targets in Germany and in the

Middle East. Latterly, he has completed a large number of intruder sorties during which his brilliant navigation has contributed materially to the successes achieved. He has at all times displayed courage and determination and has won the complete confidence of all with whom he has flown.

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Lieutenant Donald Pax TILLEY (102179), South African Air Force, No. 39 Squadron.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

1375076 Sergeant Wilfred Carter STEPHENS, No. 39 Squadron.

One night in September, 1942, Lieutenant Tilley and Sergeant Stephens were pilot and navigator respectively of an aircraft detailed to attack an enemy merchant vessel escorted by 4 destroyers. Skillfully guided to the target, by Sergeant Stephens, in bad weather, Lieutenant Tilley attacked the merchant vessel with great resolution. It was later discovered that the ship had been hit and had returned to port. This pilot and navigator have completed several attacks on enemy shipping and both have displayed great skill and courage in the performance of their duties.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

N.Z. 40607 Flight Sergeant Colin Leo Malcolm FORSYTH, Royal New Zealand Air Force, No. 418 (R.C.A.F.) Squadron.

Flight Sergeant Forsyth has participated in numerous sorties. He is an outstanding air gunner, while his wireless skill has proved of the greatest assistance to his pilot. He has at all times displayed courage and determination in the performance of his duties.

Aus. 403378 Flight Sergeant Alan Vickory RITCHIE, Royal Australian Air Force, No. 150 Squadron.

This airman is a navigator of high merit. He has participated in many sorties and has always displayed great skill in reaching his allotted target. On one occasion, when returning from an attack on Mainz, his aircraft was attacked by enemy fighters and badly damaged. The rear gunner was killed and the wireless operator wounded. In the face of trying circumstances, Flight Sergeant Ritchie's subsequent navigation was of the greatest assistance to his pilot who was thus enabled to fly the damaged aircraft back to this country. On another occasion, Flight Sergeant Ritchie was wounded in the shoulder by a piece of shrapnel. Despite this he continued to navigate his aircraft on its course for base. His great courage and devotion to duty have set a splendid example.

973558 Flight Sergeant John WILLIAMS, No. 255 Squadron.

This airman is a skilful observer. His excellent work has contributed in a large measure to the destruction of 1 enemy aircraft and the damaging of others.
