WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 25th day of March, 1943, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Hatley Saint George, in the County of Cambridge and in the Diocese of Ely:

"Whereas we are satisfied that Herbert Thomas Charles Lloyd-Johnes, M.C., of Dolaucothy, Pumpsaint, Llanwrda, Carmarthenshire, Esquire, is the Patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice:

"And whereas the said Herbert Thomas Charles Lloyd-Johnes desires to transfer the Advowson of the said Benefice to the Bishop of Ely for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof he has executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward, Bishop of Ely (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Hatley Saint George shall be transferred to the said Edward, Bishop of Ely, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Ely for the time being."

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 50, and of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 124, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting an exchange of the patronage of the Benefice of Saint Bartholomew, Carbrook and a share of the patronage of the united Benefice of Saint George with Saint Stephen, Sheffield both in the Diocese of Sheffield for the patronage of the Benefice of Pitsmoor in the same Diocese:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Bartholomew Carbrook, is vested in five trustees known as the Church Patronage Trustees,
