The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:

enemy: — Distinguished Service Order. Wing Commander Arthur Hay DONALDSON, D.F.C., A.F.C. (34150). During the period 11th to 14th October, 1942, this officer participated in engagements against enemy aircraft attempting to attack Malta. Bril-liantly leading his formation in attacks on bombers, regardless of the fighters which escorted them, Wing Commander Donaldson played a large part in the success achieved. Attacks on the islands were frustrated and several enemy bombers and fighters were shot down. On the 14th Octo-ber he received wounds in the feet and head and two of his fingers were shot away. Despite this, he flew to base and skilfully landed his aircraft. Wing Commander Donaldson displayed leadership, Wing Commander Donaldson displayed leadership, courage and fighting qualities in keeping with the highest traditions of the Royal Air Force. He destroyed three enemy aircraft, bringing his He destroyed three victories to five.

Wing Commander Leonard Cain SLEE (32021), No. 49 Squadron. Flying Officer Arthur Stanley GRANT (Aus. 404765),

lying Officer Arthur Stanley GRANT (Aus. 404765), Royal Australian Air Force, No. 49 Squadron. On 17th October, 1942, Wing Commander Slee and Flying Officer Grant were captain and navi-gator respectively of the leading aircraft of a large force of Lancaster bombers which attacked the Armament and Locomotive Works at Le Creusot. Much depended on their efforts but each in his respective role displayed superb skill and determination and a large measure of the out-standing success achieved can be attributed to their sterling work. By his great powers of leadership, Wing Commander Slee won the com-plete confidence of all crews of the attacking force.

plete confidence of all crews of the attacking force. Acting Wing Commander Peter Prosser HANKS, D.F.C. (37351). One day in October, 1942, this officer led his squadron in an engagement against a force of seven enemy bombers, escorted by 25 fighters, which attempted to attack Malta. The enemy were intercepted before reaching the island and, in a head-on attack, three of their aircraft were destroyed; one of them a Junkers 88, was shot down by Wing Commander Hanks. This officer is a fearless fighter whose example and leadership have instilled great confidence in his fellow pilots. Whilst flying from Malta, Wing Commander Hanks has destroyed four enemy aircraft.

Squadron Leader Anthony Desmond Joseph Lovell, D.F.C. (40402). This officer is an outstanding squadron com-

This officer is an outstanding squadron com-mander who has played a considerable part in the defence of Malta. One day in October, 1942, he led his squadron in an attack against six Junkers 88's escorted by a number of fighters. In the combat, Squadron Leader Lovell shot down a Junkers 88, bringing his total victories to nine. On many occasions, his skilful leadership has en-abled his squadron to intercept enemy air forma-tions bent on attacking Malta. This officer's gal-lantry and determination have set an example worthy of the highest praise. worthy of the highest praise.

Pilot Officer George Frederick BEURLING, D.F.C., D.F.M. (128707), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 249 Squadron.

Since being awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross, Pilot Officer Beurling has destroyed a further six enemy aircraft, bringing his total victories to 28. During one sortie on 13th October, 1942, he shot down a Junkers 88 and two Messerschmitt rog's. The following day, in a head-on attack on enemy bombers, he destroyed one of them before enemy bombers, he destroyed one of them before he observed his leader being attacked by an enemy fighter. Although wounded Pilot Officer Beurling destroyed the fighter. Then climbing again, although his aircraft was hit by enemy fire, he shot down another fighter before his own aircraft was so damaged that he was forced to abandon it. He descended safely on to the sea and was rescued. This officer's skill and daring are unexcelled.

Second Bar to Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Squadron Leader Maurice Michael STEPHENS, D.S.O., D.F.C. (33522) No. 229 Squadron.

From the 8th to 15th October, 1942 this officer has destroyed five enemy aircraft in air combats over Malta. On one occasion he followed an enemy over Maita. On one occasion he followed an enemy bomber down to sea level and, after pursuing it out to sea for some 20 miles, shot it down into the water. He was afterwards attacked by six enemy fighters but he destroyed one of them and fought the others off. Although his aircraft was badly damaged he flew it to base and made a crash-landing. This officer has greatly enhanced the gallant reputation he so worthily holds.

Acting Squadron Leader Adrian WARB D.S.O., D.F.C. (41635), No. 69 Squadron. WARBURTON,

Since August, 1942, this officer has completed numerous operational photographic sorties, many of them at low altitudes and often in the face of opposition from enemy fighters. His work has been of the utmost value. In October, 1942, his gallantry was well illustrated when he directed an enemy destroyer to a dinghy in which were the crew

of one of our aircraft, which had been shot down. Although he was fired upon by the destroyer and engaged by Italian aircraft he remained over the area until he observed that the drifting crew were picked up by the destroyer.

Bar to Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Squadron Leader Eric Norman Woods, D.F.C. (60119), Royal Air Force Volunteer D.F.C. (60119), Royal Reserve, No. 249 Squadron.

Reserve, No. 249 Squadron. In the recent heavy air fighting over Malta this officer has led his squadron against enemy forma-tions with great success. Between 12th and 17th October, 1942, 27 aircraft were destroyed by the squadron, and much of this success can be attri-buted to Squadron Leader Woods's outstanding leadership. In one engagement, on the 13th October, he shot down two enemy aircraft, bring-ing his victories to six. His example of courage and devotion to duty has inspired his fellow pilots.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Henry Wallace McLEOD, D.F.C. (Can./J.4912), Royal Canadian Air Force. One day in October, 1942, this officer took part in an attack on a formation of six Junkers 88's and shot two of them down. Although his air-craft was damaged in the combat he led his section in an attack on a nother formation of pine anemy in an attack on another formation of nine enemy in an attack on another formation of mine enemy bombers. Afterwards, he skilfully flew his damaged aircraft to base. During a period of five days Flight Lieutenant McLeod destroyed five enemy aircraft in the defence of Malta. A gallant fighter, this officer has destroyed 12 and damaged many more enemy aircraft.

Distinguished Flying Cross.

- Acting Flight Lieutenant Thomas Henry Desmond DRINKWATER (47841), No. 234 Squadron. This officer has completed a large number of operational sorties. He is an outstanding leader, who has displayed great skill and devotion to duty.
- ting Flight Lieutenant Edwin Herbert GLAZEBROOK (Can/J.5329), Royal Canadian Air Acting Force, No. 229 Squadron.

This officer has participated in many sorties over Sicily. In the heavy air fighting over Malta, he has taken part in many interceptions and his flight has destroyed 12 enemy aircraft. By his skilful and - courageous leadership, Flight Lieutenant Glazebrook played a large part in the successes obtained. He has destroyed 3 enemy aircraft.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Erik Lawson HETHERINGTON (102091), Royal Air Force Volun-teer Reserve, No. 249 Squadron.

During the recent intense air activity over Malta, this officer has led his flight with great skill. Many attacks on the island have been frustrated and 16 enemy aircraft destroyed. Throughout, Flight Lieutenant Hetherington's brilliant leader-ship has contributed materially to the success achieved. One day in October, 1942, he led his flight in a head-on attack against a force of 7 Junkers 88's escorted by a large number of fighters. A Junkers 88—shot down by Flight Lieutenant Hetherington—and 2 Messerschmitt 109's were destroyed. None of the bombers reached its target. This officer who has destroyed 2 enemy airraft, has displayed fine leadership, courage and determination. During the recent intense air activity over Malta, courage and determination.

Flight Lieutenant Colin Roy HEWLETT 8), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, Acting

cting Flight (69438), Royal Air Force No. 65 Squadron. This officer has completed a large number of sorties. He is a skilful flight commander whose sorties. In the com-bined operations at Dieppe on the 19th August, 1942, Flight Lieutenant Hewlett flew with distinction.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Colin Henry PARKINSON (Aus.402877), Royal Australian Air Force, No. 229

(Aus.402877), Royal Australian Air Force, 100.229 Squadron. This officer is a determined fighter who has led his formation with exceptional skill. On 17th October, 1942, he shot down a Messerschmitt 109. Shortly afterwards he saw, in the sea, one of his fellow pilots who had baled out. Whilst guiding a rescue launch to the spot, his aircraft was attacked by 3 enemy fighters but he drove them off. Although running short of petrol he did not return to base until he observed that the pilot had been picked up. This officer, whose courageous leadership has been most inspiring, has destroyed 9 enemy aircraft.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Arthur Ford Roscoe (100530), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, (100530), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 229 Squadron. On 12th October, 1942, this officer participated

in an engagement against a force of enemy fighters. During the combat, one of his comrades was being attacked by a Messerschmitt 109 but a burst from Flight Lieutenant Roscoe's guns caused burst from Flight Lieutenant Roscoe's guns caused it to break away with pieces falling from it. His own aircraft was then attacked by 6 Messerschmitt roo's. Although he was wounded in the shoulder and his aircraft was damaged he fought his way through and, in so doing, destroyed I of the attacking aircraft. Whilst heading for base he was again attacked. His engine caught fire and it was only by skilful airmanship that he was able to land his aircraft. This courageous officer who has completed a large number of sorties and has completed a large number of sorties and destroyed 4 enemy aircraft has always displayed great skill and determination.

(Can/J.7230), Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 249 Squadron. Officer John Frederick McElroy Flying

During recent air fighting over Malta, this officer has displayed great courage and outstanding determination to destroy the enemy. On 12th October, 1942, during an interception, he destroyed a Messerschmitt 109 and then pursued a Junkers 88. Six enemy fighters were in close proximity and Flying Officer McElroy turned to under them and destroyed a before them back of proximity and Flying Officer McElroy turned to-wards them and destroyed I before they broke off the fight. Three days later, his section attacked a formation of Junkers 88's and Flying Officer McElroy probably destroyed I of them. On another occasion, when one of his comrades was shot down into the sea, Flying Officer McElroy guided a rescue launch to the spot in spite of the presence of enemy fighters. This officer, who has completed many reconnaissances and destroyed 5 enemy aircraft, has displayed inspiring leadership.

- Flying Officer Frank Henry MITCHELL (102087), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve. This officer is a highly skilled observer. He has participated in many sorties at night and his fine work has assisted in the destruction of 2 enemv aircraft.
- Flying Officer John Percival RICKARDS (Aus.400422), Royal Australian Air Force, No. 53 Squadron. This officer has completed numerous sorties, in-volving reconnaissances, shipping and anti-submarine patrols. Throughout, his efficiency and devotion to duty have been outstanding. On one occasion in May rook Elwing Officer Bickards was occasion in May, 1942, Flying Officer Rickards was wounded during a sortie. Despite this he flew his aircraft safely back to base in difficult circumstances.
- Pilot Officer Ronald Geoffrey LARGE (113371), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 616 Squadron. In October, 1942, Pilot Officer Large was one of 2 pilots whose aircraft were intercepted near the coast in Northern France by enemy fighters. In the ensuing engagement, Pilot Officer Large de-stroyed a Focke Wulf 190. His fellow pilot, how-ever, was forced to leave his aircraft by parachute but he descended safely on to the sea a few miles from the enemy's coast. Pilot Officer Large, hav-ing expended all his ammunition and running short of petrol, flew on to an aerodrome in this country of petrol, flew on to an aerodrome in this country where he landed and re-fuelled. Without waiting for his aircraft to be re-armed, he took off deter-mined to locate his comrade. In this, he was successful and he continued to fly over the spot until his colleague was picked up by a rescue launch. On the return flight, Pilot Officer Large skilfully eluded enemy fighters which attempted to attack him. This officer's gallantry and forethought set a praiseworthy example.
- Pilot Officer George William PENROSE (80423), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 12 Squadron.

Pilot Officer Donald Joseph WHEELER (Aus.404663), Royal Australian Air Force, No. 12 Squadron. As rear gunner and wireless operator/air gunner respectively Pilot Officers Penrose and Wheeler have participated in numerous bombing sorties. In August, 1942, during a sortie against Kassel, both displayed high devotion to duty in difficult circumstances. The following night, they were members of the crew of an aircraft which attacked Saarbrucken. On the return fight the aircraft Saarbrucken. On the return flight, the aircraft was intercepted by an enemy fighter. In a series of 15 attacks, the bomber sustained severe damage. A shell which burst in the rear turret exploded

some ammunition and eventually rendered the turret unserviceable. In spite of this, Pilot Officer Penrose used his guns effectively and his frie of onter eventually set one of the attacker's engines alight, causing it to break off the combat. Meanwhile, Pilot Officer Wheeler who had been wounded in both hands by shrapnel, continued his duties of fire control without mentioning his injuries. He afterwards rendered first aid to a wounded comrade. In the face of most trying circumstances both Pilot Officers Penrose and Wheeler displayed great courage and devotion to duty.

great courage and devotion to duty. Warrant Officer Alan Charles BRAY (N.Z.402846), Royal New Zealand Air Force, No. 142 Squadron. Warrant Officer Bray has completed many sorties over enemy territory. On one occasion in October, 1942, he captained an aircraft detailed to attack a strongly defended target in Western Germany. In spite of heavy anti-aircraft fire and searchlight activity, Warrant Officer Bray attacked his objec-tive successfully from a low height; he also secured an excellent photograph of the target. He is an exceptionally skilful, courageous and reliable captain. captain.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

No. 150 Squadron. As air gunner this airman has participated in numerous sorties over enemy territory, including heavily defended targets in the Ruhr. On one occasion, when attacking Karlsruhe, his aircraft was intercepted by 2 enemy aircraft. In the ensuing engagement, Flight Sergeant Davies shot one of the attackers down and assisted in the destruction of the other. His skill and fearless-ness in the face of enemy fire have made him a valuable member of aircraft crew. valuable member of aircraft crew.

Can/R.70978 Flight Sergeant Ian Roy MacLENNAN,

an K. 70978 Flight Sergeant Ian Roy MACLENNAN, Royal Canadian Air Force. One day in October, 1942, this airman destroyed 2 of a force of 30 Junkers 88's which attempted to attack Malta. The next day, he destroyed a Messerschmitt 109. Flight Sergeant MacLennan has displayed great courage and tenacity. He has destroyed 4 and damaged several more enemy aircraft. aircraft.

740876 Flight Sergeant Louis George Charles DE LARA, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 249 Squadron.

One day in October, 1942, this airman was the pilot of one of a section of aircraft engaged on a sortie over Malta. Within a short time, 2 large formations of enemy bombers were intercepted. Despite heavy odds, Flight Sergeant De Lara so skilfully led his section in attack that they caused the enemy to jettison their bombs into the sea on each occasion. Throughout, this airman displayed brilliant leadership and high courage. He has destroyed 5 enemy aircraft.

In October, 1942, Flight Sergeant Fletcher and Sergeant Healey, as pilot and air gunner of air-craft respectively flew to the assistance of one of our fighter pilots floating in his dinghy near the enemy's coast. Despite the great risk involved, as the dinghy was drifting towards a minefield, Flight Sergeant Fletcher alighted on the sea some 150 yards from the stranded pilot. Although heavy shelling from the enemy's shore batteries was encountered, Flight Sergeant Fletcher taxied to the dinghy and, greatly assisted by Sergeant Healey, succeeded in rescuing the pilot. In circum-stances of great danger, both these airmen dis-played great courage and resource. On other occasions they have been instrumental in rescuing comrades from the sea. us.406682 Sergeant Bartlett Parker SHADDICK,

Aus.406682 Sergeant Bartlett Parker SHADDICK, Royal Australian Air Force, No. 142 Squadron. One night in October, 1942, this airman captained an aircraft detailed to attack Cologne. On the outward flight, the aircraft was hit by anti-aircraft fire. Although the starboard fuel tank anti-aircraft nre. Although the starboard fuel tank was pierced, causing much loss of petrol, Sergeant Shaddick flew on through heavy defences to his target which he bombed successfully. Whilst over the target area, the port engine was hit and ceased to function. Despite this, Sergeant Shaddick flew the aircraft back to this country on I engine and crash-landed at an aerodrome without injury to his crew. Throughout, he displayed great skill and determination. and determination.
