" (a) The following Sums of Stock representing the proceeds of sales of lands and redemptions of certain tithe rentcharges formerly part of the endowment of the See, namely:—£1,794 4s. 2½ per cent. Consolidated Stock; £38,465 18s. 3d. Local Loans 3 per cent. Stock; £10,866 15s. 8d. London County 3 per cent. Stock; and £7,704 16s. 4 per cent. Funding Stock 1960/90 held by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners and the sum of £369 14s. 10d. London County 2½ per cent. Consolidated Stock standing to the credit of the See in the books of the Church Estates Commissioners.

" (b) Such sums of Stock as may be received for the See by Queen Anne's Bounty under the Tithe Act, 1936.

" Part IV.

" All those the fixtures, pictures, books, furniture and other goods and chattels belong to the Arch-

bishop of York in right of his dignity and not in his private capacity, which said heirlooms of the See are described and set forth in an inventory to be deposited by us in the Diocesan Registry of the Diocese of York."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.
