

Standberg Fair 22. The Negotiations for
settling the Affairs of Norway, are still in the
same condition, and all things continue for the
present, very quiet in that Country. Our Let-
ters from Copenhagen say, they are making a con-
siderable number of Deputies to meet the Deput-
ees of Denmark to decide what the King of Denmark is
to do with his Kingdom. Major Gen-
eral Kielitz was going from Copenhagen to Hol-
stein, as a Deputy of Hanover, to see the King
of Denmark. They were told by agents, that
the young Prince of Saxe Coburg was intended
here from Copenhagen, to be the next Govern-
or of Norway, or at least having resigned his
Government by reason of his great Age, he
was to give it to another. It would
also be Coburg who is to take Government of the
Province of Trondhjem. We have an Account
from Copenhagen, that the King
of Denmark would let out from hence in few days
on his return to Roskilde, and that he has chosen
the Prince of Saxe Coburg to be Governor
of Norway in his absence. The Advice from
Kielitz at the same time say, the Elector of
Brandenburg was going to pass some days in
Prussia, and that the Electress intended her-
self to come to Hanover, to make a visit to the
Duke's Daughter the Duchess.
