(1) Where a telephone call involves the use of a submarine cable, there shall be charged and paid in addition to the above rates the following sums:—

(2) There shall be charged and paid in respect of a request for a personal call (in addition to the appropriate charge for the call and any charge payable as mentioned in paragraph (3) of this proviso) a personal charge fixed as follows:—

†Night—9d.

“Personal Call” means a communication which is specified by a subscriber or caller for establishment between the subscriber or caller and a

designated person, or, at the request (when the application for the call is made) of the subscriber or caller, a substitute for the designated person.

“Personal charge” means a charge in respect of the establishment of, or the attempt to establish, a personal call.

(3) There shall be charged and paid for the use of a Call Office by a caller or for a call on a Subscriber's coin-box line the sum of 2d. such sum to be additional to the charge for the call.

\*Day: Midnight to 6.30 p.m., 9.30 p.m. to midnight (Call Office and coin-box subscribers, midnight to 5.30 p.m., 9.30 to midnight).

†Night: 6.30 p.m. to 9.30 p.m. (Call Office and coin-box subscribers, 5.30 p.m. to 9.30 p.m.).
