WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 20th day of February, 1943 (C.W. 15756/42), in the words following, viz.:

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas under the provisions of Orders in Council dated the 25th July, 1927 and 30th April, 1936, the age of compulsory retirement for Surgeon Captains (D) who entered the Dental Branch of Your Majesty's Navy before the 1st October, 1935, is 55 years subject to their retention, at Admiralty discretion, up to the age of 57:

"And whereas Surgeon Captain (D) Edward Ernest Fletcher, C.B.E., L.D.S., R.N., attained the age of 57 on 6th February, 1943:

"And whereas we consider that this officer should be further retained on the Active List of the Royal Navy as a Surgeon Captain (D):

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the retention of the said Surgeon Captain (D) Edward Ernest Fletcher on the Active List of the Royal Navy for such period as the Admiralty may deem expedient.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And whereas by Orders in Council, dated the 28th December, 1865, and the 14th September, 1915, and made in pursuance of the said Act, certain provisions were ordered which it is desirable to amend as is hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act or otherwise in Him vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

In investigating claims to Naval assets the Inspector of Seamen's Wills shall, in substitution for the investigations prescribed by the said Order in Council of the 28th December, 1865, require the claimant to make a declaration suited to the circumstances of the case before a Magistrate or a Minister of Religion, and, in those cases where it is considered to be necessary, to obtain a certificate from two householders certifying to the claimant's identity.

WHEREAS His late Majesty, King George the Fifth by virtue of the authority conferred upon Him by the Copyright Act, 1911 (1 & 2 Geo. 5, c. 46) (hereinafter called "the Act") was pleased to make the Copyright (Rome Convention) Order, 1933 (S.R. & O. 1933 (No. 253), p. 530) (hereinafter called "the Principal Order"):

And whereas Hayti has denounced the International Convention for the Protection of Literary and Artistic Works, signed at Berlin on 13th November, 1908 (Treaty Series No. 19 (1912)), with effect from the 26th March, 1943:

And whereas by Section 32 of the Act it is provided that His Majesty in Council may make Orders for altering, revoking or varying any Order in Council made under the Act, but that any Order made under the said Section should not affect prejudicially any rights or interests acquired or accrued at the date when the Order comes into operation, and should provide for the protection of such rights and interests:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority conferred upon Him by the Act, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased to direct and doth hereby direct as follows:—

The Principal Order, in so far as it applies the Act to works of which the country of origin is Hayti, is hereby revoked.

2. Nothing in this Order shall affect prejudicially any rights or interests acquired or accrued at the date of coming into operation of this Order by virtue of the Principal Order.

3. The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 63), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as if it were an Act of Parliament.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the 26th March, 1943.

5. This Order may be cited as the Copyright (Rome Convention) (Hayti) Order, 1943.
