WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Orders in Council of the 29th January, 1929, 1st October, 1932, 27th October, 1936, 1st July, 1937, 24th February 1938, 5th September 1939, and 30th May, 1941, authorised payment of extra duty pay to certain Royal Marine ranks when organised in service units:

"And whereas we consider that extra remuneration at the rate of 1s. a day should be paid to Royal Marine ranks qualified and employed as Dock Foremen in the establishment of such units:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction payment accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of *March*, 1943, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th

and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Whiteparish in the County of Wilts and in the Diocese of Salisbury:

"Whereas we are satisfied that Mabel Bull of Castle House, Buckingham, Widow, is the Patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the said Mabel Bull desires to transfer the Advowson of the said Benefice to the Bishop of Salisbury for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof she has executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Neville, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Whiteparish shall be transferred to the said Neville, Bishop of Salisbury, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Salisbury for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Salisbury.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th

day of March, 1943, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme relating to the re-endowment of the Bishopric of Newcastle:

"Whereas the investments and property which are particularly described in the Schedule hereunder written are now held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as the Endowment Fund of the said Bishopric of Newcastle:

"And whereas no part of the said investments and property is specifically allotted to the provision or maintenance of an episcopal residence for the Diocese of Newcastle:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that the said investments and property should be transferred to us and that in exchange for such transfer we should pay out of the Common Fund created by the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, a fixed annual income for the said Bishopric as a re-endowment thereof:

"And whereas the Right Honourable Winston Leonard Spencer Churchill, First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, and the Right Reverend Noel, Bishop of Newcastle, have respectively signified their consents to the exercise in relation to the said Bishopric of Newcastle of the power conferred upon us by Section 2 of the said Measure:

"And whereas the Newcastle Diocesan Board of Finance, the Right Reverend Alwyn, Bishop of Durham, being the Bishop for the time being of a contributory Bishopric and the consenting body as defined by Section 3 of the Cathedrals Measure, 1931, of the Cathedral Church of Saint Nicholas, Newcastle, have respectively signified their approval of the submission of the said Scheme to Your Majesty in Council:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the investments and property described in the said Schedule shall be transferred to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, freed and discharged from all or any trusts previously affecting the same to be held by us for the benefit of our Common Fund and that in exchange for such transfer we be authorised to pay out of the said Common Fund by equal quarterly payments on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August and the 1st day of November in every year a fixed annual sum of £3,856 to the said Noel, Bishop of Newcastle, and to his successors in the same Bishopric, as a re-endowment of the said Bishopric, the first of such quarterly payments to be made on such of the said quarterly days as shall happen next after the day of such publication as aforesaid and to be a proportionate part of the said quarterly payment calculated from the date of such publication to the said quarterly day of payment: Provided always that, as from the date of such publication as aforesaid, none of the trusts and provisions from which the said investments and property are hereby freed and discharged shall attach to the said annual sum of £3,856, save and except the primary trusts for the endowment or benefit of the said Bishopric.

ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Newcastle.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of March, 1943, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Derwent Valley Water Act, 1920; the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly submit to Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for a union of Benefices and Parishes in the County and Diocese of Derby, for providing a new Church in the County, for constituting a Separate District or new Parish for the same church, for vesting the patronage thereof and for certain other matters in relation thereto:

"Whereas it was provided by the said Act of 1920 that the church, churchyard and vicarage of the Parish of Derwent, in the said County of Derby and now in the Diocese of Derby (which Parish is otherwise known as Derwent Woodlands) might be acquired by the Derwent Valley Water Board for the purposes of their undertaking and that the compensation received therefor should be applied in accordance with a Scheme to be prepared by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

"And whereas the said Act of 1920 further specified the matters to be included in such Scheme:

"And whereas the said church, churchyard and vicarage of the said Parish of Derwent have been duly acquired by the said Water Board and the compensation money has been duly paid to and is now held by the Derby Diocesan Board of Finance, the Trustees named by the Right Reverend Alfred Edward John, Bishop of the said Diocese of Derby, in pursuance of the said Act of 1920:

"And whereas the said Parish of Derwent may now therefore be annexed to the neighbouring Parish of Bamford:

"And whereas we are satisfied that it would promote the interest of religion that the part which is hereinafter described of the Parish of Beighton in the said County and Diocese should be constituted a Separate District for spiritual purposes pursuant to the secondly mentioned Act:

"And whereas there is not within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church in use for divine worship and the Right Reverend Alfred Edward John, Bishop of the said Diocese, has represented to us and it appears to us expedient that a new Church should be provided therefor by way of reinstatement of the said Church of Derwent:

"And whereas the Reverend George Stephen Nason, now Incumbent of the Benefice of Bamford, in the said County and Diocese, has consented to the arrangements respecting his Benefice which are hereinafter recommended and proposed and we are satisfied of their equity:

"And whereas the Reverend Walter Edward Rouse, now incumbent of the said Benefice of Derwent, is willing to resign the said Benefice in order to facilitate the arrangements proposed by this Scheme and has given notice to the Bishop of the Diocese of his desire so to retire and the Bishop has consented to his so doing, subject to the provisions of this Scheme:

"And whereas the endowments of the said Parish of Derwent comprise certain glebe lands, certain rentcharges and certain annual payments amounting to about £289 per annum:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Alfred Edward John, Bishop of Derby (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in pursuance

of the said Acts and of all other powers in any wise enabling us in that behalf, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme:

"(1) The Benefice and Parish of Derwent aforesaid shall be permanently annexed to the said Benefice and Parish of Bamford and the two shall form one Benefice (by the name of the Benefice of Bamford) and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes of which the Church of the said Parish of Bamford shall be the Parish Church.

"(2) The register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of the said Parish of Derwent shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the united Parish of Bamford and the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of the said Parish of Derwent shall accordingly be sent by the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bamford to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"(3) All the glebe lands at present belonging to the said Parish and Benefice of Derwent shall be annexed to the said united Benefice of Bamford and form part of the endowments of that Benefice and the Incumbent shall be entitled to all the rents and profits thereof, provided however that he shall account to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Derwent for any net proportion to which the said Incumbent may be entitled in respect of the rents and profits next accruing due.

"(4) All that part of the said Parish of Beighton which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereto annexed, shall become and be constituted a Separate District for spiritual purposes which shall be named 'The District of Saint Cyprian, Frecheville,' and such District shall be included in and shall form part of the said Diocese of Derby, in which Diocese the said County of Derby is now situate.

"(5) The whole right of patronage of the said proposed new District, and when such District shall by the consecration of the said proposed Church and its approval by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, have become a New Parish then of the same New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall be vested absolutely in the Most Noble Edward William Spencer, Duke of Devonshire, K.G., M.B.E., T.D., being the person in whom the patronage of the Church and Benefice of Derwent aforesaid is now vested.

"(6) The Reverend Walter Edward Rouse, if on the date of ratification of this Scheme by Your Majesty in Council he is Incumbent of Derwent, shall cease to be such Incumbent and shall have the right reserved to him by the said Act of 1920, provided however that if he shall resign the said Benefice before the last mentioned date in order that the arrangements hereinbefore and hereinafter recommended and proposed may take effect, there shall be paid to him by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, an annual sum of £75 (being part of the annual stipend at present payable by us to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Derwent) such annual sum to be additional to the pension payable to him by the Church of England Pensions Board upon his retirement from the said Benefice and to take effect as from the date of such retirement and to be payable to him so long only as the said pension is payable to him by the said Pensions Board and thereafter the said sum of £75 shall be payable by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Minister or Incumbent of the said District or new Parish of Frecheville.

"(7) The endowments of the said Parish and Benefice of Derwent shall, save as hereinbefore mentioned, be transferred to the said District for the endowment thereof, provided that any income accruing in respect of any period between the date of the retirement of the said Walter Edward Rouse from the said Benefice of Derwent and the transfer of the glebe lands to Bamford or the date of the licence of the first Minister to the said District of Frecheville as the case may be shall be paid to the said Derby Diocesan Board of Finance to be applied for the pastoral superintendence of the area of the said proposed District in such manner as the Bishop of Derby may direct and their receipt shall be a full discharge.

"(8) The compensation money shall be expended by the said Diocesan Board of Finance in such shares

and manner and at such times as we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and the Bishop of Derby for the time being may approve—

"(a) in the payment of any costs or expenses incurred or to be incurred by the Board in connection with this Scheme;

"(b) in the acquisition of a suitable site or sites within the area of the said district of St. Cyprian, Frecheville, to be conveyed to us as the site or sites for a Church and parsonage house;

"(c) in the building thereon so soon as conveniently may be in accordance with plans to be first approved by us of a Church or parsonage house as the case may be;

"(d) in the transfer to the said Church or to any other church or chapel within the County of Derby as the Bishop of the Diocese may determine of the communion plate, furniture, fixtures and fittings of the Church at Derwent and pending such transfer for the preservation and storage or other the disposal thereof; and

"(e) otherwise for the benefit of the said new District of Saint Cyprian, Frecheville

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Cyprian, Frecheville, comprising:—

"All that portion of the parish of Beighton in the County and Diocese of Derby which is bounded upon the north by the new Parish of Saint James, Handsworth Woodhouse, upon the north west by the new Parish of Christ Church, Gleadless, both in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield, upon the south west by the Parish of Ridgeway, upon the south east by the new Parish of Saint Mark, Mosbrough, both in the said County and Diocese of Derby, and upon the east by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said new Parish of Saint Mark, Mosbrough, from the said Parish of Beighton crosses the middle of Birley Moor Road and extending thence north westward along the middle of Birley Moor Road for a distance of 23½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading to Occupation Lane and extending thence northward to and along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 18½ chains or thereabouts to its northern end on the south western side of Occupation Lane and extending thence first north eastward to and then north westward along the middle of Occupation Lane for a distance of 1 chain to a point opposite to the south western end of Birleyspa Lane and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Birleyspa Lane for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the south western end of the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of Birleyspa Wood and extending thence eastward to and then first north eastward, then south eastward and then northward along the said wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of Birleyspa Wood for a distance in all of 19 chains or thereabouts to its northern end upon the edge of the roadway leading from Hackenthorne towards Scowerton's Farm and extending thence first northward and then north westward to and along the middle of such roadway for a distance in all of 6 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading to Wickfield Plantation and the footpath leading to Shire Brook and extending thence first north eastward and then north westward along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 19½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Beighton from the said new parish of Saint James, Handsworth Woodhouse."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act been transmitted to the patron and to the incumbent of the parish of Beighton out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken and such patron and incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
