The KING has been graciously pleased to give orders for the following appointment to the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire:----

To be an Additional Member of the Military Division of the said Most Excellent Order: —

Flight Lieutenant Thomas Henry Cullen, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P. (81303), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve.

Reserve. A few days before the German invasion of Crete, this medical officer fell sick with dysentery at Maleme. When the heavy air attack on Maleme began, although too weak to walk properly, he immediately attended to the wounded and continued to do so under fire until his post was captured. Flight Lieutenant Cullen then established a first-aid post in a nearby village and worked alone and without sleep for the next three days, when he was joined by two doctors of the New Zealand forces. Over 1,000 wounded were passed through this medical post before it was finally taken over by an Australian Field Ambulance. Flight Lieutenant Cullen displayed devotion to duty and courage of the highest order.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the George Medal to the undermentioned:—

Can/R.54093 Flight Sergeant Raoul de fontenay Jenner, Royal Canadian Air Force.

One night in September, 1942, Flight Sergeant Jenner was a member of the crew of an aircraft detailed to attack a target at Dusseldorf. The target was bombed successfully but, whilst still over the objective, the aircraft was repeatedly hit by anti-aircraft fire. The port inner propeller came off and, shortly afterwards, the port outer engine fell out; the petrol tanks were holed in many places. During the return journey the crew displayed coolness and skill, doing all they could to keep the crippled bomber in the air. Shortly after crossing the English coast the aircraft crashed in a field and immediately caught fire. All the crew, with the exception of the rear gunner, managed to extricate themselves. The whole aircraft was soon blazing fiercely. Knowing that the fuel tanks might explode at any moment two sergeants re-entered the aircraft in an attempt to rescue the rear gunner. They went right forward to reach the place where they thought he would have been thrown, but a petrol tank exploded and both were killed. Flight Sergeant Jenner, who had seen his two comrades killed and knew that a further petrol tank might explode, then re-entered the burning fuselage. He found the rear gunner who was severely burned, and succeeded in removing him to safety. Throughout, this airman displayed extreme courage, fortitude and devotion to duty in keeping with the highest traditions of the Royal Air Force.

1283824 Sergeant George Lynas Hosford, Royal Air Force.

Sergeant Hosford was in charge of a party which laid a flare path and loaded bombs on to a squadron of aircraft when they were operating from an airfield one night in June, 1942. The bombers had taken off from a nearby landing ground and, soon afterwards, enemy aircraft commenced to drop flares and bombs in the neighbourhood. The attack continued throughout the night. At 2300 hours our bombers commenced to arrive back, landing at the airfield, to be re-fuelled and reloaded for a second sortie. One of the aircraft, when taking off on its second operation, received a direct hit by an enemy bomb; a terrific explosion occurred and the aircraft burst into flames. Three members of the crew escaped through the pilot's escape hatch, whilst the rear gunner, who was badly injured but had managed to free himself from his turret, was assisted by Sergeant Hosford to get clear of the aircraft. The bombs on the aircraft began to explode but, despite the great danger, Sergeant Hosford returned to the blazing wreckage for the wireless operator, who was lying seriously injured close to it and dragged him to a nearby vehicle. The vehicle was badly damaged and, although Sergeant Hosford had not driven before, he succeeded in driving the whole of this time enemy aircraft were overhead bombing and machine gunning the blazing aircraft. Afterwards to enable our bombers to land when returning from operations, Sergeant Hosford helped to re-lay a flare path, which he manned for the rest of the night. He displayed courage and devotion to duty of a very high standard and undoubtedly saved two lives.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the British Empire Medal (Military Division) to the undermentioned:—

1253399 Flight Sergeant Bertie Couchman, Royal Air Force.

One night in September, 1942, Flight Sergeant Couchman was the navigator of an aircraft detailed to attack a target in the Ruhr. During the attack the aircraft was intercepted by an enemy air-craft and sustained damage which rendered it impossible to release the flares. On arrival back at base the captain accomplished a successful emergency landing, but unfortunately some of the flares ignited. Ammunition began to explode and the aircraft was set alight and was in great danger of being blown up. Displaying complete disregard for his own safety, Flight Sergeant Couchman remained in the aircraft and assisted three mem-bers of the crew, two of whom were injured, to bers of the crew, two of whom were injured, to safety. In so doing he was twice thrown on to the flames when the floor collapsed, sustaining severe burns, but it was largely due to his courage and devotion to duty that his comrades were able to leave the aircraft safely.

937723 Flight Sergeant Peter William Hewitt, Royal Air Force.

In June, 1942, Flight Sergeant Hewitt was the 2nd pilot of a flying boat which crashed whilst alighting in a heavy swell, and sank. The crew were in shark-infested waters, 180 miles from land, with one rubber dinghy and four life belts. The would support only two people. Flight Sergeant Hewitt, finding that one of the crew was drowning, managed to get him on to the damaged dinghy ing, managed to get him on to the damaged dingny and spent the whole of one night swimming along-side, holding the man's head out of the water, until he died. Even then Flight Sergeant Hewitt made strenuous efforts to effect resuscitations, to his own detriment and exhaustion. Later, when dinghies with food and water were dropped by an aircraft, Flight Sergeant Hewitt was the first to swim out to collect those within range. The crew were on the water for go hours before they were were on the water for 70 hours before they were rescued, and it was largely due to the magnificent example of self-sacrifice and endurance of Flight Sergeant Hewitt and his cheerfulness in spite of the apparently hopeless situation, that only one of the crew was lost. When rescued he was in a far worse physical condition than his companions.

1206642 Flight Sergeant John Philp, Royal Air Force.

Force. Flight Sergeant Philp and Sergeants Reardon and Fossleitner were captain, front gunner and navigator respectively of an aircraft which attacked Munich one night in September, 1942. On the return flight the engineer reported that there would only be sufficient spare fuel to operate for 15 minutes on arrival at base. Flight Sergeant Philp therefore obtained permission to land at a nearer airfield. When nearing the airfield, how-ever, one of the engines failed and it was necessary to descend on to the sea off the coast. Although to descend on to the sea off the coast. Although the aircraft was kept level, it broke in four parts on impact with the water and these three airmen, together with the wireless operator and the mid upper gunner, were thrown into the sea. Flight Sergeant Philp, who is a strong swimmer, volun-teered to swim to shore alone to get help. He abandoned this intention, however, as it was necessary to help the mid-upper gunner, and in company with Sergeant Reardon, started to swim to shore, taking the mid-upper gunner with them. They were picked up by a fishing boat after swimming for $3\frac{1}{2}$ hours, but unfortunately the gunner was found to be dead. In the meantime, Sergeant Fossleitner, although badly shaken, had volunteered to remain behind on one of the wings and support the wireless operator, whose spine was on impact with the water and these three airmen, voluteered to remain behind on other of the wings and support the wireless operator, whose spine was fractured. He supported him for $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours, until eventually both were picked up by an Air/Sea Rescue Launch. The courage and fortitude dis-played by Flight Sergeant Philp and Sergeants Reardon and Fossleitner were of the highest order.

1379591 Sergeant Eric Wade, Royal Air Force.

One night in September, 1942, Sergeant Wade was taxying an aircraft, prior to taking off, when an aircraft crashed on the flare path and burst into flames. Three fuel tanks exploded, Verey cartridges and ammunition commenced to detonate and there was a danger of a fourth petrol tank exploding. Sergeant Wade unhesitatingly entered the blazing fuselage and, finding the wireless operator in a dazed condition, helped him to safety just before the remaining petrol tank exploded and

the fuselage collapsed. Sergeant Wade's prompt and gallant action undoubtedly saved the wireless operator's life.

1101543 Corporal Stanley Banks, Royal Air Force.

Corporal Banks was second coxswain on a High Speed Launch on 19th August, 1942. He showed great coolness under fire and after the crew abandoned ship he swam around encouraging them and on at least two occasions inflated the life jackets of members of the crew who were too exhausted to help themselves. Corporal Banks has been in air/sea rescue launches since Feb-ruary, 1941, and has always been one of the keenest airmen in his unit.

Can/R. 107072 Leading Aircraftman Howard Roy Carter, Royal Canadian Air Force.

One night in September, 1942, an aircraft struck stores hut on an airfield and burst into flames. Leading Aircraftman Carter and another airman who were working near by hastened to the scene of the crash and on arrival found that the perspex of the observer's astrodome was broken. Despite of the crash and on arrival found that the perspex of the observer's astrodome was broken. Despite the fact that the front of the aircraft was burn-ing fiercely and the remaining petrol tanks were likely to explode, Carter climbed through the hole in the perspex in an endeavour to rescue the observer who was in the midde of the aircraft and lying across the ammunition tanks. He had some difficulty in raising the observer as a cord of the latter's helmet was wound round his face and caught by a projection in the aircraft but and caught by a projection in the aircraft, but Carter succeeded in freeing his comrade and in getting him under the astrodome. The other airman had, in the meantime, broken away pieces of the perspex, and with his assistance Carter lifted the observer out of the aircraft just as the ammunition began to explode. His courageous action undoubtedly saved the observer's life.

1331108 Leading Aircraftman Albert Dargue, Royal Air Force.

Leading Aircraftman Dargue was Nursing Orderly on a High Speed Launch during the com-bined operations on 19th August, 1942. In spite of wounds, he endeavoured to carry out first-aid to the wounded until he was picked up in a seriously wounded condition. The courage and valuable services rendered by Leading Aircraftman Dargue are typical of the high qualities displayed by the nursing orderlies, who have carried out hazardous operations in High Speed Launches which play an essential part in air/sea rescue. Leading Aircraftman Dargue Nursing was

Leading Aircraftmen Hale and Stepto have been employed in an airfield clearance party at Malta. for several months. They have both performed their duties with the greatest zeal, often display-ing complete disregard for their personal safety when clearing runways while heavy raids on the airfield have been in progress. They have set a magnificent example. magnificent example.

- In May, 1942, a Wellington aircraft crashed in flames on a landing ground and the occupants were killed. Leading Aircraftman Hitchcock displayed outstanding courage in removing most of the bodies from the blazing wreckage. Again, in August, 1942, a Kittyhawk aircraft crashed in flames on the same landing ground. Leading Aircraftman Hitchcock rushed from the fire tender with a hose, disappeared into the flames and shortly reappeared carrying the body of the pilot. With the assistance of another member of the crew, he managed to get the body clear of the burning wreckage. Leading Aircraftman Hitchcock has displayed the greatest courage and devotion to durin to duty.

These airmen are nursing orderlies, who have always displayed the utmost courage and devotion to duty. One evening in October, 1942, they were on duty on an airfield with their ambulance during a heavy air attack on Malta, when they

observed an aircraft, which was in difficulties, coming in to land. It crashed and immediately burst into flames. Despite the imminent danger of ammunition and petrol tanks exploding, Leading Aircraftman Jenkins and Aircraftman 1st Class Poppleton rushed into the burning wreckage and succeeded in extricating the wounded and semi-conscious pilot and in moving him to safety. Their prompt and gallant action saved the pilot's life.

755120 Aircraftman 1st Class Michael Nunn, Royal Air Force.

Air Force. On the 19th August, 1942, Aircraftman 1st Class Nunn was wireless operator in a High Speed Launch. During operations the launch was severely attacked by enemy aircraft. He remained at his post until his wireless equipment was shot away and on going on deck, found he was the only member of the crew uninjured, the other members being either killed or wounded. He showed great presence of mind by first endeavour-ing to stop the engines until he was almost over-come by fumes. He then ran to the wheel and continued to steer the launch for the British coast continued to steer the launch for the British coast until some time later he was taken aboard another launch. Shortly afterwards both launches were sunk by the enemy. Aircraftman Nunn has served with High Speed Launches since December, 1941, and has carried out numerous operations with skill and efficiency.

1113512 Aircraftman 2nd Class Frank Brown, Royal Air Force.

996631 Aircraftman 2nd Class Thomas Welsh, Royal Air Force.

H.M. Minesweeper "Changteh" sailed from Singapore in February, 1942, carrying 40 officers and men of the Royal Air Force, among others, and men of the Royal Air Force, among others, and was sunk the next day by air attack, with heavy loss of life. Forty men escaped in the only undamaged boat, the proper complement of which was 22. After being nearly swamped in heavy weather, they reached land near the mouth of a river a few days later, but found no fresh water. Thirty survivors were picked up next day. Air-craftmen Brown and Welsh never faltered through-out a severe ordeal and set a magnificent example out a severe ordeal and set a magnificent example to all the rest.

2nd Class Denis 1282121 Aircraftman Arthur Wellesley, Viscount Dangan, Royal Air Force.

In August, 1942, a refueller was being started up by two members of its crew, when there was a terrific explosion, and it burst into flames. There were four refuellers moored in pairs, bow to stern. One member of the crew was blown into the water and the other was killed. Aircraftman Wellesley in which there are barracuda and alligators, swam in which there are barracula and angators, swam to the two refuellers that were not alight and immediately commenced casting off. He had nearly completed his task when reinforcements arrived. They were inspired by his example and the two refuellers were got away safely from the conflagration. Aircraftman Wellesley displayed courage and steadfastness of a high standard.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry dis-played in flying operations against the enemy:—

Bar to Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Dallas Wilbur SCHMIDT, D.F.C. (Can/J.7336), Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 227 Squadron. Since being awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross, this officer has completed many sorties. In

an engagement in November, 1942, he destroyed 2 Junkers 52's and assisted in the destruction of a 2 Junkers 52's and assisted in the destruction of a Dornier 24. His aircraft was hit in some 30 places by return fire and the port engine set alight but he succeeded in extinguishing the flames and flew the damaged aircraft to base landing it safely in difficult circumstances. Some days later, he shot down a Junkers 52, and shortly afterwards he destroyed a C.R.42. In attacks on enemy shipping, Flight Lieutenant Schmidt has achieved notable success. He has at all times displayed outstanding. skill and gallantry.

Pilot Officer Harry Woodward DONKERSLEY, D.F.C. (Can/J.8203), Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 69 Squadron.

In sorties against enemy shipping this officer has achieved much success. One night in November, 1942, he captained an aircraft detailed to drop-flares over the Italian naval units and accom-plished his task successfully. Several nights later he attacked and sank a small merchant vessel. On another night in December Jose he participated he attacked and sank a small merchant vessel. On another night in December, 1942, he participated in an operation against an important enemy convoy in the Mediterranean. As a result, other air and surface forces were enabled to strike successfully; two merchant vessels were sunk and I badly damaged. Pilot Officer Donkersley is a courageous leader who has displayed great initia-tive in the face of the enemy tive in the face of the enemy.

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Squadron Leader Kendrick Herbert SALUSBURY-HUGHES (70597), Royal Air Force Volunteer Re-serve, No. 23 Squadron.

This officer has completed many sorties, involving attacks on factories, marshalling yards and enemy airfields. Squadron Leader Salusbury-Hughes, who has always displayed great keenness, has destroyed 3 enemy aircraft.

Flight Lieutenant Norman Patrick Watkins HANCOCK (42122), No. 250 Squadron.

(42122), No. 250 Squadron. In November, 1942, this officer led the squadron some 200 miles in bad weather to intercept an energy air transport convoy. The formation some 200 miles in bad weather to intercept an enemy air transport convoy. The formation arrived at precisely the right time and, in the ensuing engagement 7 of the transports were shot down and 5 were destroyed on the ground. Flight Lieutenant Hancock, whose leadership was out-standing, shot down a Heinkel III and destroyed on the ground On another occasion has 3 aircraft on the ground. On another occasion he participated in an attack on German E boats which were operating against a harbour in our hands. During the engagement 4 E boats were sunk, one of them by Flight Lieutenant Hancock. This officer, who formerly fought in France and in the Battle of Britain, has always displayed great skill and determination.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Donald Charles BEATON (Aus. 406370), Royal Australian Air Force, No. 459 (R.A.A.F.) Squadron.

This officer has displayed exceptional courage and initiative. One morning in September, 1942, and initiative. One morning in September, 1942, he attacked an enemy destroyer near the North African coast. Despite intense opposing fire he pressed home his attack, obtaining hits which caused a large explosion followed by a fire. In air combat, Flight Lieutenant Beaton has destroyed 2 enemy aircraft. His excellent leadership and unfailing devotion to duty have set a fine example. example.

In December, 1942, Flight Lieutenant Welch and Flying Officer Shuttleworth, as pilot and navigator of aircraft respectively, undertook a sortie into enemy territory. Despite adverse weather, success was achieved. At least 2 enemy aircraft were destroyed. The skilful execution of the operation reflects great credit on the efforts. the operation reflects great credit on the efforts of these two officers. Both Flight Lieutenant Welch and Flying Officer Shuttleworth have com-pleted numerous sorties over enemy territory.

Pilot Officer Norman John LEWIS (115609), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 227 Squadron. As navigator, this officer has taken part in several sorties. On a recent occasion he participated in an engagement against a convoy of enemy transport aircraft escorted by fighters. During the combat, his pilot was severely wounded. On the return flight, Pilot Officer Lewis attended to his wounded comrade when almost faithed to his wounded comrade, who almost fainted several times through loss of blood. Pilot Officer Lewis also rendered valuable assistance in flying the aircraft back to base where a safe landing was made in darkness. He has invariably displayed high courage and resource.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

- 1004963 Flight Sergeant Andrew Burt CAMPBELL, No. 227 Squadron. This officer is a skilful and courageous navi
 - gator who has taken part in many sorties. In

November, 1942, he navigated one of a formation of aircraft which shot down 2 Junkers 52's and a Dornier 24. Two days later he participated in an attack on an enemy motor vessel. Towards the end of the month, Flight Sergeant Campbell participated in attacks on enemy shipping with ex-cellent results. His splendid work has contributed materially to the successes obtained.

- 8158 Flight Sergeant John Bernard SNELL, Auxiliary Air Force, No. 277 Squadron. In air/sea rescue operations this airman has par-818158
- ticipated in many searches in all kinds of weather and has assisted in saving a number of members of aircraft crews. On one occasion in February, 1942, he was the wireless operator of an aircraft which directed boats to a Hampden crew in the sea which directed boats to a manipuen ciew in the sea off St. Catherine's Point. Four members of the bomber's crew were picked up. His keenness to undertake rescue flights whatever the circum-stances, has set an inspiring example.
- 911854 Sergeant George William WILLIAMS, No. 272 Squadron.

In August, 1942, this airman was the navigator of an aircraft which was intercepted by an enemy fighter. During the combat Sergeant Williams directed his pilot's evasive action and, in addition, manned a machine gun. Both he and his pilot were wounded, while the aircraft was damaged and the rear part set on fire. Ignoring his own injuries, Sergeant Williams first tended his wounded comrade and then went to the rear of the aircraft to fight the flames. Smoke filled the fuselage and to fight the names. Smoke filed the ruselage and Verey cartridges were exploding but, using his parachute harness, he successfully beat out the flames. Sergeant Williams then returned to the pilot and, after dressing his wounds, gave him all assistance possible until a safe landing was made at base. Throughout, this airman displayed great courage and devotion to duty.
