GEORGE THE SIXTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these Presents shall come:

Whereas His late Majesty King George the Fifth did by Warrant under His Royal Sign Manual, bearing date the twenty-third day of February one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, institute and create a Medal styled "The Indian Police Medal" and did make certain Rules for the government of the same:

And whereas alterations and amendments to the said Rules were made by Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual bearing date the twenty-fourth day of June one thousand nine hundred and thirtyeight.

And whereas We are desirous of further amending

the said Rules:

Now know ye that We do by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, make the following amendment in the said Rules, that is to say:
For the Seventh Rule there shall be substituted the following: "Seventhly. It is ordained that the number of medals awarded in any one year (excluding bars) shall not ordinarily exceed 200, but that if Our Viceroy considers that special circumstances in any year justify the award of medals in excess of 200, the number shall not exceed 250."

Given at Our Court at St. James's the twenty-fifth day of November one thousand nine hundred and forty-two in the sixth year of Our Reign.
