Wing Commander Douglas Henry Sherwood RUSHER (33143), No. 162 Squadron.

(33143), No. 162 Squadron. Wing Commander Rusher has participated in 40 sorties, many of them of a hazardous nature. He is a gallant leader who has at all times dis-played great keenness to undertake the most difficult tasks. During the battle at El Alamein he flew with great distinction. On another occasion, although engaged on a special mission, he bombed an airfield in Crete, destroying 5 air-craft on the ground. Much of the success achieved by his souadron, which has an outstanding record. by his squadron, which has an outstanding record, can be attributed to Wing Commander Rusher's inspiring leadership, courageous example and great skill.

cting Wing Commander John Charles Scorr (Can/C.835) Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 413 (R.C.A.F.) Squadron. Acting

This officer has completed a very large number of operational missions, involving arduous flights over the Atlantic, Arctic, Indian Oceans and the Mediterranean. He is a brilliant captain and navigator, whose determination to complete his allotted task, whose determination to complete his allotted task, whose determination to complete his outstanding. During a flight in December, 1942, his aircraft became defective and he was forced to return to base. Within a quarter of an hour he took off in another aircraft. After locating his objective he flew over the area for more than an hour to secure information. His courageous example has won the admiration of all.

  - Reserve, No. 29 Squadron. Since July, 1941, Wing Commander Wight-Boycott has completed much operational flying by night. He was appointed to command his squadron in September, 1942. In January, 1943, during an enemy air attack, he displayed out-standing skill and keenness and destroyed 4 enemy aircraft. Wing Commander Wight-Boycott's ex-ceptional personal feat and the fine performance of his squadron was in keeping with his reputa-tion for outstanding enthusiasm and thoroughness.
