The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 10th day of April, 1943 (N.5088/43), in the words following, viz.:-

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Order in Council dated the 29th day of January, 1929, authorised payment of extra duty pay to certain Royal Marine other ranks when organised in Service Units:

"And whereas we consider that extra remuneration should be granted to personnel employed on Cypher duties in Royal Marine Special Units at the rates payable to other ranks of Your Majesty's Army when performing comparable duties, viz.:-

"High Grade Cypher Duties (N.C.Os. of, or above, the rank of Sergeant): 1s. a day.

"Medium Grade Cypher Duties (N.C.Os. below the rank of Sergeant): 6d. a day.

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by your Order in Council, to sanction payment of extra duty pay accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 14th day of January, 1943, in the words and figures following, that is to say:-

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices

Measures, 1923 to 1936, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme) for dividing the Benefice and ecclesiastical Parish of Bedminster, Saint Raphael, and uniting the several parts thereof to the Benefice and ecclesiastical Parish of Bristol, Saint Mary Redcliffe, and the united Benefice and ecclesiastical Parish of Clifton, Holy Trinity, Saint Andrew the Less and Saint Peter, all of which Benefices are situate in the Diocese of Bristol:

"SCHEME.

"1. Division of Benefice and ecclesiastical Parish of Bedminster, Saint Raphael.

"Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the Benefice and ecclesiastical Parish of Bedminster, Saint Raphael shall be divided, and

"(1) that part thereof (containing the Church of Saint Raphael) which lies to the east of an imaginary line beginning in the middle of the River Avon at a point opposite the junction of Cumberland Road with Gasferry Road and continuing in a north easterly direction along the middle of Gasferry Road to the end of Gasferry Road and thence in a straight line to the middle of the Floating Harbour shall be permanently united to the Benefice and ecclesiastical Parish of Bristol, Saint Mary Redcliffe, and the Church of Saint Mary Redcliffe shall be the Parish Church of the united Parish:

"(2) the remaining part of the Benefice of Bedminster, Saint Raphael, which lies to the west of the said imaginary line shall be permanently united to the united Benefice and ecclesiastical Parish of Clifton, Holy Trinity, Saint Andrew the Less and Saint Peter.

"2. Registers.—Upon the unions taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the church of Saint Raphael, Bedminster, shall be sent by the Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Mary, Redcliffe, to the Registrar-General to be closed officially.

"3. Sale of surplus Parsonage House.—Upon the unions taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the Benefice of Bedminster, Saint Raphael, and the grounds usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"4. Sale of surplus Church site.—(1) So soon as conveniently may be after the unions have taken effect the remaining structure of the Church of Saint Raphael, Bedminster, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto, shall be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient.

" (2) The net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the payment of the expenses attendant thereupon and upon the taking down of the remaining structure of the Church and all other incidental expenses shall be added to the said Expenses Fund.

" 5. *Church Repair Fund.*—Upon the unions taking effect, the Repair Fund now held in trust for the repair of the Church of Saint Raphael, Bedminster, shall cease to be held in trust for the repair of that Church and shall be held in trust for the repair of the Parish Church of the united Parish of the Holy Trinity, Saint Andrew the Less and Saint Peter, Clifton.

" 6. *Choir Endowment Fund.*—Upon the unions taking effect the sum of £758 2s. 3d. £3½ per cent. Commonwealth of Australia Inscribed Stock, 1952-56 (or any varied investments then representing the same) held by the Warden, Council and Scholars of Keble College as a fund for the payment of the choir boys of the Church of Saint Raphael, Bedminster, shall be paid over to us and by us be transferred to the said Expenses Fund to the intent that it shall be held in that Fund as a fund for the payment of the choir boys of the Church of Saint Aidan, Bristol, or be transferred in trust for that purpose to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese or any other body or persons willing to accept the same.

" 7. *Endowments.*—With the consents (testified by their signing this Scheme) of the Keble College Advowsons Trustees, namely, the Right Honourable Hugh Richard Heathcote Cecil, Baron Quickwood of Clothill, P.C., the Reverend Edward Keble Talbot, of the Community of the Resurrection, Mirfield, Yorkshire; John Arthur Gibbs, of Goddards, Abinger Common, Dorking, Surrey, Esquire; the Right Reverend Francis, Bishop of Bath and Wells; and the Reverend Beresford James Kidd, of Number 35 Belsyre Court, Oxford (hereinafter called 'the Advowsons Trustees') being the present Patrons of the Benefice of Bedminster, Saint Raphael—

" (a) upon the unions taking effect—

" (i) subject to the provisions of paragraph (b) of this clause a part of the endowments of the benefice of Bedminster, Saint Raphael, namely, the sums of £2,454 6s. 5d. and £588 10s. 9d. held by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty for that Benefice on their Royal Bounty Fund Account and their Miscellaneous Fund Account respectively, in respect of which an annual payment of £91 5s. 8d. is at present made by them to that Benefice, together with an annual payment of £9 (being part of a larger annual payment) made by us to that Benefice shall become and be transferred and annexed to the united Benefice of Clifton, Holy Trinity, Saint Andrew the Less and Saint Peter; and

" (ii) all other the endowments of the Benefice of Bedminster, Saint Raphael, shall be severed

from that Benefice and shall be appropriated for the augmentation of the Benefices of Bristol, Saint Agnes; Bristol, Saint Aidan; and Bedminster, Saint Dunstan, as set forth in Part I of the Schedule hereto annexed.

" (b) upon the cessation of the pension charge of £65 per annum placed upon the revenues of the united Benefice of Clifton, Holy Trinity, Saint Andrew the Less and Saint Peter, upon the retirement therefrom of the Reverend John Southwood Jackson, parts, namely the sums of £1,166 13s. 4d. and £1,000, of the sum of £2,454 6s. 5d. held by the said Governors on their Royal Bounty Fund Account referred to in sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (a) of this clause shall be severed from that Benefice and shall be appropriated for the augmentation of the Benefices of Two Mile Hill and Winterbourne Down, All Saints, respectively, as set forth in Part II of the said Schedule.

" 8. *Patronage.*—(1) With the consents (testified as aforesaid) of the Right Reverend Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol, and of the Advowsons, Trustees, upon the day preceding the date of the unions taking effect the patronage of the Benefice of Bedminster, Saint Raphael, which is now vested in the Advowsons Trustees, shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than the duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme be transferred from the Advowsons Trustees and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in the said Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol, and his successors, Bishops of Bristol, and in exchange for the same there shall be transferred to the Advowsons Trustees by the same authority and upon and as from the same day one alternate share in the patronage of the Benefice of Bristol, St. Aidan, in the Diocese of Bristol, now belonging to the said Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol, and his successors, Bishops of Bristol, to the intent (a) that the said alternate share shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in the Advowsons Trustees subject to the like uses, limitations, trusts, powers and provisions in every respect as those to which the patronage of the Benefice of Bedminster, Saint Raphael, now vested in the Advowsons Trustees is subject, and (b) that the turn of presentation to the Benefice of Bristol, Saint Aidan, next occurring after the said day and every alternate turn of presentation thereafter shall be exercisable by the Advowsons Trustees.

" (2) After the unions have taken effect the patronage of the Benefice of Bristol, Saint Mary Redcliffe, shall belong wholly to the said Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol, and his successors, Bishops of Bristol, and the patronage of the united Benefice of Clifton, Holy Trinity, Saint Andrew the Less and Saint Peter, shall belong wholly to the present Patrons of the united Benefice.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward, Bishop of Ely (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Hatley Saint George shall be transferred to the said Edward, Bishop of Ely, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Ely for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Bartholomew Carbrook, is vested in five trustees known as the Church Patronage Trustees,

namely, the Venerable Ernest Newton Sharpe, Clerk in Holy Orders and Archdeacon of London, the Right Reverend John Ralph Strickland, Lord Bishop of Sodor and Man, the Reverend William Leonard Bertram Caley of Saint Paul's Rectory, Salisbury, in the County of Wilts, Clerk in Holy Orders, Mervyn Gurney Talbot Rice of Cunard House, 88, Leadenhall Street, in the City of London, chartered accountant, and John Foster Beaver, J.P., of Sutton House, Bingley, in the County of York, worsted spinner, (hereinafter called 'the said Trustees'):

"And whereas under the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 23rd day of November, 1937, and published in the London Gazette on the 26th day of the same month, the right of patronage of and presentation to the said united Benefice of Saint George with Saint Stephen Sheffield, is at present exercised alternately by the Vicar of Sheffield for the time being and by the said Trustees:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Pitsmoor is vested in the Bishop of Sheffield for the time being:

"And whereas the said Trustees, and the Right Reverend Leslie, now Bishop of Sheffield, have respectively signified to us their desire that the patronage of the said three Benefices may be re-arranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas we have made due inquiry and relative calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said three Benefices and of the patron-

age thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said three Benefices are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Trustees and of the said Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield acting as such Bishop (in testimony whereof they have executed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Bartholomew, Carbrook, and the share of the patronage of and presentation to the said united Benefice of Saint George and Saint Stephen, Sheffield, which is now as aforesaid exercised by the said Trustees shall be transferred to the said Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thenceforth be absolutely vested in and shall from time to time be exercised by the said Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield, and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever and that in exchange for the same the whole Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Pitsmoor shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be transferred to the said Trustees and shall thenceforth be absolutely vested in and shall from time to time be exercised by the said Trustees and their successors for ever.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for apportioning the income of the Benefice of St. Mary, Silverton, in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter, between that Benefice and the Benefice of Barnstaple in the same County and Diocese:

"Whereas the patronage of each of the said Benefices is vested in the Bishop of Exeter for the time being:

"And whereas we are of opinion that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the Parish of the said Benefice of Barnstaple by means of that apportionment of the income of the said Benefice of St. Mary, Silverton, which is hereinafter recommended and proposed, and that

the said Benefice of St. Mary, Silverton, will thereafter still be sufficiently endowed:

"And whereas the said Benefice of St. Mary, Silverton, is now vacant:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Archbishop of Canterbury, as Archbishop of the Province within which the said two Benefices are situate and with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of Exeter, as such Bishop and also as the Patron in right of his See of the said two Benefices (in testimony whereof they have executed this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette or upon the vacancy of the said Benefice of Barnstaple by the then Incumbent thereof, whichever shall be the later (a) the following sums of stock now held by us in trust for the said Benefice of Saint Mary, Silverton, namely £397 7s. 3d. London County £2½ per cent. Stock (1960/70); £332 16s. 5d. £4 per cent. Funding Stock (1960/90); £1,036 10s. 5d. £3 per cent. Redemption Stock (1986/96), and £3,101 4s. 10d. £3½ per cent. Conversion Stock, and (b) a capital sum of £2,870 being part of a sum of money appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty to the same Benefice pursuant to the Tithe Act, 1936, shall cease to form part of the endowments of that Benefice and such sums of stock shall be held by us in trust for and as part

of the endowments of the said Benefice of Barnstaple and such capital sum shall be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty for the augmentation of the last mentioned Benefice."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

"And whereas the said Cyril Forster, Archbishop of York, has approved the Scheme and in testimony of his approval has appended his signature to the Scheme:

"And whereas the Right Honourable Winston Spencer Churchill, First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, has signified to us his consent to the preparation and submission of the Scheme to Your Majesty in Council:
