HE Prose continues on the mending hand, and gives Audience to his own Ministers, for the dispatch of publick Business. On the 3d Instant he held a Consistory in a Room next to his Bed-chamber, and gave the Caps to the new Cardinals Regolevich, Spirelli, and Gabrieli. He alfo confirmed the King of Spain's Choice of the Cardinal de Cordous to be Arch Bishop of Valetia, and gave the Bilhoprick of Ancona to Gardinal d'Affi. The Foreign Ministers, and particularly Count Lamberg Ambassador from the Emperor, and the Duke d'Uceda Ambassador from Spain, continue their Instances for an Audience of the Pope, but have not yer been able to obtain of the Pope, but have not yer been able to obtain it. These two Ambassadors will make their Publick Entries in sew days. The Prince of Money, Ambassador from France, has made a Visit to the Cardinal d'Arquien, which he had deferred till now on account of some Disputes about the Ceremonial; And he will shortly pay his Visit of Ceremony to the Queen Dowager of Poland; He has had some returns of his late Indisposition, and its kild he attributes it to the Air of this Place. is had he artributes it to the Air of this Place, and has for that reason sollicited his being recalled; And that the Most Christian King has complied with his Request, and intendence send hither the Marshal de Villeroy in his room. The Count de Less, General of the Spanish Galleys, who has commined some time in this City, is returned to

Venice, Febr. 12. The Duke of Mantua is re-turned from this Place to his Residence at Man-rus. Prince Sapieba, Son to the Great Chancellor of Lithuania, who came hither fome time ago from Poland, is gone to Rome. The Princes Alexorder and Constanting will likewise go thither in few days. 'Tis said, the Queen-Dowager of Poland, their Mother, intends in the Spring to leave that City, being invited by the Elector of Bavaris to make her Residence at Menich in Germany.

Warfaw, Febr. 6. The Cardinal Primate, who is now in this City, prepares every thing for the General Diet, who are to meet here foon after the King of Poland's return from Saxony. We have received an Account, that Elbing was evacuated on the first Instant, pursuant to the Tream levely concluded mich the Elastic of them. Vicinia, Febr. 13. The Turk if Amballador is to

have Publick Audience of the Emperor on the ioth Instant, with the same Ceremonies as were practifed at the Audience of the Ambassador the Gr. Signior fent hither in the year 1665. A Courier arrived here yesterday from Groatia with Dispatches from Count Marigly, the Emperor's Commissioner for fettling the Limits, containing some new Proposals made by the Turk h Commissioners, in order to adjust the Affair of Novi, which coming very near to what is desired by this Court, its nor doubted but this Matter will be soon determined. And the regulating of the Boundaries of the Emperor's and the Grand Signior's Dominions on that fide being finished, the Commissioners will proceed to fettle the Limits in Transliva-nta and Upper Hungary. The Emperor's Mi-nisters continue their Conferences for fettling feveral Matters relating to the Imperial Forces; And it appearing by an exact Account lately taken, that these Troops want soco Men of their Complement, Orders are given to raise Soldiers for recruiting them. Tis said, a Soveraign Court of Judicature is to be established at Buda to decide Causes in the Kingdom of Humary, and another at some sonvenient Place in Transilvania, but that Appeals shall lie from both to the Imperial Chamber at Vienna. The Discourses continue, that the King of the Romans is to be crowned King of Echemia nexe Spring at Prague. The Body of the late Duke of Lorrain, which lies at present at inspruch, will shortly be carried from thence to Nancy, to be enterred with his Ancestors. Monsieur Urbigh, Envoy from the King of Demnark, is upon his return from this Court to Copenhagen.

Francfort, Febr. 21. The Bishop of Wartzburgh

passed by this Place yesterday returning home from Mentz; where he assisted at the Election of a Provost of that Cathedral; And we hear, the Choice is fallen upon the Baron of Legen, Nephew to the present Elector of Triers. The Count of Boynembourg, Envoy from the Emperor, who was one of the Candidates, is daily expected here from Mense, and will shortly return to Vienna, the Count of Lewensleyn being come to affift in his stead at the Conferences for adjusting the Ducchess of Orleans's Presentions on the Palatinate; which are now renewed, and the Elector Palatine's Minister has delivered to the French Ministers his Answer to a Memorial they gave him some time ago concerning this Matter. They write from the Palatinate, that the Officers concerned in collecting the Elector Palatine's Revenues are gathering together a Sum of Money, to answer the Payment of 100000 Livers which became due in December last to the Dutchess of Orleans, being pair of the 200000 Livers his Electoral Highness tween Sweden and Museury; And that the Czar is to pay to her every year, in pursuance of the ading the Turki insist upon the Restitution of Treaty of Ryswick, till her Pretentions are settled.
