HE King of Spain continues in very good Health, and does often divert himself with Hunting. The Court is enterrained with Balls and other Diversions on account of the Carnaval, and the King and Queen intend to go in the beginning of Lent to the Escurial, and to continue there till Easter. It's still discoursed, that the Bishop of Lerida, who is returning hither from the Imperial Courr, will be made President of the Council of Cafile in the room of the Count d'Orspesa. The Duke de Pareti is appointed to fucceed him as Ambassador from this Crown to the Emperor, and is accordingly preparing for The King has lately made his Journey to Vienna. the Duke de Veza a Knight of the Golden Fleece. The Count of Fuenfalida took the usual Oath this week as Counsellor of State. The Office of Secretary of the Council of State, vacant by the Death of Don John del Moral, is not yet disposed of. Orders are sent to Catalonia, that a Regiment of Horse and some Regiments of Foot of the Forces quartered in that Province, do forthwith march to Andalasia to be transported from thence to Ceu-, in order to drive the Moors from before that Place; Letters from thence of the 22d past say, a French Slave had made his Escape thirher from Tetuan, who reports, that the Officers who command the Moors before that Place had represented to the King of Morocco, the great Difficulties they meet with in this Siege, and desired Orders to raise the same, but that he seemed resolved not to quit this Enterprize.

Warfaw, Febr. 9. The Cardinal Primate having received a Letter from the King of Poland, acquainting him that he intends to be here in a very short time, every thing is put in a readiness for the Diet to meet soon after his arrival. The Sieur Werner is daily expected here from Elbing, having in the Quality of Commissioner from the Elector of Brandenburgh delivered up that City to the Commissioners of Poland, and received from them the Jewels given to his Electoral Highness as a Security for the Payment of the Money due to him from this Crown, which Jewels are deli-vered into the Custody of General Brands Governor of Coningsberg, and are to be kept in the Castle of that Place, till such time as the Elector's Pretensions are satisfied. The last Advices from Lembrg fay, the Sieur Lezinsky, the King's Ambassador Extraordinaty to the Grand Signior, being perselly recovered of his late Illness, continued his Journey to the Post, and that two Turkish Officers waited for him at Jassy by the Grand Signior's Order to the Post, and the Grand Signior's Order to the Royal Signior's Order to the Royal

Vienna, Febr. 17. The Grand Signior's Ambaffador had Publick Andience of the Emperor yesterday, being Conducted by Count Rappach, Serjeant Major of the Imperial Guards, in the manner following; First marched a Company of our Garrison; Then the Amdassador's Chiaia er Chief Steward, after whom were carried the

Presents sent by the Sultan to the Emperor and the Imperial Family, confisting in a very fine Tent, adorned with Gold Embroidery; Two Ho les, with Saddles and Bridles covered with Gold and Silver and Precious Stones; Two Arabian Led Horses, likewise very richly accoutred; Divers Turkey-work Carpets; Several pieces of Gold and Silver Brocadoes, and other things of Value; Then came divers of the Ambassador's principal Servants on Horseback; The Officers of his Excellency's Guards; His Divan Effendi or Chief Secretary, carrying in his Hand his Excellency's Credentials; Then the Ambassador himself in the Emperor's Coach, with Count Rappach, and the Sieur Della Torre the Emperor's Chief Interpreter; His Excellency's Footmen walking on each fide the Coach; A great Company of the Ambaffador's chief Attendants on Horfeback followed, and after them came divers of his Servants on Foot, and another Company of Soldiers closed the march. The Audience being over; the Ambassador was conducted back to his Lodging, where a noble Entertainment was prepared for him and his Retinue; And the Emperor's Ministers have agreed with his Excellency, that a certain Sum shall be paid him daily for his Expences during his stay here. The Emperor has given Orders for the Payment of feveral Sums of Money to the Officers of his Forces to recruit rhem; The Jews fettled in these Parts, have offered to lend the Emperor 425000 Florins; And the Officers of the Imperial Treafury are treating with them for this purpole. Tis said, some Imperial Regiments will be sent into Quarters in the Dutchies of Carinthia and Carniola, and in the County of Frioul. The Princels Sobiesky, Sifter to the Emprels, continues at this Court; 'Tis discoursed, that Prince James her Husband, is treating with the Heirs of the Prince of Piombino, who died lately, and left no Successor of his own Family for the Principality of Piombino, and that the same being a Fief of the Kingdom of Naples, the Princess has obtained a Recommendation from the Emperor to the King of Spain. The Count of Czirnin, Vice-Chancellor of Bohemia, died here on the 15th Instant. The Count of Boynenbourg, who affisted on the part of the Emperor at the Conferences held at Francfort, for settling the Dutchess of Orleans's Pretensions upon the Ele-Ctor Palatine, is daily expected here, and is appointed by the Emperor to go with the Chara-Ger of his Envoy to the Duke of Savoy. A Courier was sent this week to Creatia, with further Instructions to Count Marfigly, the Emperor's Commissioner, concerning the Matters in Dispute between him and the Turkish Compile fioner in relation to the Dependencies of Novi, which 'tis hoped will be speedily adjusted.
